Flood situation improves in north

It worsens in districts around Dhaka

The flood situation has improved in the northern region of the country as the water level in the rivers started receding there, but districts surrounding Dhaka reported the

Thirteen districts were flooded yesterday as water of eight rivers -- the Dharla, the Brahmaputra, the Jamuna, the Turag, the Kaliganga, the Padma, the Atrai and the Dhaleshwari -- was flowing above the danger level.

At Chilmari point in Kurigram, the water lever of the Jumuna has receded to 17cm above the danger level at 9:00am yesterday, from 44cm on Saturday. At the same time, water was flowing 44cm above the danger level in the Dharla River Bridge point in Kurigram Sadar upazila.

At Teesta Barrage point in Lalmonirhat's Hatibandha, the water was flowing 23cm below the danger level yesterday morning and it was 2cm above on Saturday morning.

Around 120,000 people in Kurigram are still affected by the flood and the majority of them are struggling for food and fresh drinking

Sabiha Bewa, 58, a flood victim at Hatiya village of Ulipur upazila, said she along with her eight-member family have been living with the floodwaters for the last ten days. "We got only 10kg rice as government relief.'

According to the Water Development Board (WDB), Bogura and Gaibandha, the water of the Jamuna has started receding since last Saturday.

According to the district relief and rehabilitation office in Bogura, around 66,000 people remained marooned but the district administration only distributed 170 tonnes of rice, and

Sufia Khatun, 40, of the Manik Diar Char, said, "Now we are almost starving but did not receive any relief materials from anyone.'

Kamrul Hasan, 45, of the same char under the Chaluabari union, said they were facing double blow as their houses were flooded while river erosion was devouring their land.

In Gaibandha, there are 85,975 people marooned by the flood in four upazila but the district administration distributed only 100 tonnes of rice, Tk 200,000 and 1,500 packets of dry

The water level of the Jamuna is stable in the last 24 hours while the Padma and all the internal rivers of Manikganj district are increasing.

Manikganj Water Development Board's gauge reader Faruk Hossain said, "The water of the Jamuna was flowing 40cm above the danger mark at Aricha in Manikganj at 3:00pm today [yesterday] as it is stable in last 24 hours from 3:00pm on Friday.

"The Kaliganga was flowing 24cm above the danger mark at Tora point as 14cm increased in the last 24 hours while the Dhaleshwari was flowing 13cm below the danger mark at Jagir point though it has increased by 10cm in the last 24 hours."

The water of other rivers including the Padma is also increasing by 7cm to 8cm in a day, he added.

At Bhagyakul point in Munshiganj, the water level of the Padma was 22cm above the danger line yesterday.

Ranendra Shankar Chakraborty, executive engineer of District Water Development Board, said waterlogging was created in several low-lying areas of Louhajanj and Tongibari due to rising water level of the tributary river.

Several people, including the two, were first admitted to Sher-e-Bangla Medical College Hospital and the two were later moved to National Ophthalmology Institute Hospital in Dhaka.

On August 18, at least 50 people were injured when employees of Barishal City Corporation (BCC) and local AL men clashed with police and Ansar members over removal of banners from Barishal Sadar UNO's office premises.

Later, UNO Munibur Rahman and police filed two cases over the incident, naming BCC Mayor Serniabat Sadiq Abdullah as the prime accused for instigating the violence. Several hundred people were accused in the cases

Twenty-three people, including Monir and Tanvir, were arrested. With yesterday's two, all the arrestees obtained bail.

Later, it asked all schools, colleges, and universities to introduce online classes. Assignments were also handed out to secondary-level students. While many schools in cities and urban areas quickly adapted to online education, it was a much tougher

ask for students in rural areas as they

lacked the necessary devices and access to the internet. Dipu Moni government will monitor the Covid-19 situation closely after reopening and if it finds that reopening has caused a spike in Covid infections in any area,

they would take the decision to close down the school or schools in that locality. The minister said teachers should

be vigilant about whether any student, especially those of classes 1-4, are facing difficulties wearing masks. "All kinds of physical activities and games would take place under the supervision of teachers and there will be no assembly at schools until the situation improves," she said

Classes of each grade will take place in two or three rooms.

As in-person classes are resuming after so long, authorities will deduct daily class hours to three or four hours from the usual eight hours, she added.

The education minister said SSC and its equivalent examinations will take place in the second week of November and the HSC and its equivalent tests in the first week of December. She said the government would vaccinate all students aged 12 and above in phases, based on availability of vaccines, and the health ministry is taking necessary

measures in this regard. Agriculture Minister Muhammad Abdur Razzaque, Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives (LGRD) Minister Md Tajul Islam, Primary and Mass Education State Minister Zakir Hossen, Youth and Sports State Minister Zahid Ahsan Russel, Deputy Education Minister Mohibul Hassan Chowdhoury, Cabinet Secretary Khandker Anwarul Islam and the top brass of several ministries attended the meeting at the

Meanwhile, Directorate of Secondary and Higher Education (DSHE) instructed all secondary schools and colleges to complete preparations for resuming classes by September 9.

It also sent revised guidelines yesterday on reopening educational institutions maintaining health guidelines and public health safety measures to all schools and colleges. guideline

the maintenance of three feet of physical distance between everyone at institutions and classrooms. It also stressed upon discouraging large numbers attending at a time. If a classroom can accommodate

10 benches of less than five feet in length, then only six students could be accommodated in that classroom, with just one student per bench or desk, the guidelines mentioned. In the above example, the second

and fourth benches have to be removed to ensure the requisite physical distance. If it is not possible to remove the benches then those have to be cross-marked so that students do not sit there.

On the other hand, if the length of a bench is five feet or more, two students can sit on it.

In the last week of August, DSHE and Directorate of Primary Education (DPE) asked secondary and primary schools to ensure that their campuses are clean and ready for reopening. Last week, DPE forwarded guidelines

and public health safety measures -which had been finalised in September 2020 -- for reopening schools.

The guideline recommended that a maximum of two students can sit on each bench and that everyone in those institutions -- students, teachers and other staffers -- will have to wear masks. All schools will also have to ensure arrangements for hand washing and

measuring body temperature. All schools will be cleaned and classrooms and office rooms will be disinfected regularly. Cleaning and

disinfection will take place after every shift and following every day of classes. No indoor assembly will be allowed,

according to the plan.

Poor batting approach costs

although Bangladesh still hold a slender 2-1 lead in the five-match series.

Interestingly, all four Bangladesh's lowest T20I totals have been recorded against New Zealand. The Tigers lowest-ever total of 70 all out came against New Zealand in a T20 World Cup encounter in Kolkata in 2016. Bangladesh were also bundled out for 76 in a T20I earlier this year in Auckland and recorded 78 in 2010 in Hamilton against the Kiwis.

The outcome stood in stark contrast to the way the Tigers had started their chase, with openers Mohammad Naim and Liton Das striking pacer Jacob Duffy and spinners Ajaz Patel and Cole McConchie for five boundaries as Bangladesh moved to 23 for no loss in just 2.3 overs, seemingly set to seal the series with a third win.

That did not happen and instead it took only eight deliveries for the Tigers to go from 23 for no loss to 25 for three. While Liton got carried away and was trapped in front while in search for his fourth boundary, Mahedi Hasan and Shakib Al Hasan threw their wickets away by trying to force unnecessary shots.

Both Mahedi and Shakib were removed by Patel in the same over but Shakib's dismissal was the more disappointing one.

The experienced all-rounder, facing just his third delivery after Bangladesh had lost two quick wickets, made a horrible error in judgment as he danced down the track to hit Patel over long-on but could only give an easy catch to McConchie.

Patel once again inflicted a double-blow when he had skipper Mahmudullah Riyad and Afif Hossain removed in successive deliveries in the 10th over, leaving Bangladesh reeling at 43 for six. The left-arm spinner ended with career-best T20 figures of four for 16 in his four overs.

Bangladesh never comfortable in the chase and even though Mushfigur Rahim stuck around till the end, his unbeaten 37ball 20, without any boundaries, was every bit as unflattering as the other batsmen who displayed no sense of
