AUDIT REPORT ON FAREAST INSURANCE Over Tk 2, 100cr embezzled

Fareast Islami Life Insurance allowed its former chairman and directors to commit serial financial crimes and siphon off policy holders' funds worth more than Tk 2,100 crore between 2010 and 2020, found an audit recently.

The audit was commissioned by the Bangladesh Securities and Exchange Commission after receiving allegations that the insurer has failed to meet customers' claims and matured policyholders' payments.

After receiving a primary audit report from A Wahab & Co. Chartered Accountants, the BSEC in August restructured the Fareast Life board by appointing 10 independent directors.

The commission already directed the Central Depository Bangladesh Ltd (CDBL) to freeze all shareholdings into Fareast Insurance and other listed companies by specific individuals, their families or entities under the control of the individuals.

The directors embezzled the funds by showing manipulated prices while buying land, investing in their own companies and providing advances to fraudulent cooperatives, the special audit found.


It is evident that the procurement of land by the insurer at artificially high prices were all designed to launder corporate cash by a group of directors notably including Md Nazrul Islam, former chairman, said the BSEC in a letter to the finance ministry on November 24. Say experts, think the move doesn't mean US giving up on Bangladesh

The US on December 10 imposed sanctions on Rab and its seven current and former top officials on human rights grounds.

The move came just days after the superpower dropped Bangladesh from the list of invitees to the Democracy Summit on December 9-10.

The two events have triggered concerns within the government, with officials remaining in a mode of denial.

Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen said the following day that the government has no information corroborating the US statement that Rab and other law enforcement agencies are responsible for 600 disappearances since 2009 and nearly 600 extrajudicial killings since 2018, as well as torture. A Noakhali court yesterday sentenced 13 people to 10 years' rigorous imprisonment over the gang rape and torture of a woman in the district's Begumganj upazila last year.
