## **BGB-BSF** talks can settle small issues

26 percent among the people aged over 30 years," it added.

The survey recommended that a planned approach be taken for the country.

The government had initiated National Eye Care programme in 2005 with a target to reduce blindness by 50

percent aligning with the global target of Vision 2020, aimed at eliminating avoidable blindness around the world.

Dr AHM Enayet Hussain, an ophthalmologist and director general (Medical Education) of the Directorate General of Health Services, said, "Blindness decreasing in the country is a great news. Our progress in this regard is very satisfactory. Still there is a concern about impairment of vision, but it is not a threat to public health. We can easily

Globally, three out of every 10 people are living with some forms of visual impairment, which equates to a staggering 2.2 billion people with impaired vision. There are 43.3 million blind people worldwide and another 295 million people with moderate to severe visual impairment. Besides, 258 million people experience mild vision impairment, according to the report.

Gen Rawat, 63, was appointed as India's first Chief of Defence Staff by Modi's government in late 2019. The position was set up with the aim of integrating India's three military services the Army, the Navy and the Air Force.

An infantryman with over four decades of military service, Rawat served along India's border with China, the disputed Kashmir region and on a United Nations mission in Africa. before taking charge of the Indian army in late 2016.

He left behind two daughters.

Gen Rawat and his wife will be cremated in Delhi Cantonment tomorrow. Their mortal remains are expected to arrive in the national capital in a military plane by this evening, reports TOI.

# Submit report

Court directs PBI

A Dhaka court yesterday asked the Police Bureau of Investigation to submit its report by December 28 in the case filed over the rape and murder of college student Munia.

Bashundhara Group Managing Director Sayem Sobhan Anvir and seven

Dhaka Metropolitan Magistrate Begum Yasmin Ara passed the order after Investigation Officer Golam Moktar Ashrafuddin, also an inspector of PBI, failed to submit the report yesterday, said court sources.

With the latest, PBI took four dates but was yet to complete the probe report. Earlier on November 21, the same court asked PBI to submit the report by yesterday.

the group's Chairman Ahmed Akbar Sobhan alias Shah Alam and six others were accused of assisting Anvir in committing the offence.

The six others are Shah Alam's wife Afroza Begum, Anvir's wife Sabrina Sayem, model Faria Mahbub Piyasha, Saifa Rahman Mim, Ibrahim Ahmed

Ripon and his wife Sharmim. The High Court on September 29 refused to grant anticipatory bail to Anvir in the case.
