A dawn darker than night

August 14, 1975.

The rumble of truck engines of the 2nd Field Regiment disturbed the evening quietness at Dhaka cantonment. Loaded with 105mm cannons, the heavy-duty trucks began heading from the southern end of the cantonment to the underconstruction airport on the capital's edge.

Hours later, around 10:00pm, several Bengal Lancer T-54 tanks left their units in the north of cantonment and rolled down towards the airport, only to join the 2nd Field Regiment. On the barren field of the airport, 18 cannons and 28 tanks assembled.

The soldiers present there were still unsure what was going to happen.


TRIBUTE TO BANGABANDHU **How to remember** a Hero?

Taliban sniff Kabul

Afghan President Ghani vows to stop bloodshed; Pentagon says afghan capital not facing 'imminent threat'; Mazar-i-Sharif falls

Afghanistan's beleaguered president yesterday vowed to prevent further bloodshed, as Taliban fighters closed in on Kabul after routing his armed forces over the past 10 days. In a recorded address to the nation -- his

first since the Taliban launched their sweeping offensive -- Ashraf Ghani said he wanted to stop the violence "as a historic mission". "I will not let the imposed war on people

cause more deaths," he said, appearing

sombre and sitting before an Afghan flag. "As your president, my focus is on preventing further instability, violence, and displacement of my people," Ghani said in a brief televised address, adding that he was consulting government, elders, politicians

and international leaders.



The president gave no hint he would resign or take responsibility for the calamitous military collapse, but said armed forces could be "remobilized" and consultations were taking place to try to help end the war.

Daily deaths, infections lowest in 3 weeks

The health directorate yesterday reported 178 deaths from Covid-19 and 6,885 new cases, the lowest numbers in three weeks.

On July 23, the number of deaths reported was 166 and on July 24, there were 6,780 confirmed cases. The numbers steadily rose afterwards and started falling on August 2.
