Chaldal secures \$10m

Chaldal delivers groceries ondemand through a network of warehouses enabled by technology platform.

Their customers can select from over 8,500 different products and have those delivered within an hour, making it the second-largest grocery player and the largest e-grocery company in Bangladesh, it said in a statement. In the past 12 months, Chaldal generated \$40 million in revenue and catered to 2.5 million orders, growing approximately 120 per cent year-on-year.

The company currently has 27 warehouses located in four cities --Dhaka, Narayanganj, Chattogram, and Jashore -- and plans to expand to 15 others.

"Traditionally the retail sector in Bangladesh has been dominated by...small family shops with organised retail representing less than 2 per cent of all retail sales,"

"We believe that there's a unique opportunity for digital players in Bangladesh. Online retail in Bangladesh may completely leapfrog traditional supermarkets and become the dominant model, just like many Southeast Asian countries that skipped PCs for mobile," he said.

Chaldal has partnered with global organisations such as World Food Programme and United Nations Children's Fund to provide food and other necessities to Rohingva refugees in Cox's Bazar.

During the lockdowns, the company partnered with the Trading Corporation of Bangladesh to sell basic products at discounts to stop prices from spiralling.

"They have been a huge help to urban residents during the pandemic with their relentless efforts to deliver essentials to residents' doorsteps," said Zunaid Ahmed Palak, state minister for information said Igor Kim, managing partner at communication technology.

Govt moves to end NBRexporters row

Munshi asked the senior NBR officials to explain the cash incentive issue to him today.

After yesterday's meeting, Mohammad Hatem, first vice-president of the BKMEA, said many factories started operations without the bonded licences. Later, they were awarded approval as they grew bigger.

The sudden decision of the NBR was contradictory to the business norms as the apparel exporters had been enjoying the benefit since the beginning of the garment industry in Bangladesh, he M Shahadat Hossain, chairman

of the BTTLMEA, said more than 105 small and medium-sized terry towel exporters did not have the bonded warehouse licences. "But they have been doing business

for many years. These factories will be in big trouble if the cash incentives are scrapped," he said.

Hossain also said the millers, garment exporters and cotton importers would sit for another meeting today to decide the yarn prices in the local market as per instruction of the commerce minister.

Munshi said the yarn price issue would be solved soon in consultation with the stakeholders.
