UN unanimously adopts Bangladesh's resolution

BSS, Dhaka The United Nations General Assembly has unanimously adopted Bangladesh's flagship resolution on the "Culture of Peace".

Permanent Representative of Bangladesh to the UN Ambassador Rabab Fatima introduced the resolution at the UNGA on Thursday, according to a press release received here yesterday.

US court rejects Trump bid to keep Capitol riot documents secret

AFP, Washington A US federal appeals court on Thursday rejected former president Donald Trump's bid to prevent the release of White House records relating to the January 6 attack on the Capitol.

Congress, sought to exercise his privilege as a former president to keep the documents and phone records that might relate to the attack a secret.
