

Samsung launches Galaxy M32 in Bangladesh


Samsung Bangladesh has introduced its newest addition to the Galaxy M Series, the Galaxy M32.

The phone boasts a 6.4-inch FHD+Super AMOLED Infinity-U Display, 90Hz refresh rate, Helio G80 gaming processor and 6,000mAh battery backed up with a 25W fast-charging support.

The M32 consists of an 8MP ultra-wide camera, 64MP main camera, 2MP depth and macro lenses, and a 20MP front camera.

The new Galaxy M32 is priced at BDT 22,999.





Musk says Tesla likely to launch humanoid robot prototype next year

Tesla Inc Chief Executive Elon Musk on Thursday said the electric automaker will probably launch a 'Tesla Bot' humanoid robot prototype next year, designed for dangerous, repetitive, or boring work that people don't like to do.

Speaking at Tesla's AI Day event, the billionaire entrepreneur said the robot, which stands around five foot eight inches tall, would be able to handle jobs from attaching bolts to cars with a wrench, or picking up groceries at stores.

The robot would have "profound implications for the economy," Musk said, addressing a labour shortage. He said it was important to make the machine not "super-expensive."

The AI Day event came amid growing scrutiny over the safety and capability of Tesla's "Full Self-Driving" advanced driver assistance system.

Musk didn't comment on that scrutiny over the safety of Tesla technology but said that he was confident of achieving full self-driving with higher safety than humans using current in-car cameras and computers

U.S. safety regulators earlier this week opened an investigation into Tesla's driver assistant system because of accidents where Tesla cars crashed into stationary police cars and fire trucks.

Two U.S. senators have also called on the Federal Trade Commission to investigate Tesla's claims for its 'Full Self-Driving' system.

At the event on Thursday Tesla also unveiled chips it designed in-house for its high-speed computer, Dojo, to help develop its automated driving system. Musk said Dojo would be operational

He said Tesla will also introduce new hardware for its self-driving computer for its Cybertruck electric pick-up truck in "about a year or so." Tesla in July pushed back the launch of its much-anticipated Cybertruck from this year, without giving a timeframe for its arrival on the market

On Thursday some questioned whether Musk, who has frequently touted technology advances at showpiece events only to scale plans down later on, would be able to come good on his aims for the robot

"Is the 'Tesla Bot' the next dream shot to pump up the hype machine?" said Raj Rajkumar, professor of electrical and computer engineering at Carnegie Mellon University.

"I can safely say that it will be much longer than 10 years before a humanoid bot from any company on the planet can go to the store and get groceries for you.

Facebook unveils virtual reality 'workrooms'

Facebook on Thursday unveiled technology for 'workrooms,' allowing remote collaboration for people using its Oculus virtual reality gear.

The 'Horizon Workrooms' project allows users to switch back and forth from virtual reality to web conferencing to adapt to different situations.

Workrooms is our flagship collaboration experience that lets people come together to work in the same virtual room, regardless of physical distance,' the company said in an Oculus blog post. "It works across both virtual reality and the web and is designed to improve your team's ability to collaborate." This enables participants to join a meeting as an avatar in virtual reality or by video calling.

The announcement comes as the social

media giant moves to blend its hardware, gaming and virtual reality units to build an immersive digital world known as the 'metaverse,' borrowing a term coined by sci-fi writer Neal Stephenson.

The project is seen as central to Facebook's future by chief executive Mark Zuckerberg, who is seeking to diversify the company beyond social networking and digital advertising.

It also comes with more people working remotely during the pandemic and companies seeking new ways to enable collaboration among scattered

The Oculus division has largely been used for gaming but is gaining traction in other areas as virtual reality is adapted for tourism, remote work and other applications





"If the trend of exploiting students through unpaid or unfulfilling internships continues, students will ultimately lose interest in internships. This will have an adverse effect on the job market in terms of skilled manpower both in the short

and long term," he added.

What students can do to ensure that their time spent at an organisation is fruitful, is to plan ahead. Arijit Saha, a Senior Business Analyst at a leading IT company, advised, "Startup experts will tell you that it is crucial to have an exit strategy, which will dictate how the investors will reap the fruits of their benefits.

"When applying for a part-time job, you need to think similarly and treat your career as the investor. Before applying for a part-time job, chalk out a plan. Ask yourself what you expect from the venture, when it would be enough, and which tradeoffs would be worth which outcomes. Sure, the road to a career can be just as volatile as the journey of a startup. You may need to adjust your plans along the way. But that does not mean you should go ahead without one.

"A big mistake people make is to not do a cost-benefit analysis when applying for a part-time job, and an even greater mistake is to not realise when the law of diminishing marginal returns goes into negative," added Saha.

So, when should you consider leaving

You are not learning anymore.

Not learning anymore may mean you have learnt all that your current role can teach you. While practising and

becoming very good at what you do is good, working such jobs can lead to demoralisation. Unless you are sure that the role is exactly what you want to be in as a full-time worker after graduation, consider expanding your horizons.

Learning enables you to expand your skill set and identify areas of interest. Knowledge about different industries can help you understand which industries you would like to work for in the future.

There are no more growth opportunities.

This is related to the previous point. More growth opportunities and challenges mean more chances to learn new things. If your organisation does not have promotional opportunities for students, staying there for a long time may clip your skills and experiences. The same goes for roles that under-utilise your skills or where you feel you are undervalued.

Also, consider whether there are chances of you landing a full-time role at that organisation after graduation.

The supervisor or the work environment is toxic.

Staying in a toxic situation can have several repercussions such as stress or burnout. Lack of employee autonomy, micromanaging supervisor, feelings of job insecurity, toxic practices in teams, etc. can be some symptoms.

The company culture could also be one that rewards burnouts. There may be unethical practices going on which require you to compromise your morals

Your passion lies elsewhere. If you find yourself longing for different

jobs, or if the current job is not contributing to your career development in the field you want to work in, it may be time for you to switch jobs. Part-time jobs often help students realise which fields they are interested in after they graduate.

Ahmed Mostofa says, "It is time to look for a new job when we start seeing our learning opportunities getting diminished or when the culture is toxic. That being said, we should not quit on a fit. It is important to consider various factors like the job market, the next best alternative,

It is rare to see anyone doing cartwheels out of excitement for their jobs. However, there are still some positives people perceive that make them continue working. There are going to be some hardships at your job.



5 note-taking apps worth checking out



Going digital with notetaking takes a person or an organisation to the next step, removing the hurdles of pen and paper and having everything stored in one device.

This article lists 5 such note-taking apps that can help you stay organised by going paperless and add more to the process.

Evernote

Evernote is one of the most popular note-



taking apps available. It has a capable rich text editor and can share notebooks with other people and save searches. Moreover,



it allows a ton of different integrations with other apps.

It also features optical character recognition. This implies that you can scan images with text and it can make that text searchable, and you can also annotate images in the app as well.

However, users cannot create nested hierarchies of notebooks with this app.

One Note

Microsoft OneNote is probably the closest competitor to Evernote in terms of features. There are similar images that support optical character recognition and the ability to annotate images. The editor area of this app is a lot more flexible and customisable than Evernote.

Additionally, Microsoft OneNote is free. However, you would have to pay for Microsoft OneNote if you decide to upgrade your OneDrive storage.

Bear

Bear is a Mac and iOS-exclusive app. If you are a Mac and iOS user, Bear is definitely worth your consideration. This is primarily because unlike Evernote and OneNote, Bear has a beautiful hybrid Markdown editor and a markup language that allows you to format your text.

Lots of other markdown editors force you to write in plain text and you can only preview your format of text. This is where Bear stands out. It formats your text as you write.

Bear also comes with an interesting organisational system that does let you create as many levels of hierarchy as you like.

Apple Notes


Apple Notes is free for iOS users, just like Bear. Apple Notes doesn't come with hybrid markdown capabilities similar to Bear or some other apps. However, it does have nice formatting tools. The default formatting looks better than it does on Evernote. You can also create your nested list of hierarchical folders.

Notion

Notion is the most flexible tool on this list. Notion is an app unlike any other, mainly because of the combination of a couple of different features. First, their table feature, which is the database feature where every row in a table links to its own page, and secondly, they've got a templating feature that allows you to make anything you want to. You can also create a habit tracker, template for task management or budgeting through Notion.

The most interesting part of using Notion is that you can assign tasks to your team members as well and track their performance. You can tag delegates and create links between pages and tables.

If you use Notion only as a note-taking app, you will surely miss out on most of its other amazing features.

6 TRAVEL GADGETS

to get you set for any trip

With new technology and innovation, there are unlimited options of travel gadgets to try. These gadgets can make your vacations easier, more organised, and enjoyable.

Here is a list of 6 travel accessories and their features that you may consider while purchasing.

Universal travel adapter

A universal travel adapter lets you plug your electronic devices into walls with any kind of socket. Sockets and voltage ranges can differ from area to area or from country to country. So this kind of adapter converts them to a standard one.

While buying a travel adapter, keep in mind that some old-fashioned adapters have sockets only for two-pin plugs. Those who have a MacBook or devices with the round earth pin may get into trouble if



they do not notice this before purchasing.

In most countries, the usual voltage supply is 200-240 volts, and so the adapter you are buying should support up to 240 volts. Moreover, it is better to buy a smaller adapter as the larger ones tend to fall out of the socket due to the weight of

Smartphone sanitiser

Your smartphone tends to have more



harmful microorganisms on it. As it is now more important to ensure hygiene, you may consider buying a smartphone sanitiser before your next trip. UV rays from such devices disrupt the growth of microorganisms and protect your smartphone from germs. Therefore, it needs some time to complete the cleaning

Try to look for a UV smartphone sanitiser that takes at least 3 minutes to ensure deep and effective cleaning. In most UV sanitisers, you need to flip your device to get a full 360° clean.

UV bulbs burn out quickly. So it is better if you can choose a sanitiser with a UV LED light. It may not be a good idea to try to find cheaper options for these UV sanitisers as they can be harmful to your smartphone as well as you. Consider buying a safer and more reliable option.

Solar power bank

Charging a phone is quite challenging during a long trip, especially when it is difficult to find any socket in that place. A power bank is now a must while being on a tour. If you are using a solar power bank, then you can also green your power consumption and minimise your carbon footprint.

Note that a cell phone usually has up to 5000 mAh battery and tablets up to 12,000 mAh. Solar power banks available in markets have a charging capacity of up to 50,000 mAh. A heavier solar power bank has more charging capacity than a lighter one.

However, it may be inconvenient to carry a heavy power bank, especially when camping or hiking. Thus, select it wisely based on what you need more in your

Bluetooth tracker

If you are clumsy with your belongings and often lose your stuff, consider buying a Bluetooth tracker. This type of tracker works optimally up to 100 feet, but some companies offer trackers that can work up to 200 feet. Different barriers such as walls or trees can decrease connectivity.

Check individual product reviews before buying. Bluetooth trackers ring when you search for them. So choose one that is loud enough to be heard. Before your purchase, think carefully about which item you need as some Bluetooth trackers have additional features depending on that. For example, there are card-shaped trackers for your wallet and keyring-style for backpacks.

Portable door lock

Staying in unfamiliar places, especially being a solo traveller can be both exciting and daunting. To add an extra layer of security, one may use a portable door lock while staying in a hotel room or any place where they stay.

Unlike other locks, portable door locks can only be used from the inside. These come in different shapes and sizes. But they almost work in the same way and prevent intruders from outside.

While selecting a portable door for your trip, try to choose one which is small, inexpensive, and comes in one piece. Moreover, select the door lock that takes less time and is less complicated to install and remove in case of any emergency. Remember that most of these locks are designed for inward-swinging doors.

Portable travel coffee maker

If you are a frequent traveller and coffee is your mood booster, you know the struggle of finding a perfect cup of coffee especially when you are on a camping adventure or in a remote area. Choose a coffee maker that takes from 30 seconds to 5 minutes to brew, and can be washed with minimal components.

While buying such an appliance, consider how much coffee you need at a time and the overall size of your luggage. A bulkier coffee maker has a larger capacity, but it'll weigh more and you don't even need such a bigger one in case you're travelling alone.

Travel coffee makers can be used manually or can require batteries, solar power, or electric outlets. Select it smartly like if you are going camping or boating, the one that works by electricity is of no

Wolverine meets Bogart in Jackman sci-fi 'Reminiscence'

Hugh Jackman helped pioneer the superhero sequels that dominate modern megaplexes, but the former 'X-Men' actor leapt at the chance to star in something more rare these days—a totally original sci-fi from a major studio, in 'Reminiscence'

The Warner Bros film, out on Friday, comes from the creators of TV smash hit "Westworld," and imagines a dystopian near-future Miami in which a rising ocean has flooded the streets. All but the wealthiest live a precarious existence huddled on crime-infested islands and waterlogged back alleys, and the only "superpower" on show is a technology that allows paying customers to revisit cherished memories from better days in vivid detail.

"Hey, I'm not one to lecture about sequels, I did nine movies playing Wolverine! But I do think audiences want something fresh and something new," Jackman told AFP.

In the film, which has shades of "Minority Report," Jackman plays a scientist running one such backstreet memory lab. His life gets turned upside down when a mysterious woman arrives with a seemingly straightforward request for help remembering where she left her keys.

The movie was written and directed by Lisa Joy, who along with husband Jonathan Nolan created the similarly dystopian sci-fi/Western 'Westworld.'

"It was a challenge and it would not have been made had it not been for Hugh's support of this film," said Joy. "I'm a first-time feature director, and I had an original (movie) that I wanted to get made that involved sinking Miami! To take that leap of faith, I think I was really bolstered when Hugh jumped in and said, 'well, I believe in her."

Her husband Nolan—a producer on 'Reminiscence'—also has previous form exploring the darker side of our



memories, penning neo-noir thriller "Memento," which was directed by his famous brother Christopher and hit the festival circuit in 2000.

That same year saw Jackman's first turn as Wolverine in 'X-Men,' a film credited with launching Hollywood's superhero era, and paving the way for wildly popular Marvel movies like 'Avengers: Endgame' that have smashed box office records.

Jackman's nine 'X-Men' films grossed more than \$4 billion in total worldwide, including three spin-off movies for Wolverine.

Wolverine meets Bogart

While 'Reminiscence' is a long way from Jackman's Marvel comic-book adaptation

days, its writer-director has described the protagonist as "a P.I. of the mind—think Wolverine meets Humphrey Bogart. "

"Probably a little handier with his fists than Bogart ever was!" laughed Jackman, before admitting there is a "little element" of his iconic mutant role in scientist Nick Bannister. A war hero veteran suffering from PTSD, Jackman's character soon becomes embroiled in a shadowy network of drug dealers and 'land barons' who jealously hoard the remaining dry, elevated acres, and has to take matters into his own hands.

"Like Wolverine, he's got that gruff, tough exterior. And like Wolverine, that's born out of pain, and always is," said Jackman. "The tougher the exterior, usually, the more broken on the inside."

As well as drawing on Hollywood's long tradition of Sam Spade-style hard-boiled private detectives, the movie is loosely inspired by the ancient Greek myth of Orpheus and Eurydice.

The 'genre-busting' blend of sci-fi, action and romance appealed to the 52-year-old Australian actor, a versatile Tony Award winner known for musicals such as 'The Greatest Showman' and 'Les Miserables' as well as action blockbusters.

"Everything is new for me, even when I was doing Wolverine, it all felt new and exciting to me. I always felt there was more to get from the character," he said. "But I think doing something like this, that felt very original, was exciting."
