# Pran-RFL generates 33,000 jobs in Narsingdi

Pran-RFL Group has recently generated 33,000 more jobs at three factories in Narsingdi.

Around 90 per cent of the employees are locals and about 20,000 female employees, said a press release.

### TMSS loans now thru bKash STAR BUSINESS DESK

Thengamara Mohila Sabuj Sangha (TMSS) recently signed an agreement with bKash enabling its members to both

receive microfinance loans and pay monthly instalments through the mobile financial service provider.

Currently, the nongovernment organisation (NGO) disburses loans and receives instalments through its 856 branches.

The bKash solution will make the process easier, bringing relief to members, said a press release.

"(It will) make our microfinance activities more dynamic," said Prof Hosne Ara Begum, founder executive director of the TMSS.

"This bKash service...is convenient and secured for both the borrower and lender. It is time-saving and costeffective as well," said Kamal Quadir, chief executive officer of bKash.

While the arrangement was being prepared, bKash donated Tk 1 million to TMSS Medical College and Rafatullah Community Hospital to facilitate free medical services for severely infected Covid-19 patients.

No fear of inflation 'runaway train': IMF chief

Global finance officials are worried about rising inflation pressures but there it is little fear that it will become a "runaway train," IMF chief Kristalina Georgieva said Sunday.

With supply chain bottlenecks growing in the face of surging demand, policymakers have focused attention on rising prices and whether they will linger or fade away in coming months.

"We are in a more somewhat more uncertain space now," Georgieva said at the G30 central banking conference.

However, in advanced economies "policymakers have the tools" to deal with inflation, she said, so "there is no significant concern that this would be a runaway train.

"Even so, finance ministers and central bankers gathered last week in Washington for the annual meetings of the IMF and World Bank were more concerned than previously that the prices increases could be more than transitory, she said.

And major emerging markets like Russia and Mexico already have raised interest rates showing that "in these places their policymakers are sufficiently concerned already to take action.

"In the world's largest economy, US Federal Reserve officials have signaled they will begin to pull back on stimulus by tapering its bond purchases in the last few weeks of the year, but the benchmark interest rate is expected to remain at zero with no increase until late 2022 at the earliest.

The Bank of England so far has left its stimulus unchanged, but there were signs of dissent at its most recent policy meeting, when two of its rate-setting panel voted to stop the bond-buying stimulus as soon as possible to help quell inflation.

BOE governor Andrew Bailey said central bankers face a "very difficult balancing act" because they cannot address the underlying supply shocks with monetary policy, but have to respond to what is happening in the economy.

Failure to act to contain inflation risks undermining central banks' inflation-fighting credibility, he said. "We have ... to preserve the huge progress we've made in terms of the credibility of monetary policy regimes. I mean that is absolutely critically important," Bailey said at the conference. \$3.4b on US automotive batteries

Toyota Motor Corp's North American unit said Monday it will invest about \$3.4 billion (380 billion yen) on US automotive battery development and production in the United States through 2030.

The world's largest automaker by volume also said it plans to establish a new company and build a new US automotive battery plant together with Toyota Tsusho, the automaker's metals trading arm and a unit of the Toyota Group.

The new plant, which includes a planned \$1.29 billion Toyota investment through 2031, aims to start production in 2025 and is expected to create 1,750 new US jobs.

The funds are part of the \$13.5 billion it announced in September it planned to spend globally by 2030 to develop batteries and its battery supply system.

Stocks of Orion Pharmaceuticals traded the most, worth Tk 89 crore, followed by Delta Life Insurance, LafargeHolcim Bangladesh, British American Tobacco (BATBC), and Fortune Shoes.

The index dropped around 36 points collectively for the fall of BATBC, the biggest contributor, Grameenphone, Walton Hi-tech Industries, Square Pharmaceuticals, and the Investment Corporation of Bangladesh.

Among major sectors, the paper and printing, and tannery sectors experienced price appreciation while the services and real estate, non-bank and textile sectors faced correction, according to a daily market review by UCB Stock Brokerage.

On condition of anonymity, a senior official of a merchant bank said that some institutional investors sold off a massive amount of shares to adjust their capital market exposure.

"But this situation will not continue for long and so, the market will bounce back soon," he added.

The Chittagong Stock Exchange (CSE) also dropped yesterday as the CASPI, the general index of the port city bourse, edged down 314 points, or 1.49 per cent to 20,707

Among the traded 307 stocks, 35 rose, 257 fell and 15 remained unchanged.

The BB also fixed a uniform rate for the settlement of transactions through point of sale (POS) devices.

Banks will be allowed to charge merchants a maximum of 1.6 per cent against the total transaction made by clients. Of the amount, banks, which own the POS devices, will share 1.1 percentage points with the lender that has issued cards.

Clients will have to count Tk 20 per transaction while withdrawing money through POS devices. Some banks have recently set up the terminal to help clients withdraw funds through the POS like they do with an automated teller machine (ATM).

The card issuers will provide the fee to the banks and the financial service providers that provide the services to clients.

Clients will have to pay Tk 20 to deposit money with banks through inter-bank ATMs.

In order to transfer funds from one lender to another through ATMs, clients

The lender has set 33 conditions related to reform initiatives, including a reduction in interest rates on savings certificates and scrapping the unconditional scope to legalise untaxed money.

Other conditions include relaxing the foreign exchange policy and lessening the interference of Bangladesh Bank so that the foreign exchange market can function on its own.

The government has already cut the interest rate on the savings instruments. However, a senior official of the finance ministry said the rate cut was aimed at bringing down interest expenses. The IMF has proposed the government initiate reforms about the banking industry, revenue mobilisation, macroeconomic management, and efficient use of the resources in the health sector. Another senior official of the finance ministry says it has not agreed to all of the conditions of the IMF. Discussion is underway to bring down the number of conditions, he said. An IMF mission will visit the country this year when the issues will be thrashed out, he said. Last year, Bangladesh received \$732 million from the IMF as emergency assistance to address the challenges posed by Covid-19. In the same year, the Asian Development Bank provided \$650 million as budgetary support. Another \$1.44 billion came this year. The Manila-based lender may extend a further \$250 million in the current fiscal year. The World Bank approved \$2 billion budget support in 2020 and extended \$600 million to the health ministry to buy coronavirus jabs and health-related equipment. It has assured Bangladesh of another \$250 million in assistance. Apart from these, the government is expecting a combined \$600 million from the Japan International Cooperation Agency and the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank for vaccine purchase. Bangladesh will need to spend around Tk 17,000 crore in the current fiscal year to buy vaccines and meet vaccinerelated expenses.
