Self-reliant through duck farming

Duck rearing has changed fate of Zahir Beg, once a day labourer at Kathalpara village in Kalapara upazila of Patuakhali, and his wife Asma Begum.

Two years back, they started the farm with only 12 ducklings that they got free of cost from the office of a development agency and they have now 1,000 ducks valued around Tk 4 lakh, said Asma.

Zahir was finding it hard to run his four-member family with his meagre income. One day following the advice of a neighbour, Asma brought 12 free ducklings to home from the office of the

After three months of rearing the ducks, they sold each duck for Tk 400, said Asma, adding that they later bought 300 ducklings at Tk 35 each with Tk 10,000 saved from her husband's income and Tk

5,000 earned from selling the 12 ducks. Duck farming bears good prospect for the couple

Son Al-Amin and daughter Mim Akhter are now studying at Class VI and Class V in a local school, said Asma, adding that she has bought two bighas of cultivable land by rearing ducks.

Like the couple, many people from poor community are earning a good amount by rearing the birds.

Asma said every day her husband Zahir used to take ducks to the Kachupatra river near their house. After finishing her domestic work, she also went there to take care of the ducks.

"Every three months, I sell each duck for Tk 350 to Tk 400. I get more than 200 eggs daily from the farm," she added.

Seeing the success of the couple, many people in the upazila have started duck farming.

Laiju Begum, a housewife from Nowapara area, said it is difficult for her husband to run the four-member family with his meagre income. Later, she started duck farming to earn extra income.

As many as 4,320 ducks have been distributed among 360 poor families in Lalua and Chakamia unions of Kalapara upazila under the 'Assistance for Sustainable Development (ASD)' project run by a non-governmental organisation named Friendship, said its project manager Jewel Hasan.

He added that due to the large number of rivers, canals, ponds and water bodies in the area, ducks can be easily reared. Many people from the poor and disadvantaged communities in Kalapara are becoming self-sufficient by rearing ducks.

Many women in the area are now helping ease the life of their poverty-stricken families by rearing ducks, said Jewel.
