China's forex reserves rise for first time since July

China's foreign exchange reserves in October rose on a monthly basis for the first time since July, official data showed on Sunday, as the dollar slipped against a basket of other major currencies.

China's reserves, the world's largest, reached \$3.218 trillion at the end of October, up 0.53 per cent from a month earlier, according to data from the State Administration of Foreign Exchange (SAFE).

Govt to inject more funds into **House Building Finance**

The initiative is aimed at ensuring shelter for every person in Bangladesh, said Kamal. He also expressed hope that all sectors would be gradually digitalised in Bangladesh.

The corporation hasn't received any application about KPML as of November 3, the closing date of the EoI. "We will extend the deadline," said the official. BCIC Chairman Shah Md Imdadul Haque said they took the initiative to build four to five factories on the estates.

The corporation plans to set up the factories under joint ventures. "But if we don't find any investor, we will move on our own," he said. "BCIC is like a sinking ship and we are

struggling to survive.

KARNAPHULI PAPER MILLS LTD (KPML) With five acres of land, the country's largest paper mill, KPML was established in 1953 in Chattogram's Chandraghona. It made a profit within a short time on the back of the availability of raw materials. But after 2001, it fell in the red.

The factory also faced a lot of corruption and irregularities at that time, said a former official, on condition of anonymity.

In 2008, the government started BMRE (Balancing, Modernisation, Rehabilitation and Expansion) at the factory that continued till 2014. But in a report in 2018, the Implementation Monitoring and Evaluation Division called the BMRE a total waste.

The BMRE was conducted based on a concept prepared in 1996, which was not realistic in

In 2010, a bleaching tower was set up to improve the quality of papers, but it went out of order due to technical glitches just a week after it was inaugurated. Its condition has remained the Tk 120 crore in investment, but the government

same since then. The tower cost the taxpayers Tk 171 crore.

"Currently, our paper mill is operational. However, the production has declined sharply. This factory is quite old, and the equipment don't run smoothly," said KPML Managing Director Bidyut Kumar Biswas

At its peak, the paper mill used to produce 100 tonnes of paper a day. Now, it has come down to 20-30 tonnes.

The government has to spend around Tk 2 crore per month for the salaries of the officials of KPML and bear other expenses.

CHITTAGONG CHEMICAL COMPLEX LTD

CCCL has been shut since 2002.

According to EoI documents, BCIC wants to set up a new chemical complex having chloralkali and chlorine-related basic chemical compounds on the premises of the complex in Barabkund, Sitakunda.

A former official of CCCL said they had performed BMRE for the complex in 1998 at the cost of Tk 114 crore, which was secured as a loan. But the company could not bear the debt burden, and the amount of revenue loss was increasing.

The government shut the factory in 2002. In 2011, the government moved to revive it and reopened the factory in 2016. But it saw a loss of Tk 36 crore per year.

A committee of BCIC said the company would return to profit if it could manage another

Moazzem Hossain, managing director of CCCL, could not be reached for comments.

Khulna Newsprint Mills Ltd (KNML) KNML, located in Khulna's Khalishpur, started its operation in 1959.

From 1995 to 2002, the newsprint factory incurred a loss of Tk 284 crore, according to a source. The losses compelled the BCIC to close it. It has been closed for around 20 years.

The corporation sent it to the Privatisation Commission in 2005, but the efforts to sell it twice were unsuccessful. It was brought under the industries ministry again in 2008.

At that time, the corporation formed a committee to conduct a feasibility study. The committee recommended an investment of Tk 422 crore to make a turnaround. But the advice has not been implemented.

The government spends Tk 14 lakh every month to pay salaries to about 50 people, including five permanent officials and 30 security guards.

Prof Mostafizur Rahman, a distinguished fellow of the Centre for Policy Dialogue, said the government should set up a public enterprise reform commission for troubled state-owned enterprises. The commission will recommend measures whether they should be closed or continued, need BMRE, or run under the privatepublic partnership.

"The commission should provide an independent advice that should be implemented by the government," he added.

Govt policies barely help SMEs fight pandemic: study

The BB issued as many as 564 circulars related to the different stimulus packages, of which 38 were dedicated for the small and medium enterprise (SME) sector.

Khondaker Golam Moazzem, research director of the CPD, presented the keynote Availability of relevant data is a major

requirement in setting targets, which is important for the formulation of stimulus packages.

But the data of prospective borrowers is not available with the banks, said Moazzem.

During the pandemic period, some 27 stimulus packages have been announced with a combined fiscal and financial support of Tk 1.29

Considering the setbacks, the government decided on the targeted amount based on the previous year's disbursement.

The loan distribution packages were based on "banker-customer relationship", benefitting the existing borrowers and leaving the new ones behind, Moazzem said. There is no comprehensive database on

the SMEs and women-led enterprises, putting

Dhaka, said the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS) contributed little during this pandemic. The BBS did not provide adequate information to the government which would have enabled taking decisions based on the actual situation of

the economy, he said. The government earlier planned to provide direct cash support to the poor but it failed to provide the fund to every person targeted due to

"We do not have updated information on the implementation rate of the stimulus packages. We have urged the government to set up a dashboard," Eusuf said.

As per the SME policy 2019, 15 per cent of the total SME loans will go to the women entrepreneurs, but the guidelines of the stimulus packages mentioned that 5 per cent of the fund must be mandatorily provided to females.

This is a gap between the two policies, Eusuf

"There is a requirement of a huge number of documents in order to get loans from banks. So, it is difficult for women and micro enterprises to avail the fund," he said.

The government is now trying to reach the micro entrepreneurs but discrimination exists,

Clients are able to take out loans from banks aying interest at 4 per cent, a subsidised rate. But they have to count interest between 9 per cent and 12 per cent if they want to take loans

through microfinance institutions, Eusuf said. As per the BB circular, some Tk 25 lakh can be rovided to the SME borrowers without collateral ut few clients have enjoyed the facility.

So there should be a one stop service to stimulate the SME sector as this is the lifeline of the economy, Eusuf said.

Sayema H Bidisha, professor of the Department of Economics at the University of Dhaka, said terms and conditions should be distinguished given the existing state of affairs of the women entrepreneurs.

She said building a database is important for identifying genuine entrepreneurs and vulnerable groups.

Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives (LGRD) Minister Tajul Islam said there was a lack of governance in society.

There have been allegations about the lack of knowledge and the funds of the packages not being provided to the targeted people.

But this is not the whole scenario as the

packages have helped revive the economy, he

Alexandra Berg von Linde, Swedish ambassador to Bangladesh, said it was

widely accepted that women participation in Bangladesh's labour market was improving. But the working environment for women is poor and they are concentrated on low-paying

jobs, she said. The pandemic has severely affected microenterprises and their workers, many of whom chiefly depended on income derived from daily earnings.

They have become victims to a large extent for adversities stemming from the health and economic sector.

Mentioning a study, she said policies targeting vulnerable groups could be more efficient.

Fahmida Khatun, executive director of the CPD, moderated the workshop.

Even though it is much appreciated that a number of packages as well as circulars have already been issued from the government's end, complications are persistent regarding multiple factors, she said.

Losses pile up for traders, exporters

The situation at the country's premier seaport worsened on the third day of the strike as export and import activities were badly disrupted.

Speaking to The Daily Star, Chittagong Port Authority Secretary Md Omar Faruk said the delivery activity remained suspended, and the loading of export containers came to a halt yesterday. Three container vessels -- AS Sicilia, MV Bangkok and

MV Xpress Lohtse -- deferred their scheduled departure yesterday morning since they did not receive around 1,900 TEUs (twenty-foot equivalent units) of exportladen containers at the port from private inland container depots as per schedule as the prime movers, which carry containers, did not operate.

Shahed Sarwar, deputy managing director of Crown Navigation Ltd, the local agent of Sicilia, said they were supposed to accept over 1,250 TEUs of export containers, but a third of them was yet to be reached.

"The vessel waited for an additional day. We may need to wait one more day since it will be a huge loss for the operator if the vessel leaves for Colombo without taking a good number of containers." Another Colombo-bound vessel Xpress Lohtse did

not receive 600 TEUs of export containers. It will have to depart today without taking the containers since its stay at the jetty has already crossed 96 hours. Two more vessels -- SOL Hind and Kota Bistari -- are scheduled to leave the port this morning. But as of yesterday evening, both of them were waiting to receive

600 TEUs and 400 TEUs of containers, respectively. The vessels may have to push back their departure. The disruption to the vehicular movement also badly hurt trading activity in Khatunganj, the largest commodity

hub in Bangladesh. Traders said only 20 to 30 trucks loads of goods arrived

at the hub, down from 300 trucks usually. Mohammad Idris, general secretary of the Hamidullah Mia Market Traders Association in Khatunganj, said no onion-carrying trucks showed up in the last two days.

"Sales fell by almost 60 per cent." Kazi Belayet Hossain, the immediate past president of the Bangladesh Frozen Food Exporters Association, said most of the frozen foods were transported by the companies' own vehicles as they required a special freezing facility. Mokbul Ahmed, president of the Bangladesh Covered Vans, Trucks, Prime Movers and Ponno Paribahan Malik Samity, said most of the 3.5 lakh vehicles in the

country observed the strike yesterday. "We will continue our strike until the proposed prices of

the petroleum products are cut."

Stocks plumb new depths

Quasem Industries shed the most, dropping 6.83 per cent, followed by Prime Textiles, Zaheen Spinning Mills, First Finance and Bangladesh Monospool Paper Processing.

"As many stocks already dropped in the last few weeks, investors' shares are in the red zone now. So, if they sell shares now, they will have to incur losses," a merchant banker said. In this situation, investors do not want to sell shares but on the other hand, they do not have enough confidence to invest more funds to buy shares averaging at lower prices either. "Only if their confidence can be regained will they invest again," the merchant banker added.
