5 others bullet-hit in attack on councillor's office

Of the deceased, Syed Ahmed Sohel, 48, councillor of ward-17, was also the panel mayor of the city corporation and president of the ward unit Awami League.

The other one, Haripada Das, 45, a member of the ward unit AL, was one of the close aides to the councillor. The injured are Awal Hossain Rizu, 23,

Rasel, 29, Majedul Haque Badal, 39, Jewel, 40, and Sohel Chowdhury, 43. All of them are associates of the

councillor, said locals. Ahmed, Contacted, Farooque superintendent of Cumilla police, said additional forces were deployed in the city to avert any further untoward incidents.

He could not say the reason behind the killing immediately.

Sohel's name came up in the discussion after communal violence took place during

Igbal Hossain, who is accused of placing the Holy Quran in the city's Nanua Dighir Par puja mandap in the early hours of October 13,

used to reside in one of Sohel's houses at Pathuriapara as a tenant.

Around 4:00pm yesterday, Sohel and others were sitting at the councillor's office. Some eight to 10 masked men came on motorcycles, stormed into the office and opened fire, police and witnesses said.

Sohel, a resident of the city's Sujanagar area, sustained bullets wounds in the head, chest, abdomen and other parts of his body. A total of nine bullets hit him, said Dr Md Mohiuddin, director of Cumilla Medial College Hospital.

All the injured were rushed to the hospital, where Sohel and Haripada died around 8:30pm

The rest were undergoing treatment there as of filing of this report at 1:10am

Immediately after the incident, several hundred people took to the streets in

Rise meteoric, fall too

Muscle power, slush funds, realpolitik took him to heights of Gazipur AL politics


He became the vice chairman of an upazila parishad, general secretary of Gazipur city Awami League, and mayor of Gazipur -- all before he was 40. Zahangir Alam's henchmen, a supply

of cash from questionable sources, and connections with powerful politicians enabled him to reach the top of AL in Gazipur really quickly, party insiders say.

But his fall was even quicker. Speaking at a programme in late September, Zahangir, 42, made controversial comments on Bangabandhu and the number of Liberation War martyrs.

The AL central committee on October 3 issued a show-cause notice to Zahangir. The AL expelled

him from the party. Zahangir might soon get sued under the Digital Security Act and lose his mayorship.



"In his relatively short political life, he became so powerful that he felt nothing could touch him, as he had blessings from a section of top Awami League leaders," said a member of

Gazipur city AL President Azmat Ullah Khan said the AL will benefit

"There were allegations that he used to patronise activists of other political parties. It was harmful for the party. The action against him saved the party from further losses," he

Judge Qumrunnaher Her criminal judicial powers too go

The Supreme Court yesterday seized the criminal judicial powers of Mosammat Qumrunnaher, former judge of Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal-7

The action was taken in connection with a case, in which she had granted bail to a rape accused despite this court's stay order on the bail.

A five-member bench of the SC's Appellate Division, headed by Chief Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain, delivered the order at a closed-door courtroom after hearing a petition filed by the state in 2019.

The state's petition had challenged a High Court order, which granted bail to Aslam Shikder, a former official of private TV channel ATN Bangla, in a rape case filed against

Qumrunnaher has been released of her judicial duties by the chief justice on November 14 this year, three days after she -- in an open court -- verbally recommended that police not register any rape case if the complainant goes to them 72 hours or longer after the incident.

50 hurt in clashes in 2 dists

BNP to submit memorandums to DCs today

At least 50 people were injured in clashes between BNP leaders and activists and law enforcers in Natore and Khulna yesterday during demonstrations demanding the government allow party Chairperson Khaleda Zia to go abroad for advanced treatment.

The BNP staged protests in all divisional and district headquarters as part of its countrywide demonstration programme.

Meanwhile, BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir at a rally in the capital announced that the party will submit memorandums to all deputy commissioner (DC) offices across the country today to press home the same demand.

At least 20 people, including cops and journalists, were injured as police and BNP men clashed in Natore



Another 30 were hurt in the clash in front of the BNP office in Khulna city. The clash ensued around 12:15pm when BNP leaders and activists tried to march on KD Ghosh Road, witnesses said.

BNP leaders alleged that police did not allow them to hold a rally in front of the party office and chased them away.

Moniruzzam Moni, general secretary of Khulna city BNP, said police attacked them all of a sudden.

"Police carried out attacks on us in two phases. A number of leaders and activists, including city BNP President Nazrul Islam Manju, were injured in the incident. Police also arrested several leaders and activists,

Cooperation deepening

Indian defence minister says on armed forces of Bangladesh, India

The cooperation between the Armed Forces of Bangladesh and India is deepening, said Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh yesterday.

"I am glad that the cooperation between the Armed Forces of both the countries is steadily progressing, by way of several activities -- defence dialogue, staff talks, joint training, exercise and high-level exchanges," he

He made the remarks at a reception hosted by the Bangladesh High Commission in New Delhi to mark the 50th anniversary of the Armed Forces Day by paying homage to Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and the martyrs of the Liberation War of 1971.

The day is observed on November 21, which signifies the day in 1971 when the members of the Bangladesh army, navy and air force were officially united and launched joint operations along with the people against the Pakistan occupation forces.

Singh said it is remarkable that all three service chiefs of Bangladesh have visited India this year, and from India, the chiefs of army and air force visited Bangladesh this year.

He mentioned that India has extended a line of credit worth \$500 million to Bangladesh for defence equipment.

Muhammad Imran, Bangladesh high commissioner to India; Manoj Mukund Naravane, Indian chief of army staff; Vivek Ram Chaudhury, chief of air staff; Karambir Singh, chief of Naval Staff; and Md Abul Kalam Azad, Bangladesh's defence adviser, were also present.

This is the first time since independence that the union cabinet minister for defence and all the chief of military services of India joined to celebrate armed forces day of Bangladesh, said the Bangladesh High Commission in New Delhi in a statement.

Singh congratulated the armed forces of Bangladesh and saluted the valiant struggle of the Muktibahini in the War of Liberation, and said the spirit of freedom fighters forms the core of today's armed forces of Bangladesh.

He also paid tribute to the sacrifices made by the brave soldiers of the Indian armed Forces.

Recalling that India gave shelter to millions of refugees from Bangladesh, ne said a struggling nation gave shoulder to another.

Today, Bangladesh's armed forces are one of the highest contributors to the UN Peacekeeping Forces and are respected globally for their professionalism and commitment to just causes, Singh added.

Talking to The Daily Star, several residents of the city's Pathuriapara said the killing might have happened due to previous rivalry. But they did not give any details about it.

Sohel, the second among six brothers and four sisters, left behind his wife, a son and two daughters.

Some of his followers told The Daily Star that witnesses saw that the killers came to the spot on motorbikes wearing black dresses and masks. They could identify two of them who are residents

However, police could not confirm identification of any of the killers.

Talking to the media, Cumilla City Corporation Mayor Monirul Haque Sakku, also a BNP leader, said such a killing in the city is rare.

Sohel had been serving as a councillor for two terms in a row since

Some locals claimed they saw the attackers fleeing towards the city's Boubazar area after the incident.

Seeking anonymity, some said rivalry was going on between Sohel and another group over establishing supremacy in the area and controlling drug trade and extortion. This newspaper could not verify this independently.

Talking to the press, Sohel's nephew Mohammad Hanif, also general secretary of ward-17 AL, said, "I was offering prayers at a place near my uncle's office. Hearing sounds of firing, I rushed to the spot and saw my uncle lying on the floor. took him to hospital.

'Źila Parishad representatives will have to leave the posts after the expiration of their tenure. The government would appoint an administrator to run the local body until the formation of the next council," Islam said.

The cabinet also approved the draft of the Bangladesh Film Certification Act, 2021 bringing some minor changes to the existing law.

Moslem Uddin and his wife Setara Begum had four katha of land in Salna area of the city. They had a three-storey building and a semi pucca one on it.

"My house was built on my fourkatha land. The city corporation did not acquire it. They just demolished part of my building and the walls. I did not get anything in compensation," he said.

"The mayor called us to his office through his aides. I along with several other affected people went there twice, but he did not meet us," Rafigul added Their frustration was echoed by

The High Court issued status quo orders in November 2020 on the possession of land of Quasem Lamps Limited, Quasem group's guest house at Baimail, and the properties of Escort Packaging Factory at Itahata, Majlishpur.

Despite the orders, the city corporation took over portions of land of the factories of Quasem Lamps Ltd and the guest house in Baimail, Joydevpur, on August 19 and 20. The corporation demolished the structures and boundary walls.

"The High Court status quo order was hung at the gate of Quasem Lamps Ltd. But they demolished it at the mayor's order," said Tariq Abul Ala, deputy managing director of the factory.

There are allegations that Zahangir made a party billboard with the city corporation money while over 300 individuals working for a charity named after him also get money from the city corporation.

RISE AND FALL OF ZAHANGIR Zahangir entered politics as a student

in the late 1990s. Between 2006 and 2010, he was the vice president of Bangladesh Chhatra League central committee. In 2008, he was elected as the vice chairman of

Gazipur Upazila Parishad. In 2013, he sought the AL nomination for mayor of Gazipur City Corporation, but did not get it. He became Gazipur AL general secretary later that year, and in 2018, he got the

AL nomination for mayor and won. Insiders say Zahangir alienated influential AL leaders like Liberation War Affairs Minister AKM Mozammel Hug, State Minister for Youth and Sports Zahid Ahsan Russel, lawmaker Meher Afroze Chumki and Azmat Ullah

"He wanted to ensure total supremacy in the area," said a senior local leader.

Contacted about the allegations, Zahangir said, "No one raised such allegations two months ago. It is a conspiracy against me and you [the reporter] raise the questions. Many people are spreading lies because I am in a fix now. If anyone can prove that I... grabbed land, you can put me

In Natore, BNP staged a protest in front of the party office on Alaipur Road of the town around 10:00am.

Khaleda was sent to jail on February 8, 2018 in a corruption case. Amid the coronavirus pandemic, she was freed temporarily on certain conditions on March 25 last year. The term of her release has been extended four times

over 200 migrants trying to reach Italian coast AFP, Tunis

Tunisia intercepts

Tunisian authorities said Sunday they had intercepted more than 200 migrants trying to reach the Italian coast, in nine separate operations.

"In the context of the fight against irregular immigration, units from the northern, southern and central regions managed to thwart nine (sea crossing) attempts" overnight Saturday to Sunday, national guard spokesman Houssem Eddine Jebabli said.

The interceptions took place both at sea and on the coast, assisting 223 migrants from different African countries, including 111 Tunisians, the national guard said.

Late last month, Tunisia's coastguard said it had thwarted six departure attempts and rescued 125 Europe-bound migrants, 112 of them from sub-Saharan Africa.

Earlier in October, four Tunisians migrants died and 19 others went missing after their boat capsized off

the country's east coast. More than 58,800 migrants have managed to reach Italy since the start of the year, most of them by sea, according to the UN refugee agency.

More than 1,300 have died or gone missing while trying to make the Mediterranean crossing, particularly to reach Italy, Spain and Greece.

Tunisia is a key departure point for would-be migrants hoping to attempt the dangerous sea crossing to Europe. The Italian island of Lampedusa is

ocated just 140 kilometres (less than 90 miles) from Tunisia's east coast. According to the FTDES rights group, the Tunisian coastguard intercepted some 19,500 people

attempting to cross the Mediterranean in the first nine months of this year. It said the trend had accelerated since the establishment in June of a direct line of communication between Rome and Tunis to coordinate efforts against illegal immigration and share

information. Since Tunisia's 2011 revolution, political instability and socioeconomic crisis have worsened unemployment, which stands at 18 percent nationally but at more than 40 percent among young people.

will let you know about it," he said, without specifying what kind of action will be taken against the GCC mayor.

On Friday, the Awami League (AL) expelled Alam, its Gazipur unit general secretary and city mayor, for life for his controversial comments on Bangabandhu and other local leaders

The decision was taken at a meeting on Friday of the Awami League Central Working Committee chaired by party chief and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

Immediately after the expulsion, a discussion in the public sphere has begun over his suspension as the mayor as he was elected on AL's party ticket.

In a briefing after the meeting, AL General Secretary Obaidul Quader said legal action might be taken against the Gazipur mayor. "We will officially communicate the party's decision on Zahangir Alam to the

LGRD minister." On October 3, the Awami League issued a show-cause notice to Alam for his recent viral video that includes controversial comments on Bangabandhu, the number of people martyred during the Liberation War and other local leaders.

The notice said the comments damaged the image and popularity of the political organisation. He was asked to reply to the notice within 15 days.

She was also withdrawn from the tribunal and attached to the law

ministry the same day. She made the recommendation while delivering a verdict in the Banani Raintree double-rape case on November 11, which drew flak from different quarters. The verdict was met with a huge outcry and nationwide rage, leading to her suspension from judicial duties.

Her recommendation is, however, missing from the written

judgement. Yesterday morning, Qumrunnaher appeared in person before the Appellate Division during a hearing of the state's petition, as this

court on November 15 passed an order on this issue. She appeared before the five-member bench of the apex court at 9:30am and left the courtroom around 11:00am. After the hearing, the Appellate Division seized the criminal

judicial powers of Begum Mosammat Qumrunnaher, an SC press release said yesterday. It added that the full text of the verdict will be released later. The contents of the court proceedings could not be known as no lawyer, official or media person was allowed in the courtroom.

During an earlier hearing on the same petition, the SC on March 12, 2020, summoned Judge Qumrunnaher, directing her to appear before it on April 2 of that year for granting bail to Aslam Shikder in the rape case. Earlier that same day, the SC called for case documents from the

tribunal and found that this court's chamber judge on June 25, 2019, ayed the HC order, which on June 18, 2019, granted bail to Aslam. However, Qumrunnaher granted the bail on March 2 last year. After issuing the summons order, the state's petition was not heard until November 15 this year as courts' physical functions

Another Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal of Dhaka acquitted Aslam in the rape case on October 20 last year. The state filed an appeal with the HC challenging the tribunal's verdict of acquittal. The appeal is still pending with the court, court

remained suspended due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Stop killing of elephants right now

HC directs authorities

The High Court yesterday directed authorities concerned to immediately take steps to stop the killing of elephants and human intrusion into the animals' corridors, and

build awareness among people about the issue.

The court also issued a rule asking authorities to explain in four weeks why they should not be directed to issue a gazette notification, declaring the 12 elephant corridors, identified by the forest department and IUCN, in the country as reserved corridors.

In the rule, the court asked respondents to explain why their inaction to prevent elephant killings should not be declared illegal.

Secretaries at the environment and law ministries, chief conservator of forest department, director of wildlife crime control unit, and 16 other government officials have been made respondents to the rule.

Net zero emission target false, elusive

Civil society groups term COP26 outcome frustrating

Civil society groups termed COP26 outcome frustrating, as there was no concrete decision to finance the most vulnerable countries (MVCs), especially for adaptation and loss-and-damage due to climate change.

They called for the government to develop country-owned long-term financial strategies to support climate actions at a webinar yesterday.

COAST foundation, Bangladesh Indigenous Peoples' Network on Climate Change (BIPNET-CCDB), Centre for Participatory Research and Development (CPRD), Coastal Development Partnership (CDP), Coastal Livelihood and Environmental Action Network (CLEAN) and Equity and Justice Working Group, Bangladesh (EquityBD) jointly organised the programme.

Syed Aminul Hoque of EquityBD condemned the UK's position for the so-called "Net Zero Emission" target by 2050, which supports the big emitters to continue their carbon emission instead of the "Zero Emission" target.

Prof Mostafa Saroar of Khulna University of Engineering and Technology said that "Net Zero Emission" is a move towards carbon colonialism.

"This target is false and elusive," he added.

Climate negotiator Quamrul Islam Chowdhury criticised the developed countries' initiative of "New collective and quantified goal on finance (NCQG)", where there was no representative from the most vulnerable countries (MVCs) to finalise the process.

"The developed countries have denied their responsibilities by deferring the \$100 billion promise by 2023. This is completely unacceptable," said Shamim Arefin of AoSED-Khulna.

Sharif Jamil of Bangladesh Poribesh Anolon suggested solving the domestic problems to move towards effective carbon reduction strategies with alternative energy techniques.



Govt planning to form company to implement underground rail network

The government is planning to form a company for implementing its plan to build an underground railway network in the capital and adjacent areas.

An initiative has already been taken for enacting a law to determine the formation, works and other issues of the company, officials said.

"Formation of a company for the subway is at planning level," Abu Bakr Siddique, executive director of Bangladesh Bridge Authority (BBA), told The Daily Star yesterday.

BBA is currently carrying out a feasibility study for building the subway network, and it is expected to be completed by February next year.

The project's draft feasibility study, submitted in March, proposed an underground railway network, with 258 kilometres of tracks in Dhaka, with an aim to ease traffic

There will be 11 subway routes in the city and its outskirts. and the 50-year plan will be implemented in three phases.

Four routes, which will run for a total of 102 km, will be constructed in the first phase. In the second and third phases, lines running for a total of 85 km and 71 km will

There will be a 29.35 km route called "O" from Jhilmil Project area in Keraniganj to Tongi. It will be the first to be implemented, at an approximate cost of USD 8 billion, officials said earlier.

Some experts, however, while talking at different platforms earlier questioned the feasibility of the mega project in an unplanned city like Dhaka.

Besides, the proposed subway routes will run parallel to metro rail lines in many areas, which is another problem, The government is developing a 128.74 km elevated and

underground metro rail network, comprising six metro rail lines, in the city and adjacent areas, which is supposed to be completed by 2030. Although the subway has long been in discussion, it

was not included in the revised strategic transport plan for Dhaka, approved in 2015, reportedly because it is not feasible, they added. However, project director Kazi Md Ferdous, at a

programme in March, said they would build the subway to organise the city's traffic. BBA had sent the proposal to Dhaka Transport

Coordination Authority to incorporate the subway in the strategic plan, sources said.

The project's consultants said the metro network should be complemented by the subway system for better coverage and connectivity.

The indefinite strike called by transport workers in Sylhet, which brought immense suffering to city residents, especially students, has been postponed till January 5 next year.



Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List in 2008, said wildlife experts.

In Bangladesh, the Sambar was commonly found in the hilly region of Chattogram, Chattogram Hill Tracts, and Sylhet once upon a time, said Dr Farid Ahsan, a professor of Zoology Department

of Chittagong University. However, over the years the population of the species has declined substantially due to hunting and loss of habitat, he said.

Bridge on Kaliganga River in Piroipur

LGED starting process all over again

The wait of thousands -- residents of seven unions in Nesarabad and Kawkhali upazilas -- for a bridge on the Kaliganga river has been prolonged by at least several more years, as the contractor firm assigned with the work failed to construct the bridge in three years'

In September this year, nearly 10 months after the firm -- Navana Construction Ltd -- missed the deadline for completing its construction, Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) revoked the Tk-115-crore contract

Navana won the tender to a 600-metre-long bridge on the river, connecting Kalakhali village of Pirojpur Sadar in April, 2018, with a deadline of

Navana won the tender to construct a 600-metre-long bridge on the river and it would have a total of 1,200 metres of approach roads on both sides.

upazila with Chandkathi village of Nesarabad upazila. The width of the bridge would be 10 metres and it would have a total of 1,200 metres of approach roads on both

The work on the bridge started

November, 2020.

On January 15 this year, when this paper ran a report headlined "Bridge on Kaliganga River in Pirojpur: Two years' deadline over, LGED wants 2 years more", LGED claimed that 15 percent of the work was done.

But later, in September, the LGED said they cancelled the contract with Navana as it completed only eight percent of the work.

Pirojpur LGED Executive Engineer Abdus Sattar Howlader said they officially annulled the contract with Navana Construction Ltd on September 9 this year, as it failed to show progress in the construction work before the deadline.

The land acquisition process on both sides of the proposed bridge

site has already been complete and "we are working on floating a tender again for completing the construction of the bridge," he also

However, the delay in the work will result in a rise in the cost of the project by about 15 to 20 percent, said a few LGED officials, requesting anonymity.

Expressing frustration over the news of the bridge's re-tender process, Sheikh Obaidullah, a resident of Chandkathi village in Nesarabad, said, "We were delighted after the construction started", as it would benefit people in five unions of Nesarabad and two unions of Kawkhali upazilas.

Rural economies in the riverine region would develop if the bridge was completed, said Aminul Islam, from the same village.

Erosion by Padma takes serious turn in Faridpur

Around 200 acres of arable land, portion of road devoured since mid-October

With decreasing water level in the Padma river, erosion has taken a serious turn at two villages under Decrirchar union in Sadar upazila, devouring fresh areas including a large portion of an important village road and vast arable land.

Local people said erosion by the Padma river is going on at Pauldangi and Taher Fakirdangi villages, stretching about one and a half kilometres areas under the

They said around 200 acres of arable land has already been devoured by the mighty river in the last couple of weeks.

Moreover, about 80-feet portion of the Paldangi road has been washed away by the river, villagers said, adding that more than 4,000 inhabitants of five villages use the road, which is their only means of communication to go the upazila and the district town.

During a visit to the two erosion-hit villages this correspondent saw vast arable lands, a boat terminal and portion of a brick-made road have been devoured by the swelling river.

The fresh erosion is also posing threat to some 20 houses, including 12 houses of an Ashrayan Project of the government.

Zakir Pramanik, 35, a resident of Taher Fakirerdangi village, said the erosion first Faridpur WDB official said they have nothing to do as the two erosion-hit villages are located in char areas.

Sudan frees several civilian leaders held since coup

Sudanese authorities yesterday released several civilian leaders detained since last month's coup, a key plank in a deal aimed to restore a fragile transition process towards full democracy. "I was released late yesterday evening," the head of Sudan's Congress Party Omar al-Degeir told AFP. "I was in solitary confinement and completely cut off from the world throughout this period." Other civilian politicians, including from the Umma party, were also released. Top general Abdel Fattah al-Burhan last month declared a state of emergency and ousted the government, in a move that upended a two-year transition to civilian rule. It triggered a wave of mass street protests in which at least 41 people were killed.

Delhi lifts ban on construction as air quality improves

New Delhi has lifted a ban on construction activities as air quality improved marginally, but schools and offices will remain closed until at least Wednesday, its environment minister said yesterday. Delhi's Air Quality Index (AQI) dropped to 303 on a scale of 500, down from 499 nearly a week ago, when a thick haze hung over the city of more than 200 million people. The current AQI levels still indicate "very poor" conditions, according to government monitoring agencies. "Air quality is slowly improving," Gopal Rai, the capital's Minister for Environment, Forest and Wildlife Development, told a news conference. "Labourers were facing difficulties, and that is why we have decided to resume construction activities." He said the authorities would monitor construction sites to ensure that builders follow dust-control measures set out by the government.



Lanka begins trials linked to 2019 Easter bombings case

A Sri Lankan court yesterday began the first of three trials connected to bombings that killed nearly 270 people on the island in 2019, amidst appeals for greater accountability from victim support groups. In this trial, former national police chief Pujith Jayasundara is charged with failing to act on repeated intelligence warnings of a possible terror attack. A total of 855 charges of murder and attempted murder were read out as Jayasundara stood in the dock at the back of the courtroom. A total of 1,215 witnesses have been listed to give evidence but not all may be called, his lawyer said. "Our position is the former police chief is not quilty. Indian farmers hold mass rally in Lucknow Keep pressure on Modi despite climbdown

Flushed with victory after Prime Minister Narendra Modi caved into demands for agricultural reform laws to be repealed, Indian farmers held a mass rally yesterday to demand minimum support prices be extended to all produce, not just rice and wheat.

The protest movement launched by farmers more than a year ago became the most serious political challenge to the Hindu nationalist government, and resulted in Modi making a surprise commitment on Friday to roll back the reforms.

Thousands gathered for the latest rally in Lucknow, the capital of Uttar Pradesh, where Modi's Bharatiya Janata Party will seek to hold onto power in state elections due early next year. His climbdown sparked celebrations by farmers, but their leaders immediately warned that the protests would continue until the government promised to introduce a law that would guarantee minimum prices

Remove legal handcuffs off the

Why have laws that prevent the prevention of corruption?

HE legal bindings stopping the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) from playing an effective role in preventing money laundering are counterproductive and should, therefore, be immediately removed. According to an ACC commissioner, some people in the country are involved in massive amounts of money laundering—worth crores of taka. But because of legal constraints, the ACC has been unable to do anything about it.

In 2019, the government formulated the Money Laundering Prevention Rules, which assigned particular organisations to investigate particular crimes under the Money Laundering Prevention Act, 2012. The rules specified 27 types of money-laundering-related offences, of which the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) of police has been given the task to investigate 24 alone or with the National Board of Revenue (NBR), Department of Narcotics Control, and Department of Environment. The ACC has been given the sole responsibility to investigate the money laundering offences related to graft and bribery, while the NBR and Bangladesh Securities and Exchange Commission (BSEC) can probe crimes related to tax and capital

If the government wants other agencies to be involved in investigating money laundering cases, that is all well and good. But why restrict the ACC's ability to also be involved in such cases? Money laundering is a huge problem for Bangladesh: according to the Global Financial Integrity, between 2008 and 2017, Bangladesh lost a staggering USD 7.53 billion per year on average to trade misinvoicing, which accounted for 17.95 percent of Bangladesh's international trade with all its trading partners during the period. And its most recent reports indicate that the amount of money being laundered has only grown. That means the government should do everything in its power to check money laundering—not restrict any of its agencies from probing into such cases.

Over the years, we have seen the government slowly infringe upon the independence of the ACC, taking away its powers to prevent and investigate various types of corruption-related cases. The over politicisation of our government agencies is already a major problem that prevents the ACC from being effective; erecting legal barriers on top of that will only turn the ACC into a toothless tiger—if it hasn't already.

We frequently hear the ruling party propagate that it has zero tolerance for corruption. But its actions often speak differently. If the government is serious about fighting corruption, it should clear the way for the ACC and other agencies that deal with corruption to do their job unhindered. At the same time, we must also point out that the legal barriers aren't the only issue preventing the ACC from doing its job. For years, its high officials have lacked the courage needed to go after people who are involved in high levels of corruption. That courage is something that the ACC must find on its own.

Why is our out-ofpocket healthcare expense rising?

Govt must take measures to bring down OOP expenditure

recent study conducted by the health ministry has found that Bangladesh's out-of-pocket (OOP) healthcare expenditure has been rising steadily, instead of falling. According to the study, our OOP expenses have increased to 68.5 percent in 2020 from 67 percent in 2015, which is the highest in South Asia. While about 64 percent of the OOP expenditure goes towards medicine, disease diagnosis accounts for eight percent, and inpatient and outpatient services account for 12 percent and 11 percent, respectively. Due to such high healthcare expenditure, 4.5 percent of people are pushed into poverty every year, the study found. The findings are indeed alarming, and we need to find out the underlying reasons and address them in order to bring down our healthcare costs.

It is particularly shocking to know that 64 percent of our OOP expenditure goes towards medicine, while it is only 28 percent in India. Our patients have to spend more on medicine because of irrational prescriptions and aggressive marketing by pharmaceutical companies. And, in the absence of any rules and proper monitoring mechanisms, the private diagnostic centres are charging patients exorbitantly for medical tests. The result is that a majority of our patients avoid going to the doctors when they really need medical assistance, and take over-the-counter drugs instead. According to the Health Financing Strategy 2012-2032, we need to halve our OOP expenditure to 32 percent by 2032 to meet the target of Universal Health Coverage (UHC).

Healthcare experts suggest that we should revise and expand the list of emergency medicines and follow the treatment protocols prescribed by physicians, as well as reduce the diagnosis costs to bring down our overall healthcare costs. In addition, the aggressive marketing strategies by pharmaceutical companies have to be stopped. It should be made mandatory for our physicians to write down the generic names of medicines in their prescriptions, instead of promoting the medicines of any particular company, which would help

reduce competition among pharmaceutical companies. Additionally, our primary healthcare systems in rural and urban areas need to be strengthened so that patients don't have to seek treatment in private healthcare facilities. Moreover, coordination between community clinics and upazila health complexes through the introduction of e-health services, ensuring efficiency of the public healthcare facilities, and introducing a social health insurance system are some of the main areas where we must make improvements.

After the UN resolution on Rohingya crisis, what comes next?



a resolution titled **Human Rights** of Rohingya Muslims and Other Minorities in Myanmar" was adopted at the United Nations

with unanimous support—a first for a Rohingya-related resolution since the crisis began in 2017. The resolution asked the Myanmar authorities to address the root causes of the Rohingya crisis. Jointly tabled by the member states of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) and the European Union (EU), the resolution maintained a strong focus on the Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh, and for finding a permanent solution to this protracted crisis. Having said that, last week's resolution does have some "face value"—both diplomatic and political as it was supported by China and Russia, who in the past always vetoed against any action against Myanmar. Therefore, this resolution is expected to create an impetus for real action in the long run; however, presently, it hardly leads to anywhere. To the Myanmar government, the UN resolution is "intrusive" and shows no respect for "sovereign integrity."

The latest episode of the crisis was initiated by Myanmar with a military crackdown on the minority group in Rakhine state, leading to a massive exodus of Rohingyas to Bangladesh starting on August 25, 2017. Since then, Bangladesh has given shelter to more than 700,000 Rohingyas. Including those who took refuge here on previous Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) for from the OIC, the EU, or any member managing the off-shore facility.

Meanwhile, multiple attempts to repatriate the Rohingyas to their homeland have all failed. Bangladesh and Myanmar signed the first repatriation deal in November 2017. Another agreement was signed in January 2018 to complete the repatriation of all Rohingyas within two years. The failed attempts were followed by the military coup in Myanmar, which led to a complete collapse of meaningful communication between the two neighbouring countries. Given the new momentum and support at the international level, the Bangladesh government should kickstart the repatriation process directly with Myanmar or through a friendly third-party broker/negotiator to find a mutually acceptable solution. We need to remember that it is ultimately a bilateral

state of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (Asean) as a reliable, impartial and honest broker to jumpstart the negotiation. The newly appointed special envoy of the UN secretary-general on

Myanmar can also facilitate the process. Second, Min Aung Hlaing, head of the current military junta, oversaw the crimes against the Rohingyas, including the reported war crimes and crimes against persons of other minorities, in Myanmar. The army chief who reportedly orchestrated many criminal activities is now heading the Myanmar government. The post-coup tragedies, including killings, torture, imprisonment, sexual violence and rape, continue unabated till date, violating all international laws. The Rohingya crisis and the current oppressions of the mass people by the military are two sides of the same coin.

The UN and the international community must act to bring the perpetrators of the crimes against Rohingyas to justice, and ensure accountability for human rights violations. A truth and reconciliation commission must be established in Myanmar under UN leadership to review all reports of atrocities, and punish those who were responsible in order to re-establish confidence, citizens' rightsparticularly for the minority groups, rule of law, and peace in the country. This is very critical to creating conditions conducive for the voluntary, safe and sustainable return of the Rohingyas. Truth and accountability will be required to restore and strengthen inclusive democratic institutions and processes in the country

In sum, the UN resolution on Myanmar itself will not lead to the desired goals for orderly repatriation of the Rohingyas any time soon. This should be followed by actions at all levels-national, regional, and international. It is time for Bangladesh and Myanmar to re-engage in bilateral talks to enable voluntary, safe and dignified return of the Rohingyas to Myanmar. Since Bangladesh is burdened with the refugees on many fronts, there is no choice but to build a plan, define the approach with international help, and execute it in an orderly manner in collaboration with Myanmar. Achieving this may not be easy, and be fraught with many hiccups and roadblocks. Much work remains to be done diplomatically as part of—and beyond—the newly adopted UN resolution. Bangladesh should now make the move to engage seriously with Myanmar to protect its own interest in the short and long runs.

the current atrocities, torture, arbitrary arrests and violation of human rights in Myanmar since the military takeover in February 2021. Apart from the OIC and EU, the resolution received significant cross-regional support from the US, Canada, Mexico, Argentina, Australia, New Zealand, Switzerland, Japan and the Republic of Korea, among others.

While the resolution demonstrates a good gesture by the member states at the 76th UN General Assembly meetings and sends a signal to the Rohingyas that they are not yet "forgotten" by the international community, it still does not cover all bases, and clearly lacks commitments and a concrete action plan occasions of displacement, Bangladesh is now hosting well over 1.1 million of the displaced Myanmar nationals, providing them with humanitarian assistance, including medical care and attention during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. This generosity earned respect internationally for Bangladesh and its prime minister, Sheikh Hasina. The UN resolution recognised the efforts of the Bangladesh government, the massive investment made in building the facility at Bhashan Char to relocate a portion of the refugee population from the squalid camps in Cox's Bazar, and the signing of an agreement between Bangladesh government and the UN High issue, and must be resolved bilaterally between the two countries, with necessary support and assistance from the UN and other key regional players.

Modi's Anti-Muslim Jihad



India's **1** recent defeat by Pakistan at the T20 Cricket World Cup tournament, Indian bowler Mohammed Shami faced vicious trolling on social media. It was the

latest display of the Islamophobic bigotry that has consumed the Indian society under the rule of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Bharatiya

Shami had performed poorly in the match. But so had 10 other Indian players in the rout by Pakistan. Shami was singled out because he is Muslim. His failure was viewed not merely as a sporting issue, but as a failure to do his best against an opposing team composed of his co-

Unpleasant as it was, the Shami episode pales in comparison to other recent incidents of Islamophobia in India. In Darrang district, in the northeastern state of Assam, the state's BJP government launched an eviction drive against Muslims whom it decided were "illegal settlers" on public land. During a protest against the evictions, police shot and beat a villager, and a photographer officially documenting the demolition drive brutally stomped on him, in full view of cameras, even after his body appeared lifeless.

Video footage of the murderous assault went viral on social media, prompting much hand-wringing among those sections of the public not yet inured to stories of violent hate crimes against its Muslim minority, which have proliferated under BJP rule. In recent years, a spate of inflammatory anti-Muslim rallies has sometimes erupted in violence. In February 2020, riots consumed parts of the capital, New Delhi, leaving more than 53 dead. Most of the victims were

There has also been a dramatic increase in lynchings of Muslims, especially for the "offence" of transporting or consuming beef (the cow is considered holy in Hinduism). Most states have enacted laws prohibiting the slaughter of cows, and

both police and self-appointed mobs are enforcing them with greater zeal than judgement. Cow "vigilantes" have been known to beat Muslims, forcing them to chant Hindu religious slogans. Such hate crimes are committed with impunity.

Meanwhile, police have charged Muslim students under draconian terrorism and sedition laws for the frivolous "crime" of cheering for Pakistani cricketers. Four Muslims were arrested in the city of Indore for attending a popular annual college dance celebration that was abruptly classified as restricted to "Hindus only." A Muslim journalist named Siddique Kappan has been jailed for more than a year on charges of sedition, terrorism, and incitement, when all he did was his job.

sins—both real and imagined—of past Muslim invaders and rulers are blamed on the entire community.

Whereas previous governments sought to temper communal passions, promote harmony, and provide official support (including tax incentives) for efforts to promote India's pluralism and diversity, the BJP unapologetically embraces an intolerant majoritarian Hindutva ideology. Those close to the ruling establishment routinely excoriate the Muslim minority—and previous governments' alleged appeasement of itas a threat to India's Hindu identity.

Under the BJP rule, campaigns have been launched against interfaith romance (with Muslim men being accused of waging "love jihad" to entrap Hindu

offering fast-track citizenship to refugees from neighbouring Muslim-majority countries—provided they were not Muslim. And family-planning campaigns have been portrayed as efforts to preserve India's "demographic balance"—India is 80 percent Hindu—in the face of higher Muslim fertility.

What dismays liberals like me is how thin the veneer of India's constitutional secularism has turned out to be. In just seven years of BJP rule, the cultural pluralism and Hindu-Muslim amity that India has touted for decades have been annihilated.

There was a time when government officials would point proudly to Muslims in prominent positions as evidence of India's ability to overcome the bitter legacy of Partition with Pakistan. Today, Muslims are dramatically underrepresented in the police forces and elite central administrative services, and they are overrepresented in the prisons. Sentiments that would have been deemed impolite to express a generation ago are declaimed from political platforms. The police often enable, rather than stop, the torment of Muslims.

Islamophobia now seems to have colonised a significant segment of north Indian society, though the south has yet to succumb. India's much-vaunted free press has been complicit—and even an active participant—in the erasure of its longstanding syncretic cultural traditions.

Under the BJP rule, the segregation and disempowerment of Muslims—the division of Indian society into "us" and "them"—is being gradually normalised, and Indians are becoming desensitised to the routine expression and practice of anti-Muslim bigotry. A Muslim who points this out will be told to "go to Pakistan." Hindus like me are derided as "anti-national."

I have been called that myself. In 2015, speaking in parliament, I repeated a friend's observation: in BJP-ruled India, it is safer to be a cow than a Muslim. Sadly, that rings even truer today.

As disturbing as these trends are, they should not be surprising, given that senior political figures express their bigotry openly. Modi once declared that antigovernment protesters could be identified by their clothes—that is, traditional Muslim attire. And prior to the 2019 general election, BJP President Amit Shah called Bangladeshi Muslim immigrants "termites" and pledged that a BJP government would "pick up infiltrators one by one and throw them into the Bay of Bengal." Islamophobic sentiment is stoked further via social media, often in BJP-curated WhatsApp groups, where the

women), religious conversion (despite it being permitted by India's constitution), and Muslim practices of marriage, divorce, and alimony (which are viewed as incompatible with women's rights). A popular apparel firm was browbeaten into withdrawing an advertising campaign deemed by zealots to be inserting Muslim elements into the Hindu festival of Diwali. A Muslim religious gathering was deemed a Covid-19 super-spreader event, even as the far larger Hindu Kumbh Mela festival was allowed-even encouragedto proceed.

The BJP government also enacted a law

What the racism scandal of English cricket tells us

cricketer Nasser Hussain captained the England team, no one could have imagined that after nearly two decades, the game would be facing a storm of this

magnitude and compel the wider society to confront one of the most sensitive issues: racism. Over the years, England's cricketers of South Asian origin, like Monty Panesar, Ravi Bopara, Moeen Ali and Adil Rashid, who have all shown their on-pitch talents, never talked about racism. But since cricketer Azeem Rafiq's revelation about his sufferings and pain, the issue of racism has now become a subject of much bigger debate around race relations, Islamophobia and division in Britain today. The racial abuses he was subjected to include repeatedly being called a "pa*i," and referred to by the name "Kevin," a dehumanising moniker for black and Asian

The racism scandal that engulfed the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) has finally made them acknowledge that racism and discrimination is a "blight" on their game and they "apologise unreservedly." The apology came after a crisis meeting of the board and representatives from the Professional Cricketers' Association, Marylebone Cricket Club, the National Counties Cricket Association, and the First Class and Recreational County Cricket network. It followed a hearing of the parliamentary select committee on Digital, Culture, Media and Sport on November 16, 2021, where former Yorkshire cricketer

Azeem Rafiq alleged that English cricket was "institutionally racist." The select committee hearing, too, was held hurriedly amid weeks of turmoil over revelations by Rafiq about his harrowing experience at the Yorkshire County Club at subsequent cover-ups.

A joint statement issued after the meeting said: "Azeem Rafiq has shone a light on our game that has shocked, shamed and saddened us all." Making a commitment to publish a "tangible action plan," the statement said: "To Azeem and all those who have experienced any form of discrimination, we are truly sorry. Our sport did not welcome you, our game did not accept you as we should have done. We apologise unreservedly for the suffering you have faced."

Rafiq first spoke out in September 2020, prompting the club to open an investigation the following month. But according to the testimony given before the parliamentary select committee by the former chairman of the Yorkshire Club, Roger Hutton, though the investigation upheld seven of the 43 allegations made by Rafiq, the club's management decided against punishing anyone. It also refused to publish the full report of the investigation that led to further accusations of institutional racism in the club and in the wider arena of English cricket, as the ECB stayed away from intervening in the club's affairs.

The ensuing outrage was so widespread that the ECB's suspension of Yorkshire from hosting international matches at Headingley appeared to be an action too little too late. Sports Minister Nigel Huddleston issued a warning, saying that if the ECB does not "put its house in order" over racism, the UK government might take the "nuclear option" of creating an independent regulator.

Amid the racism scandal, the Independent

Commission for Equity in Cricket (ICEC), on November 9, made an appeal to potential victims of racism and discrimination to come forward with evidence. Media reports suggest that more than 1,000 people have contacted the commission within less than a fortnight. Few other former players of Yorkshire academy, too, have come forward to speak about alleged racist abuse they suffered at the club. Similar allegations of racist behaviour have emerged at Essex county club, warranting more investigations, and the prospect of more to come looms large.

Some grim statistics, too, came to the fore, which the ECB needs to look into with urgency. In England, the British-Asian community accounts for 30 percent of

recreational cricket at grassroots level, but only to see this drop to four percent at professional level. Another set of figures show that about a quarter of top-level players are members of the families of former cricketers, which critics say is reflective of elitism in the game, instead

Once again, businesses have shown extraordinary courage and stance against racism, which is similar to those actions taken during Black Lives Matter (BLM) movement. Yorkshire Club's primary sponsor Emerald Publishing and Yorkshire Tea announced that they were ending their deals with the club. Leisure club operator David Lloyd said his business had chosen not to reinstate its partnership, and Tetley's beer said its

sponsorship would not be extended beyond the end of the current contractual agreement. Yorkshire's kit supplier, global giant Nike, also announced that it would stop supplying kits. Losing so many sponsorships and the right to host international matches at its home ground, Headingley, forced the club management to step aside and welcome the new chairman from ethnic minority community.

Nasser Hussain, who currently works as a Sky Sports commentator, says that the problem is far more widespread than Yorkshire. In his Daily Mail column, he wrote: "[Racism] is prevalent throughout the game." Explaining the reasons for past silence, he wrote: "And it has not been picked up because it has become the norm. It's been a 'that's what we do' attitude and that has been allowed to fester for far too long. Those constant little digs and comments take their toll and the victims have just been forced to laugh it off because they have to fit in and conform."

The ongoing turmoil in English cricket over racism also reveals the helplessness of players in voicing their grievances against bullying, and the lack of accountability of their powerful bosses. We, in our country, can proudly say that we don't have any trace of racism, but can we claim that there is no bullying? Making players attend political campaigns or often subjecting them to public humiliation are not unheard of. And what about the accountability of cricketing bosses on issues like allegations of match-fixing in domestic leagues? Why does the national team's jersey carry sponsors' branding larger and more prominently than the national identity? Waiting for a whistle-blower is never a good idea for any organisation.

Chinese trade expos are gateways to export opportunities


Bangladesh can take advantage of these expos to expand its export destinations

■ HE South Asian developing countries today face challenges of economic vulnerability due to the Covid-19 pandemic, climate change and the rise of serious geopolitical rivalry posed by emerging military groupings and showdowns. Simultaneously, a rising trend of trade protectionism, with new hidden barriers and deglobalisation in the global market, are restricting the ability of the economic and investment sectors to promote global trade sustainably. In this context, China's open door and cooperation policy offers some opportunities for the region's prosperity and development, resuming economic growth at a faster rate. In order to fulfil President Xi Jinping's pledge to turn the Chinese market into a market for the world—a market shared by all and accessible to all—China has taken a number of concrete steps in recent years, including an all-round opening-up strategy that allows foreign enterprises greater access to the domestic market, and a foreign investment law that ensures a business-friendly environment. At the same time, China has taken new steps to strengthen bilateral, multilateral, and regional cooperation by joining trade blocs such as the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP), and the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), hosting a series of mega trade exhibitions and improving connectivity through the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).

Of them, China Import and Export Exhibition (Canton Fair), China International Import Expo (CIIE), China International Fair for Trade in Services (CIFTIS), China-Asean Expo, China-South Asia Expo, Euro-Asia Economic Forum and Trade Cooperation Expo, Intertextile Shanghai Apparel Fabrics, and China Yangling Agricultural High-Tech Fair are all key exhibitions that will undoubtedly be of great significance to developing economies like Bangladesh. It is expected that Bangladesh's participation in these forums would open vistas of business opportunities and further enhance

bilateral relations and cooperation. According to government data, from January to July in 2021, the overall import-export volume between Bangladesh and China was USD 13 billion—a 58.9 percent increase year on year.

Despite the fact that bilateral trade favours China heavily, Bangladesh has enormous potential that has yet to be realised. Dr MA Razzaque, head of the Dhaka-based Research and Policy Integration for Development (RAPID), conducted a research that showed that Bangladesh could earn USD 25 billion if it could grab only one percent share of China's imports. It should be noted that China imported goods worth USD 2.4 trillion in the 2019-20 fiscal year, in which Bangladesh's share was highly insignificant—just 0.05 percent. In the next 10 years, China is expected to import a total of USD 22 trillion worth of goods. Hence, China's exposition platforms will provide a great opportunity for Bangladesh to explore the vast Chinese market and expand export opportunities, to bridge the bilateral trade gap and increase revenue.

Bangladesh's major export items—readymade garment (RMG) products, leather goods, jute and jute goods, agricultural products, frozen and live fish, pharmaceutical products, plastic, sports goods, handicrafts, and tea—have a strong competitive edge in the international market. But its limited export destinations mainly the US and the European Union—may

put Bangladesh in a more challenging position in future, especially as the US suspended the Generalised System of Preferences (GSP) for Bangladesh in June 2013 and India imposed anti-dumping duty on the export of Bangladeshi jute goods in January 2017 for a period of five years. It should also be noted that there is no guarantee to get into the EU's GSP+ scheme on expiry of the EBA initiative, after Bangladesh officially graduates from the LDC group in 2026 Amid such looming economic uncertainty, the good news is that China has provided duty-free access to 97 percent of Bangladeshi products (a total of 8,256 products) from July 2020. The expos are important ways to learn about Chinese consumer preferences and to tap into the vast market. Participating in these expos, Bangladesh can display and popularise its flagship products and diversify its export destinations as a large number of buyers, entrepreneurs and companies from Europe, America, Australia, Southeast Asia, Middle East, and Africa will be in attendance there. For example, the China-Asean Expo (CAEXPO) could give Bangladesh trilateral trade expansion opportunities to enter markets in China as well as the Association of Southeast

Asian Nations (Asean), which has a combined population of two billion and a GDP of USD 18.5 trillion.

Bangladesh's development-first strategy, a 165-million-strong population, low- cost and skilled labour market, appealing geostrategic location, and investment-friendly policies make it an ideal investment destination. The country needs to highlight its vast investment potential and create confidence in a large number of foreign investors. It is noteworthy that Bangladesh is constructing high-quality infrastructures, such as power plants, bridges, highways, railways, and ports, in collaboration with China. The Bangabandhu Bangladesh-China Friendship Exhibition Centre (BBCFEC) was recently opened in Dhaka, to host export and sourcing fairs throughout the rear, aiming at showcasing Bangladeshi products to new international markets.

In short, the expos offer a platform to understand the Chinese market and China's

development, as well as to make new links with consumers, companies, experts and different technologies which could lead to product specialisation and value addition in order to adapt to the conditions of China, a market with more than 1.4 billion people, over 400 million of whom are middle-income people. In this regard, China can provide technical assistance in framing policy positions and exportdevelopment strategies to help Bangladeshi products reach the Chinese market.

Like Bangladesh, other South Asian countries, too, can use the expos to promote their brands, build new trade images and expand their business opportunities in China and in the worldwide market. Along with economic and commercial gains, such platforms would forge stronger cultural cooperation too, which will further ennance the dilateral relations and promote partnerships for common prosperity.

as many as six changes for this series, handed debut to a new opener, tried out two new opening combinations, shuffled the batting order, among many other things but eventually the side have only generated sorry figures one after

The fact that the paltry score of 127 for seven by the Tigers in the first game remained their top score of the series goes a long way to show that the problems in the batting department are far from being solved. Scores of 47, 23 and 35 in the final five overs in the three games only prove the lack of firepower in the batting order. And that none of the batters were able to score even a fifty in the entire series played on home soil would only add salt to the Tigers' wound.

Now, can someone like the triedand-failed opener Saif Hassan, deemed as a Test specialist, be able to recover from the given nature of exposure, and can the batters undo the fracture in confidence that may induce from a home series whitewash? Can 'the process' be trusted when the evidences continue to speak otherwise?

On the face value, Bangladesh team management always seem to have answers to most bad patches they encounter. However, this time it looks like the nature of question has morphed by the time they began answering as the Tigers find themselves at a worse state from where they had started to regroove.

The Mahmudullah question

The body language of any sports team on the field is a good indicator of where the side stands mentally and from the beginning of the recently concluded World Cup, Bangladesh side have painted a picture of falling heads and dropping shoulders. Coming into the T20I series at home against Pakistan, the crisis appears to have deepened with captain Mahmudullah Riyad unable to facilitate the mental changes that are basic in the modern game.

A dramatic last over from the skipper, where he bagged three wickets, had added some spark to the dead rubber in the third T20I against Pakistan at the Sher-e-Bangla yesterday but the game in reality was well over before that point as the Tigers ended up succumbing to their first T20 series whitewash at home since 2018 against Sri Lanka. The last time that it happened was also under Mahmudullah's leadership and not much change has come in the attitude or acceptance of such difficult situations.

Yesterday's last over saw Mahmudullah marshalling his troops with more vigour than had been seen in the series so far, imbued by the two wickets of Sarfaraz Ahmed and Haider Ali off back-to-back deliveries. However, Mahmudullah's involvement on the field, when the team has found itself in difficult situations, has been puzzling since the series wins against Australia and New Zealand at home. It is easier to lead when there is momentum but team leaders need to galvanise others when the chips are down.

"Yeah, it's a little heartbreaking. We got close but unfortunately it didn't happen for us," Mahmudullah dictated with a dejected smile following the match yesterday.

dropped from the third T20I, his response reminded of how he dealt with the Mushfiqur Rahim question: "The team management will be able to answer it well."

Mahmudullah, since the beginning of the Pakistan T20 series, has worn the expression of a man forced to carry a burden that he does not agree with. The vacant smile, answering media questions vaguely only because he has to answer for the sake of answering, were noticeable. When he refers to team management, the obvious question would be whether he is part of that management as the skipper. Whether or not he agrees with the selection, as the on-field captain, it was his duty to uplift players lacking confidence but his own submission has made things difficult. That he was not accountable on selection matters was made clear

However, accountability has to be there. Even against sides like Scotland and Oman at the World Cup, the team's body language was one of despair at crunch times and Mahmudullah himself looked the most disheartened.

"If we could win one or two matches, the confidence level would be higher. The dressing room was spirited during Australia and New Zealand series. Obviously when you lose, it creates doubt. The boys tried hard," the skipper said regarding where his side is at the moment.

A side cannot however always have winning momentum, but the lack of involvement and positive body language that results in a defeatist mentality is more damaging than losses. At this rate, would it be unfair to ask whether Mahmudullah sees himself carrying on as captain in the long-term? If he does, does it correlate with When asked about Saif Hassan being the team finding a new way in T20s?

Conte's passion rubs off on Spurs

Antonio Conte's renowned inspirational qualities were in evidence as he fired up Tottenham Hotspur for a 2-1 comeback victory over Leeds United in the Premier

League on Sunday. The former Juventus and Chelsea coach vented his anger from the technical area several times during the first half as his lacklustre team were out-battled by injury-hit Leeds. Boos rang out at halftime with Leeds ahead through Daniel James's close-range effort but Conte earned his money at the break, galvanising his players for a vastly-improved second half in which goals by Pierre-Emile Hojbjerg and Sergio Reguilon earned Tottenham the points to move them up to seventh.

Conte celebrated each goal like a man possessed, spent the closing stages conducting the fans and could hardly contain himself as the final whistle sounded at the end of his first Premier League home game in charge of the club.

"In the first half we struggled. Physically, tactically and in our intensity we struggled," Conte said. "I think in the second half we changed things and we wanted to play with the same intensity as Leeds.

"We won the game, we deserved to win. We played attractive football and the crowd was with us."

The match statistics showed that Tottenham were outrun by Marcelo Bielsa's tenacious Leeds in the first half.

But that was reversed in the second half as Spurs showed the intensity Conte has demanded throughout his managerial career. "At halftime the players showed me they could win this game," Conte, who resisted the urge to make any

substitutions at the interval, said. "In the second half I corrected the situation. I look at the stats and Leeds are the best in the league for running. In the second half we beat them in intensity. "I'm pleased with the players, they showed good

personality and in the second half put pressure on Leeds in every part of the pitch. To win this way is good.

Reguilon, who scored his first Premier League goal to snatch the points, epitomised Tottenham's second-half display with an energetic shift up and down the left flank.

"We put in an amazing effort. We are so happy and so, so tired," the Spaniard said. The players, we know we needed to give more in the second half."


first spell at the club under Alex Ferguson.

An event this year missing both Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal, the ATP Finals have proved the breakout stage for tennis' new generation with the Grand Slams still largely beyond their reach.

This first final since the tournament's relocation from London was also the first to feature two players aged 25 or younger since 2005.

An ATP-best 59th win of the season made Zverev the fourth player in tournament history to earn semi-final and final victories do it? We never know."

over the top-two ranked players, and first since Andre Agassi in 1990.

Zverev had halted Djokovic's bid to match Federer with a record-equalling sixth ATP Finals title. He also stopped Medvedev from becoming the first player to retain the trophy since Djokovic won it four times in a row between 2012 and 2015.

It was the third meeting in little over two weeks for Zverev and Medvedev, who beat the German in the semi-finals of the Paris Masters at the start of the month.

Zverev turned the tables on Medvedev to claim his 19th career title, but the 24-year-old is still searching for an elusive Grand Slam triumph after finishing runner-up to Dominic Thiem at the 2020 US Open. "I've kind of succeeded on every single level, there only one thing missing, so I hope I can do that next year," said Zverev.

Medvedev, who shattered Djokovic's dreams of a calendar Grand Slam in New York, believes Zverev can take that next step. "There are a lot of great players who don't have a Grand Slam title," said Medvedev. "You never know where your career is going to go. Some players start to play worse, somebody gets injured, somebody wins 20 Grand Slams.



Europe faces Covid freeze

Austria locks down as cases surge; Australia to re-open borders to students, workers

Austria yesterday became the first country in western Europe to reimpose lockdown since vaccines were rolled out, shutting non-essential shops, bars and cafes as surging caseloads raised the prospect of a third winter in deep freeze for the continent.

Germany will also need tighter restrictions to control a record-setting wave of infections, outgoing Chancellor Angela Merkel was quoted as saying, remarks that erased gains on European stock markets and sent bond yields

With Europe once again the epicentre of the global pandemic, new restrictions and vaccine mandates are expected to spread nearly two years after the first Covid-19 case was identified in China.

"We are in a highly dramatic situation. What is in place now is not sufficient," Merkel told leaders of her German CDU party in a meeting, according to two participants, confirming comments first reported by Bloomberg.

Austria told people to work from home if they can, and shut cafes, restaurants, bars, theatres and non-essential shops for 10 days. People may leave home for a limited number of reasons, such as going to workplaces, buying essentials or taking a walk, reports Reuters.

The Austrian government has also announced it will make it compulsory to get inoculated as of February 1. Many Austrians are sceptical about vaccinations, a view

COVID VACCINATION

15m to get jabs in next 10-15 days

Says health minister

As many as 15 million people will be given Covid-19 vaccines within the next 10-15 days, Health Minister Zahid Malegue said yesterday.

He said this while speaking as the chief guest at an event, organised by the Bangladesh Society of Medicine, in Dhaka for a felicitations programme for new intern doctors.

"We will undertake 2-3 programmes within next 10-15 days and will administer 1.5 crore doses of vaccines. Meanwhile we have been continuing the vaccination campaign in schools and community clinics.

He said nine crore vaccine doses have already been administered so far, making up around 40 percent of the target to inoculate 80 percent of the population.

The government aims to vaccinate around 14 crore people. "The rush for taking vaccines, however,

has declined nowadays," the minister said. Urging people to get the jabs, Maleque said, "Covid-19 is an unpredictable

THE NATION Bangladesh Prime Minister

Tajuddin Ahmed today called upon the people of Bangladesh to turn the current phase of the Liberation War into a decisive one.

In his address to the nation the prime minister stated, "The Bangabandhu, the leader of the Bengalis, is still a captive of the Pakistani generals. We are convinced that the military junta will see reason and free him only when the exit routes of the occupation army are cut. This is what we are now able to do and intend to do. We shall take on the enemy on land, sea and air and force upon General Yahya Khan the moment of truth he has been waiting for."

He asked the willing collaborators to desist from their acts of betraval against the country. "We promise the unrepentant collaborator and his alien master the same fate: death with ignominy," he added.

Tajuddin criticised Nixon's plan for sending a fact finding mission to inquire about the Bangladesh situation and said, "The administration he heads failed to express any horror for the blackest crime of his time, namely, the planned extermination of a million Bengalis or for the brutal uprooting of nearly ten million human beings from their homes. Whatever the US government wishes to achieve through this move, it will not make any

Sweden-based body terms Bangladesh an authoritarian regime in new report

Bangladesh was classified as an "authoritarian regime" in a new report released by the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance, a Swedenbased intergovernmental organisation.

Since 2014, Bangladesh has consistently been ranked as an authoritarian regime. From 2008 till 2014, it was classified as a "weak democracy".

"More countries than ever are suffering from 'democratic erosion'," IDEA said in its 2021 study on the state of democracy, relying on data compiled since 1975. The other years, apart
