

Inspirational Olympic figurehead Richard Whitehead, who has a double knee congenital amputation which means he runs with prosthetic legs, is seen to be preparing for the Tokyo Paralympics which kicks off on Tuesday after a year-long pandemic delay as Japan battles a record surge in cases. Gold medallist in the 200m T42 Athletics event at the 2012 and 2016 Paralympics, this 45-year-old British athlete holds the world record for athletes with a double amputation in both the full and half marathon. Overall, Richard is decorated with nine gold medals across the Paralympics, World Championships and European Championships. As at the Olympics, the Paralympics event will be marked by strict healthsafety protocols, with almost all spectators banned and tough restrictions on athletes and other participants.

'Opponents are always more scared when Messi is around'

Barcelona coach Ronald Koeman has admitted opposition sides are being bolder against his side now that they can no longer count on Lionel Messi, after the Catalans were held 1-1 away

to Athletic Bilbao in LaLiga on Saturday. Koeman, however, admitted his team were still keenly feeling the absence of their all-time top scorer and former captain, two weeks after he left Barca for Paris St Germain following 21 years at the club.

"I don't like to keep talking about the same thing but we're talking about the best player in the world and opponents are always more scared when Messi is around," Koeman told reporters. "It's also the same for us, if you give a pass to Messi, he normally doesn't lose the ball. You can feel that he is not here anymore. We al know it but we can't change it."

Barca had gotten off to a strong start in their first game without Messi by easing to a 4-2 win over Real Sociedad last week but were given a cold dose of reality against an intense Athletic side, who overpowered and outrun them for



A thumping late strike from Memphis Depay, his first goal for Barcelona on his competitive debut for the club in La Liga, cancelled out Inigo Martinez's header to earn Barca a point against Athletic Bilbao on Saturday.

"I think we ran into too many difficulties at the start of the game. They put us under a lot of pressure and did very well and we couldn't play with any patience," Koeman added. "But I have to highlight the attitude we showed after we went behind. I think the draw is fair because if you play like we did at a ground like this you're always going to run into trouble. I have no complaints about the result."

It was a difficult night for Barcelona's defence in particular, with Gerard Pique coming off after half an hour and Eric Garcia being sent off in stoppage time for bringing down Inaki

Former Manchester City defender Garcia received news of his grandfather's death before the match and struggled throughout the 90 minutes, allowing Inigo Martinez to get away from him to head in the opener early in the second half. "He is a great professional to play so well in a game after the death of his grandfather. We wish him all the best in his personal situation," said Koeman, who insisted the draw was the right result.

"At the moment my aim is to perform consistently in the domestic circuit, whether that is the Dhaka Premier League

or a first-class competition. Obviously, I want to make a comeback to the national team by performing strongly in the domestic circuit," out-of-favor Ariful Haque said candidly yesterday.

However, with domestic cricket not a priority for the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) due to the pandemic, things seem bleak for players like Ariful, who last played for the national side three years ago. "Right now, domestic cricket is not on our list of priorities. Against the backdrop of the pandemic, we are doing everything on a priority basis and fulfilling international commitments. Apart from the national team, we have to prepare our under-19 and women's team due to international commitments. We are also working with the High-Performance squad because we feel it is manageable for us," BCB CEO Nizamuddin

Chowdhury told Daily Star. Despite the fact that no 50-over domestic competitions have been played since the outbreak of Covid-19 year, the BCB did arrange the Bangabandhu T20 Cup last year and also managed to stage the Dhaka
