Mohib Ullah Murder

All to foil Rohingya return

The plan to kill Rohingya leader Mohib Ullah was made at a meeting on September 27 night at Kutupalong refugee camp in Ukhiya, police officials said.

Four of the suspected assailants joined the meeting at Lombashia Morkoz Hill around 10:00pm and discussed that there was an order from their leaders to kill Muhib, they added.

They discussed that Muhib was becoming too influential as a leader and he must be killed to foil the repatriation process, Naimul Haque, superintendent of police and commander of 14th Armed Police Battalion (APBn), told a press briefing at his office in Ukhiya vesterday.

As per the plan, a member of the group, Murshid Amin, went to Muhib's home in Kutupalong on September 29 night and requested him to come outside to discuss the repatriation process.

Muhib then went to the nearby office of the Arakan Rohingya Society for Peace and Human Rights to talk to the man. Murshid then informed two other

Saikat, now sacked from the organisation, masterminded the attack, Rab officials say as they arrest him with his accomplice

A local Chhatra League leader, along with his accomplices, instigated the mob to burn down homes and shops of the Hindu community in Rangpur's Pirganj upazila on October 17.

Rab disclosed the information yesterday following the arrest of Saikat Mandal who it said was the mastermind

behind the communal attack. Saikat, along with one accomplices named Rabiul Islam, was arrested in Tongi area of Gazipur on Friday, Rab spokesperson Commander Khandaker Al Moin told reporters at Rab media centre in the capital's

Karwan Bazar. Saikat was the vice-president of philosophy department Chhatra League at Rangpur's Carmichael College. On October 18, a day after the attack, Carmichael College Chhatra League sacked him for breaching the

organisation's discipline. Tanzirul Islam, organising secretary of the unit, was handed the same punishment.

In a statement yesterday, the unit's president Saiduzzaman said, "We made the decision after we learnt that the two were present on the spot during the attack. Police will now dig out their roles in the attack.'

Chhatra League is a pro-Awami League student organisation.

Ramon Magsaysay winner Firdausi Qadri, in interview with The Daily Star, speaks on the need for Covid vaccine production locally

Bangladesh needs to attain self-sufficiency in vaccine supply as soon as possible to combat Covid-19 and any future public health emergencies, Ramon Magsaysay Award winner scientist Dr Firdausi Qadri has said.

"Today we are talking about Covid-19. Nevertheless, we know many diseases will emerge [in future]. As we are graduating to a middle-income country, we will not get vaccines at a lower price. So we have to be self-sufficient," she said in an interview with



The Daily Star last week. The scientist noted that there has been a lot of progress in the past six months to build necessary infrastructure for vaccine production locally, but the government has a lot to do to promote existing vaccine production

infrastructures as well as build new ones. Dr Firdausi is an emeritus scientist and Head of the Mucosal Immunology and Vaccinology Unit at the International Centre for Diarrhoeal Disease and Research, Bangladesh (icddr,b).

1 killed in Faridpur pre-polls violence

A man was killed and 20 others were injured in a clash between supporters of the Awami League and its rebel candidates for the chairman post of Jadunandi Union Parishad in Faridpur's Saltha upazila yesterday

The dead is Mariz Sikdar, 30, of the upazila's Khardia village, said police, adding that the law enforcers had to open fire to bring the situation under control. According to locals, Jadunandi union unit AL President Abdul Rob Mollah submitted his nomination as a

chairman candidate with the party ticket. On the other hand, Saltha upazila unit AL member Rafique Mollah submitted his nomination for the same post as AL rebel candidate. Nurujjaman Thakur, member

of the upazila unit AL, supported him. However, around a month ago, Thakur left Rafique's group and joined Rob. Tension has been prevailing ever since, they added.
