GRAFT CASE AGAINST SK SINHA

Verdict rescheduled for Oct 21

A Dhaka court yesterday rescheduled -- for October 21 -- delivery of the verdict of a graft case filed over Tk 4 crore money laundering against former Chief Justice Surendra Kumar Sinha and 10 others.

Judge (in-charge) Mohammed Ali Hossain of the Special Judge's Court-4 of Dhaka deferred the date as the judge concerned is on leave due to family matter, court sources said.

The court on September 14 set yesterday for delivery of the verdict.

The 10 other accused are AKM Shamim, Gazi Salahuddin, Swapan Kumar Roy, Md Lutful Haque, Md Shahjahan, Niranjan Chandra Saha, Shafiuddin Askary Ahmed, Ranjit Chandra Saha, Santri Roy and Mahbulul Haque Chisty alias Babul Chisty.

Among the 11 accused, Shamim, Salahuddin, Swapan, Lutful, Shahjahan and Niranjan are now on bail, while Mahbulul is now behind bars.

Four other accused -- SK Sinha, Shafiuddin, Ranjit and Santri -- have been absconding since filing the graft case.

On December 8 that year, Investigation Officer Md Benjiur Ahmmed, also ACC Director, pressed charges against SK Sinha and 10 others in the case.

On August 13 last year, the court framed charges against them.

Sinha resigned on November 11, 2017, from abroad. He is now in the USA.

National health information system need of the hour

Say experts at UN conference

The pandemic has shed light on the need for having national health information systems, said speakers at the United Nations World Data Forum 2021 conference yesterday.

They were talking at a session titled "Data-driven Vaccination Strategy for a Covid-19 Free World" at the conference held in Bern, Switzerland.

"Such a system is not only needed for the pandemic but in general as well," said Dr Debapriya Bhattacharya, distinguished fellow of the Centre for Policy Dialogue, adding that the system already in place needs to be fully utilised.

He said that new concerns, such as privacy and data security, must be taken into account too.

Agnes Binagwaho, vice-chancellor of University of Global Health Equity from Rwanda, said, "This is not by chance that we have successfully implemented the Covid-19 vaccine in Rwanda."

Rwandan authorities had district-wise data, and a list of those who needed to be vaccinated, like caregivers, community workers and people with underlying conditions, she said.

Anir Chowdhury, policy advisor of the ICT Division's a2i Programme, spoke about how data collected on patients during the pandemic is now being used.

"We had established a dedicated telehealth service for the Covid patients," he said, adding that they are now going back and finding out the rate of reinfection. "Covid-19 has taught us that we have to distinguish between statistics and data. All institutions must collect data."

Natalia Aquilino, a director of CIPPEC, a foundation in Argentina, emphasised the need to share and create a global pool of data.

Dr Meerjady Sabrina Flora, who leads the Institute of Epidemiology Disease Control and Research, said they are now using data to continue post-vaccination surveillance, since an amalgamation of several different kinds of vaccines had to be administered in Bangladesh.

Vietnam interested to start Dhaka-Hanoi flights

Vietnam yesterday expressed its interest to launch direct flights between Hanoi and Dhaka.

Vietnamese Ambassador to Bangladesh Pham Viet Chien relayed this interest in a meeting with State Minister for Civil Aviation M Mahubul Ali at the latter's office at the secretariat, said a press release.

"If direct communication is established by air, the relationship between the people of these two friendly countries will be further enhanced," Pham Viet Chien said.

Mahubul Ali said the two countries have many opportunities to work together for the development of the tourism industry and aviation sector.

The launch of direct flights between Bangladesh and Vietnam will boost trade and commerce between the two countries as well as connect people, he also said.

Man dies in Sirajganj road accident

A man died when he was hit by a truck on Bangabandhu Bridge road in Sirajganj yesterday.

The deceased is Md Mostab Ali (40), a sub-assistant engineer of Sirajganj District Relief and Rehabilitation Office (DRRO), said police.

Quoting eyewitnesses, Bangabandhu West Zone Police Station Officer-in-Charge Md Mosaddek Ali said a Dhaka-bound truck hit Mostab while he was crossing the road around 10am. He was rushed to Sirajganj General Hospital where doctors declared him dead, the OC said. Police detained the truck driver and seized the vehicle.

DRRO officer Abdur Rahim told The Daily Star that Mostab was an engineer of Ashrayan project, working in both Pabna and Sirajganj. He was going to Pabna for official work.

After completing legal procedures, Mostab's body will be sent to his ancestral home in Pabna.

US envoy hands over 25 lakh Pfizer doses

US Ambassador to Bangladesh Earl R Miller has handed over 25 lakh doses of Pfizer vaccine to Bangladesh.

The vaccines build on earlier US Covid vaccine donations for a total of 1,15,00,000 doses.

Ambassador Miller and Kathryn Stevens, mission director of USAID, handed over the vaccines to Syed Mojibul Haq, additional secretary of the health ministry, and Prof Abul Bashir Mohammad Khurshid Alam, director general at Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), during a ceremonial handover event at the capital's Expanded Programme on Immunisation (EPI) headquarters yesterday.

"The United States is pleased to donate these additional 2.5 million [25 lakh] doses of life-saving Pfizer vaccine to Bangladesh and continue our support to the national vaccination campaign," said Ambassador Miller.

This delivery of Pfizer vaccines comes as part of the broader commitment by the United States to lead the global Covid-19 response by donating a billion doses of Pfizer vaccines around the world -- free of charge -- through 2022.

Pistol misfires inside Rangpur mayor's office

Confirming the incident, Mayor Mostafizur said there was no casualty.
