Denmark, Costa Rica, the Marshall Islands and six other countries yesterday urged the world's biggest economies to

hike their climate pledges, warning that

their actions would set the tone for the upcoming COP26 summit in Scotland. Extreme weather events and increasingly urgent calls from scientists to curb global warming are cranking up pressure on lawmakers who will meet in Glasgow later this month to discuss

action to reduce their carbon emissions. "The window for taking decisive climate action is rapidly closing," said the letter, seen by Reuters, which was sent to Prime Minister Mario Draghi of Italy, the current president of the G20 club of rich nations.

G20 leaders will gather in Italy on Oct. 30-31 for a summit. Climate change will be high on the agenda, with divisions deep over the rapid emissions reductions scientists say are needed to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees above pre-industrial levels.

Meanwhile, a group of like-minded developing countries this week released a statement slamming developed countries for expecting poorer nations to commit to tougher emissions targets The meeting in Rome will "set the when rich countries have broken their own promises to cut CO2.

The group, which includes China, Consensus looks a long way off. India and Saudi Arabia, also said

richer nations had failed to deliver on promises of \$100 billion a year by 2020 to help developing countries battle climate change.

At least four G20 leaders are not expected to come to Rome, including China's Xi Jinping, at the helm of the world's biggest greenhouse gas emitter, and Russia's Vladimir Putin, head of the largest energy producer.

One source said while such absences were "not a great political signal," they would not necessarily prevent progress.

However, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi will attend the UN climate summit in Glasgow.

Trump to launch new social network 'TRUTH Social'

Former US president Donald Trump announced plans Wednesday to launch his own social networking platform called "TRUTH Social," which is expected to begin its beta launch for "invited guests" next month. "I created TRUTH Social and TMTG to stand up to the tyranny of Big Tech," Trump, who was banned from Twitter and Facebook in the wake of the Capitol insurrection carried out by his supporters on January 6 this year, was quoted as saying in the statement. "We live in a world where the Taliban has a huge presence on Twitter, yet your favorite American President has been silenced. This is unacceptable," he continued. The Trump Media & Technology Group will merge with blank check company Digital Acquisition Corp to make TMTG a publicly-listed company, the statement said.

Man charged with murder of UK MP David Amess

A 25-year-old man has been charged with murder, after British MP David Amess was stabbed to death last week, the Crown Prosecution Service and police said yesterday. Ali Harbi Ali, who was arrested at the scene of the killing in Leigh-on-Sea, east of London, last Friday, also faces a separate charge of preparing acts of terrorism. He was due to appear before magistrates in central London later yesterday. Amess, a 69-year-old fatherof-five, was killed as he met constituents at a church hall, in the second such death of a British MP in the last five years. The veteran Conservative MP's death sparked an outpouring of tributes from his parliamentary colleagues but also calls for better security for elected representatives.

Facebook says will pay French press for news

Facebook yesterday said it had reached an agreement with some French newspapers to pay for news content shared by its users, months after Google announced plans to renumerate them for articles shown in web searches. Facebook said the licensing agreement with the APIG alliance of national and regional newspapers "means that people on Facebook will be able to continue uploading

and sharing news stories freely amongst their communities, whilst also ensuring that the copyright of our publishing partners is protected." The company said it would also launch a French news service, Facebook News, in January to "give people a dedicated space to access content from trusted and reputable news sources". Neither Facebook nor APIG said how exactly the licensing agreement would work. News outlets struggling with dwindling print subscriptions have long seethed at the failure of Google in particular to give it a cut of the millions it makes from ads displayed alongside

Pakistan FM in Kabul to meet Taliban government

Pakistan foreign minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi arrived in the Afghan capital yesterday for talks with his Taliban counterpart, his office said, as the militants seek a path out of international isolation.

"The talks between the two sides will cover the entire spectrum of bilateral relations and focus on ways and means to deepen cooperation in diverse areas," the Pakistan foreign ministry said in a statement. He will also meet "other

Afghan dignitaries," during his one-day visit, the statement said. Qureshi is also accompanied

by Pakistan's outgoing spy chief, who is on economic and humanitarian crises within his second visit to the Afghan capital since the Taliban took power.

Pakistan, one of only three countries

that recognised the last Taliban regime in the 1990s, is seen as wielding considerable influence over the group.

It has long faced US allegations that its intelligence service supported the Islamist insurgents in their two-decade battle against Nato forces and the now deposed Western-backed government.

On Wednesday, the Russian government hosted a high-level Taliban delegation and officials from 10 countries, including China and Pakistan, to push the militants for action against Islamic State fighters which it says have massed in perennially volatile Afghanistan. In return, the Taliban -- which is facing

its borders -- urged the international community to recognise their interim government.

India administers one billionth Covid jab

India administered its one billionth Covid-19 vaccine dose yesterday as it fights its way back from a devastating surge in cases that brought the health system close to collapse, but cases surged in China

Prime Minister Narendra Modi hailed the feat as a "triumph of Indian science", but authorities remain on guard for a new pandemic wave.

About three-quarters of adults in the country of 1.3 billion people have had one shot and 30 percent are fully vaccinated, according to government figures.

But hundreds of millions of Indians under 18

who make up about 40 percent of the population - have not had a single shot. Only China's government, which says it has given

out more than 2.3 billion shots, has administered more doses than India. Meanwhile, authorities in China cancelled hundreds of flights, closed schools and ramped up

mass testing yesterday to try and stamp out a new Covid-19 outbreak linked to a group of tourists. Beijing has maintained a relentless zero-Covid approach with strict border closures and targeted

lockdowns, even as other countries tentatively try

schools closed as China fights virus outbreak Moscow to shut non-essential services over virus

to ease restrictions.

In Russia, Moscow will shut non-essential services between October 28 and November 7, its mayor said yesterday, as coronavirus deaths soar in Russia, the country in Europe hardest hit by the pandemic, amid dramatically low vaccination rates.

Mayor Sergei Sobyanin announced the 11-day closure a day after President Vladimir Putin ordered a nationwide paid week off at the end of the month to curb fast spreading infections.

Russia reported a record 1,036 Covid-19 deaths in a single day yesterday, but officials have warned the worst is yet to come, with only 35 percent of Russians fully vaccinated.

Turkey warns of expelling 10 western envoys

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan yesterday threatened to expel the US, German and eight other Western ambassadors after they issued a rare joint statement in support of a jailed civil society leader. Parisian-born

philanthropist and activist Osman Kavala, 64, has been in jail without a conviction since 2017, becoming a symbol of what critics see as Erdogan's growing intolerance of dissent. The 10 ambassadors

issued a highly unusual joint statement on Monday -- distributed widely on their Turkish social media accounts -- saying Kavala's continued detention "cast a shadow" over Turkey.

Kavala has faced a string of alternating charges linked to 2013 anti-government

The 10 envoys were summoned to the Turkish foreign ministry on Tuesday.
