DU Vice-Chancellor Prof M Akhtaruzzaman said the rise of communal forces in various parts of the country is disgraceful and cannot be tolerated. "We demand the government immediately identify the perpetrators."

Former vice-chancellor of Jagannath University Prof Mijanur Rahman said, "When these incidents occur, thousands of people get charged, but later, offenders get away with it. We demand that those responsible for these incidents receive exemplary punishment."

DUJA President Prof Rahmat Ullah, General Secretary Nizamul Hoque Bhuiyan, and former VC of Noakhali University of Science and Technology Prof Wahiduzzaman were present among others.

Chittagong University Teachers Association and Jagannath University Teachers Association organised separate human chains on their campuses, condemning the attacks.

In the afternoon, under the banner "Poet-writer-artist-journalist against communal violence", hundreds of different professionals formed a human chain in front of the National Museum at the capital's Shahbagh.

They placed an eight-point demand, including arresting the attackers, taking prompt action against perpetrators of previous attacks, and stopping communal and gender insensitive speeches in the name of waz mahfil.

Writer Swakrto Noman placed the demands at the human chain, while artist Sangeeta Imam, writer Ahmed Mostafa Kamal, actress Moutishi Biswas, researcher Chanchal Ashraf, and journalist Julhas Nur were present among others.

A group of left-leaning activists held an "anti-communal harmony march" from Paltan to Dhakeshwari Mandir. After reaching Dhakeshwari Mandir, they held a rally there. Bangladesh Chhatra Union Central Committee President Foez Ullah announced that they would surround the home ministry on Sunday, demanding resignation of Asaduzzaman Khan.

"Everybody is saying the Durga idol is being vandalised, but in reality, Bangladesh is being broken into pieces. There was no resistance programme in the town, and demanded resignation of the home minister for his "failure to resist attacks on minorities".

Besides, protest processions were organised in Dinajpur, Noakhali, Savar, Manikganj and Feni. **TIB STATEMENT**
Transparency International Bangladesh in a statement slammed the failure of law enforcers in fending off attackers at various parts of the country. "We saw that hundreds of cases were filed across the country,

towards the attacks, rather people who want to resist faced obstacles. This means the government is supporting the attacks," former Chhatra Union president and peasants' leader Manabendra Deb said.

Pragatishil Chhatra Jote brought out a procession at noon on DU campus, and a group of lawyers under the banner "Lawyers' Sampriti" formed a human chain in front of Dhaka Metropolitan Sessions Judges' Court.

In Brahmanbaria, Sommito Sangskritik Jote held a protest

accusing thousands... but the real perpetrators are not being identified, and officials are not rising above the clichéd political blame games. The real perpetrators remain behind the scene, while communal violence continues. We saw no action against attackers, though more than one and a half thousand homes and mandaps belonging to the Hindu community got vandalised and were set ablaze."

Education of 37 million

affecting countless children, and many will continue to be felt in the years to come," it said.

"We cannot overlook the impact that the disruption of education services has had on children, particularly the most vulnerable. When schools remain closed, children miss out on the biggest opportunity to learn and develop to their full potential. The future of an entire generation is at stake; therefore, we need every effort to ensure a safe reopening of schools as soon as possible. Otherwise, the learning loss will be difficult to overcome," stated Marcolugi Corsi, Unicef regional director a.i. for East Asia and Pacific.

While countries across Asia are taking actions to provide students with distance learning, a Unicef-supported study by the Campaign for Popular Education (CAMPE) showed that two out of three pre-primary to upper secondary students in Bangladesh were not reached through remote education during pandemic school closures.

In addition to the lack of material assets and support to access technology, other significant obstacles that prevent disadvantaged children, including many girls, from accessing distance learning during these difficult times include a generally poor learning environment, an increase in pressure to take up domestic household chores and being forced to work outside the home, the report said.

The report underscores the importance of delivering equitable and inclusive distance learning at scale to reach all children during full or partial school closures, while providing a package of support to ensure children's health, nutrition and wellbeing.

It also calls on governments and partners to strengthen teaching and teacher support, so as to address current low levels of learning and help narrow the learning divide, and protect and preserve education funding.

"With schools now open in Bangladesh after an 18-month closure, we must spare no effort to rapidly put in place mechanisms that help children catch-up, keeping a particular focus on the most disadvantaged children. Now is the time to invest, to strengthen the education system, and to bridge digital inequalities," said Sheldon Yett, Unicef representative to Bangladesh.

ground to take cognisance of the charges.

Earlier in the day, Abdur Rahim, a resident of the capital's Tejaoga area, filed the case with the tribunal against Mayor Atiqul under sections 25 and 29 under the Digital Security Act.

The judge then recorded the complainant's statements. According to the case, Mayor Atiqul forcibly possessed the complainant's property and intentionally published various offensive, false, intimidating, and defamatory information about him [complainant] and his family through various media using the digital devices.

A legal notice was sent to the mayor on September 12, but he did not respond, the case statement said.

same district, five under Laksam upazila of Cumilla, and rest under Sirajganj, Jashore, Kishoreganj, Bagerhat, Jamalpur, Sherpur, Manikganj, and Narayanganj districts.

A total of 71 candidates were elected unopposed in the first phase of UP election, which witnessed polls to 364 UPs. Most of the 71 were from the ruling party, said EC sources.

Ruling Awami League candidates won 267 chairman posts in the first phase of elections.

In the first phase, elections were held in 204 UPs on June 21 and 160 UPs on September 20.

The EC held the first-phase polls on two dates due to Covid-19.

Voter turnout in September 20's UP elections, held in seven districts, was 69.03 percent, and it was 64.73 percent in June 21's elections, held in 13 districts.

Election to 1,007 UPs in the third phase of election will be held on November 28.

"There are potholes at different points on the road. They get obscured under ankle-to-knee deep water, which collects here even after a drizzle," he added.

Md Selim, a local resident, said he comes across accidents regularly, especially after rain. It prompted him to take an initiative to pump out water from the road with the help of a motor.

According to Selim, it takes around two hours to pump away rainwater with the motor.

Anik Sarkar, a van driver, said it is very tough to drive on the road, especially through Ali Bahar point, as there is always traffic congestion due to the road's poor condition.

"We have been repeatedly complaining to Dhaka South City Corporation to repair the road, but to no avail," said traffic sergeant Md Ramzan Munshi.

"We have to deploy two traffic police officers at this point to prevent accidents," said Ramzan.

Contacted, Harunur Rashid, executive engineer of the city corporation (DSCC), said the road is not under DSCC's jurisdiction and is maintained by Roads and Highways Department (RHD).

Shamim Al Mamun, executive engineer of RHD (Dhaka), said the road at this point faces this condition due to waterlogging.

Water often overflows from drains of adjoining areas, as vehicles from nearby factories and shops clog the drains, he added.

According to him, the drains there are supposed to ensure smooth flow of rainwater, but water from nearby areas pose a problem, and that's what causes most of the waterlogging.

"We are going to turn it into a six-lane road. A project proposal has already been prepared," said Shamim.

Under the project, a concrete road will be constructed, with drains on both sides to solve the waterlogging, and they will continue to repair the road and maintain the drains to keep the thoroughfare usable, he said.

at a doa mahfil arranged by Dhaka-south city unit of Jatiyatobadi Swechhchasebak Dal at BNP's Nayapalton central office, which prayed for the speedy recovery of party chairperson Khaleda Zia.

The BNP leader said Bangladesh is a country of religious harmony, and people of different religions have been living here peacefully for a long time, showing respect for each other's religion.

He accused the government of inciting communal violence to arrest BNP leaders and activists, and thus, divert people's attention from price hike of daily essentials and utility services.

"Around 300 of our leaders and activists have already been arrested. We would like to make it clear that it won't be possible to suppress BNP with all these attacks and cases," he said.

He questioned the reason behind Awami League's "Harmony Rally and Peace Procession", saying it is the responsibility of the ruling party to protect communal harmony.

Abbas said AL should step down after handing over power to a neutral government, which will pave the way for a credible national election.

"We'll accept whoever will come to power through the election under a non-partisan neutral government," he added.
