

On November 28, the Law Minister Anisul Huq told parliament that Khaleda is now free as she is not in government custody.

He also said as Khaleda was temporarily released under Section 401 of the Criminal Code of Procedure based on some conditions, including not leaving the country, there is no provision in the law to allow her to go abroad now until she submits a fresh petition after returning to jail.

BNP leaders and pro-BNP lawyers, however, have long been arguing that the government has the unlimited authority to take any decision in this regard under Section 401.

"Many incumbent chairmen became unpopular in their respective unions because of their misdeeds during their five-year tenure," said an AL central leader, preferring not to be

Besides, AL failed to contain its rebel candidates despite taking measures such as issuing show-cause notices, warnings of punitive actions and expulsions from the organisation. Party leaders think victory of rebel candidates are encouraging the party's grassroots leaders to contest against party nominees.

The results released on Monday showed that ruling party candidates performed poorly in the fourth phase compared to the previous three

In the third phase UP polls, AL's poor results in Bhanga and Charbhadrasan upazilas were also due to the conflict between incumbent MP Mojibur Rahman Chowdhury Nixon and former MP Kazi Zafarullah

Election to 22 UPs were held in Hossainpur, Katiadi and Bhairab upazilas under Kishoreganj, which is also considered a stronghold of AL, on Sunday and of them AL sponsored candidates were defeated in 13 UPs.

In Katiadi, AL candidates won in only two out of nine UPs.

Voting was held in 21 unions under Sunamganj district where nine AL sponsored candidates lost their security deposit. Ruling party candidates won in seven UPs while party rebels achieved victories in six.

Sherpur is also known as an AL bastion. Elections to nine UPs were held in Sreebardi upazila of the district and AL candidates were defeated in seven of them.

Independent candidate Abdul Karim, also a local BNP leader, won as chairman in Bhelua union where ruling party sponsored candidate Rezaul Karim, union unit AL president, finished fourth.

Gauripur upazila Mymensingh, also a stronghold of AL, elections to 10 UPs were held where AL candidates achieved victory only in two while independent candidates won in four nd AL rebels in three. The result of one UP has been postponed.

At least six AL candidates lost their security deposit in 21 UPs under Dinajpur while AL nominees won in a single UP out of 10 in Rangamati.

Although BNP is not participating in the ongoing UP polls, party leaders independently won in 75 UPs, local sources said.

Meanwhile, main opposition Jatiya Party candidates won in six UPs. Besides, Islami Andolon bagged two chairman posts and Zaker Party and Jatiya Party (Manju) won one each.

A Dhaka court yesterday asked police to submit the probe report by January 16 in a case filed against Bashundhara Group Managing Director Sayem Sobhan Anvir.

PBI failed to submit the probe report, court officials said.

On December 8, the same court asked PBI to submit the report by yesterday.

Anvir is the prime accused in the case and Bashundhara Group Chairman Ahmed Akbar Sobhan alias Shah Alam and six others are accused of assisting Anvir.

The other accused are Shah Alam's wife Afroza Begum, Anvir's wife Sabrina Sayem, model Faria Mahbub Piyasha, Saifa Rahman Mim, Ibrahim Ahmed Ripon and his wife Sharmin.

The High Court on September 29 refused to grant anticipatory bail to Anvir in the case.

On April 26, police recovered the body of a 21-year-old college student in a Gulshan flat. Her elder sister then filed a case with Gulshan Police Station, accusing Anvir of abetting suicide.

On July 19, Abul Hasan, officerin-charge of Gulshan Police Station, submitted the final report in the case to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court of Dhaka.

On August 18, a Dhaka court accepted the final report and relieved Anvir from the case.

However, the victim's elder sister on September 6 filed the another case with the Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal-8 of Dhaka, making allegations of rape and murder.

In a letter to Dhaka on December , Washington said Dhaka needs to inform in writing the consent to the Leahy Law for assistance on security cooperation.

The US will need the consent of the countries where the US cooperates on security issues. Bangladesh will need to inform the US government of the security forces that receive the US security assistance and how it will be used.

Bangladesh was asked to respond to the letter by December 15 but Dhaka has now sought until December 31 to give feedback.

"Earlier, we discussed. We did it again today and will do some more work before informing our consent on the law by December 31," Masud Bin Momen said

"We are reviewing the benefits of Bangladesh if we endorse the US law. Also, we are checking if any policy of our law enforcers contradicts the US law," the foreign secretary said.

Bangladesh maintains a "zero tolerance" policy in terms of human rights violation, militancy and other serious crimes, and there is a commonality between that of the US and other development partners, he

"We will hold one more meeting on it before communicating our consent to the law to the US," he said, adding that Bangladesh values the bilateral relationship between Bangladesh and

Asked if any of the Leahy Law provisions contradict Bangladesh laws and context, he said Bangladesh's law and situation would surely get priority.

He said the security assistance that Bangladesh got from the US in the past was not coming under the purview of the law.

"We are working on the language aspect of the law so that our interests are protected," the foreign secretary "The US wants general consent

to the law, but we want to respond by making sure that our interests are protected at the same time," he said. Responding to a question, he said

there was no link between the security cooperation and the US sanctions imposed on Rab and seven of its former and current officials.
