Bring the real money launderers to book

HC asks ACC

A High Court bench yesterday observed that instead of harassing real businessmen, the Anti-Corruption Commission has to take appropriate action against the corrupt people who have laundered money to foreign

"If you chase the businessmen in such a way, how will the country's development take place? Justice Md Nazrul Islam Talukder and Justice KM Zahid Sarwar Kajol told ACC lawyer Khurshid Alam Khan during the hearing of bail petition for a businessman.

The bench said the ACC should bring to the book the people who laundered money and and established "Begumparas" in Canada, Malaysia, and the US.

Md Khalilullah Azad, a businessman and former local Awami League leader of Dinajpur, recently filed the petition with the HC seeking anticipatory bail in a money laundering case filed with Dinajpur Police Station.

The HC bench granted him eight weeks' anticipatory bail.

Lawyer Jyotirmoy Barua appeared for Khalilullah, while ACC lawyer Khurshid vehemently opposed the

Lawyer Jyotirmoy told The Daily Star that the Criminal Investigation Department lodged the case with Dinajpur Police Station against his client Khalilullah in connection with laundering Tk 35 crore even though the ACC is supposed to file such a

He claimed that Khalilullah is a real businessman, but 17 cases have been filed against him and that he had obtained bail in all of them.

DAG Amit told this correspondent that the government would move an appeal before the Supreme Court's Appellate Division challenging the HC bail for Khalilullah.

According to the primary decision, the existing committees of the front and associate bodies will be dissolved by December, and the new committees will be formed in phases.

The BNP high-ups believe that this move will infuse enthusiasm into the party's activities and help minimise internal feuds.

The 2.94 terabytes of data also detail the financial activities of Russian President Vladimir Putin's "unofficial minister of propaganda" as well as celebrities, rock stars, business leaders, fugitives, con artists and murderers.

In short, the 2.94 terabytes of data offer the most comprehensive look into the hidden operations of a global offshore economy that enables some of the world's richest people to hide their wealth and in some cases pay little or no tax.

The corrosive effects of this shadow financial world can span generations draining significant sums from government treasuries, worsening wealth disparities and shielding the riches of those who cheat and steal while impeding authorities and victims in their efforts to find or recover hidden assets.

At least \$11.3 trillion in wealth is held offshore, according to a 2020 study by the Paris-based Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development.

Pandora Papers The obtained by the Washingtonbased International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ) two years ago and since then, more than 650 journalists from ICIJ's 150 partner news outlets around the world trawled through the files.

The disclosure that raised the most eyebrows was that of King Abdullah II, who, the leaked documents reveal, has amassed a secret \$100 million property empire spanning Malibu, Washington and London in the years after Jordanians filled the streets during Arab Spring to protest joblessness and corruption.

The king of Jordan declined to answer specific questions but said there would be nothing improper about him owning properties via offshore companies.

Jordan appeared to have blocked the ICIJ website yesterday, hours before the Pandora Papers were dropped.

Politicians and the wealthy from neighbouring India, Pakistan and Nepal were also named in the leaks, said to be a sequel to 2016's Panama Papers that had already exposed thousands of people around the world as well as revealed their secret

Six politicians from India were said to be in the leaks. Their identities are yet to be disclosed by The Indian Express, which investigated the data

Indian billionaire Anil Ambani, who declared bankruptcy in one UK court, has 18 asset holding offshore companies; fugitive Indian jeweller Nirav Modi's sister sets up a trust just one month before he fled India. Key members of Pakistan's Prime

Minister Imran Khan's inner circle, including cabinet ministers, their families and major financial backers have been exposed too by the leaks. Military leaders have been implicated as well. The documents contain no suggestion that Khan himself owns offshore companies.

Among those whose holdings have been exposed are Khan's Finance Minister Shaukat Fayaz Ahmed Tarin and his family, and the son of Khan's former adviser for finance and revenue, Waqar Masood Khan.

Limited, Sensei Capital Partners Inc. in the British Virgin Islands and CG Hospitality Holdings Global Pte Ltd in Singapore. The Pandora Papers have minute details of company correspondence,

shares and money transfers and other transactions between Chaudhary family members and partners. Some of the names mentioned are Pakistani, Singaporean, Sri Lankan and Bangladeshi.

One of those involved in Cinnovation, Chaudhary's company registered in BVI is US national of Bangladeshi descent, Abdul Awal Mintoo, a former president of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers Commerce and Industry, reports the Centre for Investigative Journalism Nepal (CIJ), ICIJ's partner organisation in the country.

Mintoo could not be reached by The Daily Star at the time of filing the

The documents also revealed a \$22 million chateau in the French Riviera -- replete with a cinema and two swimming pools -- purchased through offshore companies by the Czech Republic's populist prime commonplace for ordinary Britons.

The firm denies any wrongdoing, while the Cypriot president says he ceased having an active role in its affairs after becoming leader of the opposition in 1997.

The files also show that Azerbaijan's ruling Aliyev family has traded close to £400 million of UK property in recent years.

One of their properties was sold to the Queen's crown estate, which is now looking into how it came to The records also reveal the offshore pay £67 million to a company that operated as a front for the family that runs a country routinely accused of corruption. The Aliyevs declined to comment.

Ukraine's president, Volodymyr Zelenskiy, who was elected in 2019 on a pledge to clean up his country's notoriously corrupt and oligarchinfluenced economy, is also named in the leak.

During the campaign, Zelenskiy transferred his 25 percent stake in an offshore company to a close friend who now works as the president's top adviser, the files suggest.

Zelenskiv declined to comment and it is unclear if he remains a beneficiary.

The Russian president, Vladimir Putin, whom the US suspects of having a secret fortune, does not appear in the files by name.

But numerous close associates do, including his best friend from childhood -- the late Petr Kolbin -whom critics have called a "wallet" for Putin's own wealth, and a woman the Russian leader was allegedly once romantically involved with. None responded to invitations to comment.

Not everyone named in the Pandora papers is accused of wrongdoing.

The leaked files reveal that Tony and Cherie Blair saved £312,000 in property taxes when they purchased a London building partially owned by the family of a prominent Bahraini minister.

The former prime minister and his wife bought the £6.5 million office in Marylebone by acquiring a British Virgin Islands offshore company.

While the move was not illegal, and there is no evidence the Blairs proactively sought to avoid property taxes, the deal highlights a loophole that has enabled wealthy property owners not to pay a tax that is

Eighteen people died from Covid-19 in 24 hours till 8:00am yesterday, read a press release issued by the Directorate General of Health Services

The total number of Covid-19 deaths in the country now stands at 27,573 and the death rate stands at 1.77 percent.

At least 617 new infections were recorded during the period, taking the total number of people infected to 1,557,964, added the release.

The current positivity rate is 2.90 percent while the total positivity rate stands at 15.91 percent.

A total of 21,246 samples were tested across the country in those 24

At least 1,112 Covid-19 patients have recovered during the period.

The total number of recoveries now stands at 1,518,754 and the recovery rate at 97.48 percent.

Among the 18 deceased, nine were men and nine were women.

Of them, one was under 10, two were between 31 and 40, five between 41 and 50, five between 51 and 60 and five were above 60 years old, added the release.

by a record margin, five months after a stunning defeat in the assembly elections in Nandigram.

Mamata, the Trinamool Congress supremo, won the bypoll in Bhabanipur by a massive margin 58,835 votes against her nearest rival and Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) candidate Priyanka Tibrewal.

The win in Bhabanipur bypoll was crucial for Mamata who needed to be elected a member of the assembly within the Constitution-stipulated time of six months to continue as the chief minister.

Although Mamata had spearheaded TMC to a landslide win in the assembly poll earlier this year, her own loss in Nandigram took some sheen away from it forcing her to contest the

The Bhabanipur bypoll saw a onesided contest. At the end of the 21st round of counting of votes polled for Bhabanipur byelection, Mamata secured 85,263 votes while Priyanka bagged 26,428 votes, including the postal ballots. CPI(M)'s Srijib Biswas managed to get just 4,226 votes.

According to the Election Commission, Mamata has secured 71.9% of the votes polled in Bhabanipur while Priyanka Tibrewal managed only 22.29 percent in an election where 53.32 percent of the 2,06,389 electorate turned up to exercise their franchise in the bypoll. In winning Bhabanipur bypoll

Mamata broke her own previous records of winning margins. She had won in this constituency in 2011 (in a bypoll) by 52,213 votes and by 25,301 votes in 2016 assembly elections.

Mamata also made it a point that she won in all the seven municipal wards comprising Bhabanipur assembly constituency in the bypoll in contrast to 2016 assembly when she had trailed in a couple of wards. She also said the electorate of Bhabanipur voted for her despite 46 percent of the people of the constituency being non-Bengalis.

The Bhabanipur seat was vacated for her by state's Agriculture Minister Shovandeb Chattopadhyay who won the April vote by a margin of 28,000plus votes.

Adding to the jubilation in the TMC camp yesterday was the fact the ruling party in the state was poised to wrest two other assembly constituencies Jangipur and Shamserganj with emphatic margins.

The bypoll in Bhabanipur was held on held on September 30.

The voting in Jangipur and Shamserganj had to be conducted also on September 30 due to the death of two candidates there.

Supporters of Trinamool Congress broke into celebrations outside the residence of Mamata in Kalighat which is part of Bhabanipur constituency.

Expressing her gratitude towards the people her constituency, Mamata asked her party workers to help the flood-affected people in districts saying that would be the real celebration.

"I thank the people of Bhabanipur and the people of this state and the country who had been waiting for this election result. Our victory inspires me to work more for people. If our workers want to celebrate, they should do so by helping the flood-affected people in the districts. That will be the real celebration," Mamata told TMC supporters and the media outside her house.

But even in her hour of triumph in Bhabanipur yesterday, the defeat in Nandigram to BJP's Suvendu Adhikari by 1,956 votes in May was on Mamata's
