World leaders' hidden ASSETS EXPOSED

The secret dealings and hidden wealth of 35 current and former world leaders, more than 330 politicians and about 130 billionaires were revealed yesterday in the biggest trove of leaked offshore data in history.

Branded the Pandora Papers, the cache includes 11.9 million files from companies hired by wealthy individuals to create offshore structures and trusts in tax havens such as Panama, Dubai, Monaco, Switzerland and the Cayman Islands.

They exposed the private financial

TK 1,100CR EORANGE SCAM Blame-shifting fails

The truth always comes out, and this is what the top brass of Eorange, one of the many Evely imitations, has found out recently.

When the walls were closing in on the crafty e-commerce platform following the avalanche of customer and vendor complaints about unfulfilled orders and dues amounting to Tk 1,100 crore, it conveniently passed the blame on to its former chief operating officer, seven vendors and three others.

Eorange, where absconding police inspector Sohail Rana is a director, claimed the 11 had embezzled Tk 663 crore, due

to which the customers could not get their products or their refunds and the merchants could not get their dues.

But after primary investigation, the detectives have found out that they have been wrongfully accused.

On August 12, Md Amanullah Chowdhury, who became Eorange's COO in July, filed a case with the Tejgaon Industrial Area Police Station against Md Nazmul Alam Russel, the former COO of the two-year-old e-commerce platform, seven vendors and three others.

Between January and June, Russel had purchased 36,281 motorcycles with Tk

BNP wants clean slate

Decides to go for fresh committees for front, associate bodies ahead of 'movement'

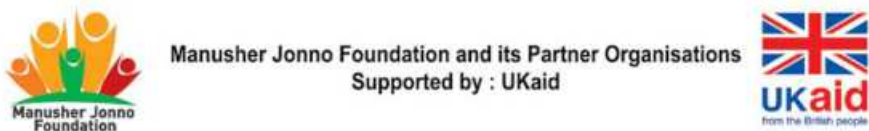
The BNP has decided in principle to dissolve all its front and associate bodies and form new ones with fresh blood, keeping the next parliamentary elections in mind.

The party, which has been stumbling in politics, moves to re-organise its different tiers as part of its plan to wage movement for an election-time neutral government and neutral Election Commission ahead of the national polls to be held in 2023, said party insiders.

The decision was made following a series of recent meetings at the party chairperson's Gulshan office.
