## NO FEASIBILITY STUDIES DONE Ministry returns 4 railway project proposals

The Railways Ministry has sent back four development project proposals (DPP) prepared without any feasibility study.

The ministry also directed the Bangladesh Railway (BR) to prepare DPP and take investment projects after carrying out feasibility studies by a third party.

Feasibility study is a must for any development project costing over Tk 25 crore. But these project proposals were prepared without it, which is a violation of the directives, the ministry wrote in a letter.

The Development and Planning Wing of the ministry sent the letter in this regard to the BR director general on Sunday, sources said.

The four projects are: development of outdated bridges in BR's West Zone; development of outdated bridges in BR's East Zone; building of BR's West Zone headquarter complex; and rehabilitation of rail lines under East Zone.

BR sent the DPP for these projects to the ministry between June and July this year, sources said.

This development came at a time when failing to meet deadlines and raising the costs of development projects have become a major cause for concern for the government. Poor feasibility studies and its total absence have been considered as major reasons behind the issues.

Most of the 37 projects being implemented by the BR are behind schedule. Some of them were taken up without feasibility studies. The BR sought revision of 19 projects in the last fiscal year.

## Jamaat secy general, 8 others held

Police detained nine leaders and activists of Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami,



including its Secretary General Mia Golam Porwar, who is also a former lawmaker, in Dhaka's Bashundhara residential area yesterday evening.

Police were informed that the group gathered in a flat in the area's D block Block-D to plan subversive activities. A team of law enforcers then raided the house and detained the nine men, Md Asaduzzaman, deputy commissioner of Gulshan Division Police, told The Daily Star.

The arrestees include two assistant secretary generals -- Rafiqul Islam Khan and former lawmaker Hamidur Rahman Azad -- and Islami Chhatra Shibir's former president Yeasin

**ShopUp**  
raises \$75m  
in investment  
Records biggest startup  
fund injection in  
Bangladesh

The country's largest business-to-business (B2B) e-commerce platform, ShopUp, yesterday said it raised \$75 million or nearly Tk 640 crore in its latest round of fund-raising as it looks to ramp up its operation by bringing small neighbourhood groceries and small retail shops online.

The latest round, termed B financing round, was led by Peter Thiel's Valar Ventures. It also included investments from Prosus -- the investment arm of Naspers, Pierre Omidyar's family office, as well as existing investors Sequoia Capital India, VEON Ventures, and Flourish Ventures.

Series B financing is the second round of funding for a company that is past the initial startup stage and met certain milestones.

## Taliban in 'full control'

Promise formation of govt 'soon' after winning key battle for Panjshir Valley

The Taliban yesterday claimed total control over Afghanistan, saying they had won the key battle for the Panjshir Valley, the last remaining holdout of resistance against their rule.

Following their lightning-fast victory in mid-August over the former Afghan government's security forces and the withdrawal of US troops after 20 years of war, the Taliban turned to fighting the forces defending the mountainous Panjshir Valley.

As the Islamist hardliners claimed victory, their chief spokesman warned against any further attempts to rise up against their rule while urging former members of the security forces to join their regime's ranks.

"With this victory, our country is completely taken out of the quagmire of war," chief spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid said.

"Anyone who tries to start an insurgency will be hit hard. We will not allow another," he later added at press conference in Kabul.

The Taliban published a video of their flag being raised over the governor's house in Panjshir -- underscoring a historic win that has seen the anti-Taliban bastion defeated for the first time during 40 years of conflict.

It remained in the hands of resistance fighters during Soviet rule, a subsequent civil war and the Taliban's first regime of the late 1990s.

The National Resistance Front (NRF) in Panjshir -- made up of anti-Taliban militia and former Afghan security forces -- on Sunday acknowledged suffering major battlefield losses and called for a ceasefire.

But yesterday the group said in a tweet that its fighters were still present in "strategic positions" in the valley.

Ali Maisam Nazary, head of foreign relations at NRF, said the Taliban's

The High Court has asked the government to explain why it should not be directed to take necessary steps to block unregistered news portals, internet protocol television and Facebook pages containing false and fake news.

The court also asked the authorities concerned of the government to show cause why they should not be ordered to formulate rules determining the educational qualifications of journalists of the country.

The HC bench of Justice M Enayetur Rahim and Justice Md Mostafizur Rahman sought the explanation from the respondents issuing a rule upon them on September 1.

## Special drive for 2nd dose starts today

Daily Covid cases  
jump slightly

The number of new cases increased slightly with 2,710 infections recorded in the 24 hours till 8:00am yesterday.

The previous day, the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) reported 2,430 new cases.

Yesterday, the positivity rate was 9.82 percent against 27,595 tests, up slightly from the previous day's rate of 9.66 percent.

Over the duration, a total of 65 Covid-19 patients died across the country, five fewer than the number recorded the previous day.

The total number confirmed cases has now risen to 15,17,166 and the total number of deaths to 26,628.

The overall death rate is 1.76 percent and the positivity rate .16.69 percent.

We produce just the adequate amount of ear wax to keep things under control, but sometimes our ears can produce more than required.
