Targets precise in weekend robberies

Cops arrest robbers who had been mugging money exchange agents, others for years

For almost six years, members of a gang from Barishal have been targeting money exchange agents in the capital and looting huge amounts of cash from them.

Police's detective branch (DB) arrested three members -- Jalil Mollah, Md Riaz and Dipu -- of the gang in raids in Jashore and Savar on Wednesday, officers said.

Police also recovered two foreign firearms, 50 bullets, two motorcycles and Tk 1 lakh in stolen cash, said AKM Hafiz Akter, additional commissioner (DB) of Dhaka Metropolitan Police.

After the arrests, the law enforcement officials learned about the scheme which has enabled the gang to amass significant wealth and property over the last five or six years.

The gang first conducted reconnaissance at money exchange offices in Gulshan and Motijheel, calling agents and asking about converting between 20,000 and 30,000 dollars or euros to Taka.

The gang members then waited for the agent to call back. Once the transaction was agreed upon, some members -- stationed in the Gulshan and Motijheel areas -- started following the agent's movement, gleaning information that would later allow the gang to pounce with precision.

They conduct their operation on Saturdays as traffic is

AL men stage demo against Gazipur city mayor

Rail link to Dhaka cut off for an hour and half

Rail communications from Dhaka to other districts remained halted for around one and an half hour as some ruling Awami League activists set up fires on a railway line demanding punishment of Gazipur City Corporation Mayor Mohammad Zahangir Alam.

The demonstrators alleged that Zahangir recently made some controversial comments about Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and the number of the martyred freedom fighters at a programme and the video went viral.

Witnesses said about 200 AL men started demonstrating in Tongi Station Road, Cheraig Ali, Hossain Market and Boardbazar areas around 5:30pm. Later, they piled

'SBAC Bank chief flexed muscles to get loans'

Probe finds Tk 40cr taken resorting to irregularities

Amzad Hossain, chairman of South Bangla Agriculture and Commerce (SBAC) Bank, brought out Tk 40 crore from the private commercial bank misusing his powers and through forgery, according to an investigation into the alleged scam.

Of the amount, the bank gave a loan of Tk 20 crore to one Khulna Builders.

In its inspection, Bangladesh Financial Intelligence Unit (BFIU) has not found the organisation's existence in the place where it was supposed to be located, said sources aware of the investigation findings.

"Amzad had the loan approved abusing his power," one of the sources said.

Amzad also allegedly created and approved loan applications in the name of the organisation's staffers and then pocketed the money.

The Anti-Corruption Commission is currently probing the loan forgeries and the illegal wealth of the bank chairman, the sources said.

As a part of the investigation, ACC Deputy Director Gulshan Anwar Prodhon asked former SBAC managing director

OSMANY ADDRESSES MUKTI BAHINI

Commander-in Chief of Bangladesh Forces (Mukti Bahini) Colonel MAG Osmany, in a broadcast to the nation and the Mukti Bahini over Shadhin Bangla Betar, today expressed his heartiest congratulations to the valiant fighters of the Mukti Bahini.

He said, "Our enemy has modern jet aircraft, armoured heavy guns and sophisticated weapons obtained from the USA and the Peoples' Republic of China but we have truth and justice on our side. Fighting against odds, with grim determination and valour, you have attained unprecedented successes on the field. Many have attained martyrdom, many have been wounded or disabled but you have inflicted on the enemy 40 times more casualties in terms of enemy killed."

The commander-in-chief declared that the government had decided to recognise the valiant performances of the Mukti Bahini by awarding them gallantry awards, and recommendations had already been called from the commanders in this regard. There would be four types of gallantry awards: Gallantry of the Highest Order (Cash 10,000 rupees), Gallantry of a Very High Order (5,000 rupees), Gallantry of a Commendable Order (2,000 rupees), and Gallantry of an Order Worth Recognition (certificate of gallantry).

Two killed in daring train robbery

Two passengers died and another was injured after a 'gang of robbers' stabbed them on the roof of a commuter train in Mymensingh's Gafargaon upazila last night.

The deceased were male, but their identities could not be known immediately, Sohel Rana, officer-in-charge of Jamalpur Railway Police Station, told this correspondent.

Another passenger, Rubel, sustained stab wounds and received primary treatment at a hospital in Jamalpur's Dewanganj upazila, the OC said.

Quoting Rubel, OC Sohel Rana said when the Dewanganj-bound commuter train reached near Gafargaon from Dhaka around 8:30pm, a gang of robbers stabbed the three passengers on the roof of the train and fled with their valuables.

Fifty lakh more doses of Sinopharm Covid-19 vaccine reached Dhaka from China early yesterday.

Carrying the vaccine consignment, a flight of Biman Bangladesh Airlines landed at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport around 2:00am, according to a notification issued by Maidul Islam Prodhon, a senior information officer of the health ministry.

Tuberculosis NOT A DEATH SENTENCE ANYMORE

Medical science has advanced leaps to transform tuberculosis (TB) from a ticket to certain death to a treatable, manageable disease. Yet, taboo surrounding the transmission and treatment of tuberculosis exists.

The bacterium that causes TB -- Mycobacterium tuberculosis -- spreads through droplet transmission, when a person inhales droplets from another person with active TB. Does this mean a single
