The experience of Mushfiqur Rahim, Liton Das and skipper Mahmudullah Riyad and the youthful exuberance of Naim Sheikh, Afif Hossain and Mahedi Hasan have given the Tigers an excellent balance to go all the way. And then there will be Shamim Hossain and Shoriful Islam, two of the members of the under-19 team which delivered Bangladesh their first global title -- the ICC Under-19 World Cup -- just before the pandemic set in.

With the entire nation behind them, we hope that the Tigers take a leaf out of the youngsters' book and emulate the success on a bigger scale in Oman and the UAE.
