

OMICRON SURGE
India in
community
transmission
stage: report

Omicron, the highly-transmissible Covid 19 strain driving the ongoing third wave of the pandemic across India, is in “community transmission stage” in the country, said a report released yesterday by a consortium of labs of the Indian government.

The government’s Covid research lab, which tracks genome sequencing of various strains of the disease, also said BA.2 lineage, an infectious sub-variant of Omicron, has been detected in India.”

“Omicron is now in community transmission in India and has become dominant in multiple metros, where new cases have been rising exponentially,” said the January 10 bulletin of the Indian SARS-CoV-2 Consortium on Genomics or Indian SARS-CoV-2 Genetics Consortium (INSACOG). The bulletin was made public yesterday.

“Further spread of Omicron in India is now expected to be through internal transmission,” the INSACOG under the Indian Health Ministry said.

India yesterday reported 333,533 new Covid-19 infections over the past 24 hours with 525 dead. On Saturday, India had reported 337,704 new cases and 488 dead.

The government in the statement said the recovery rate for infected people currently stands at 93.18%.

India said it tested 1.87 million people in the last 24 hours and it planned to continue to expand its testing through the country.

‘Puppet regime’ in Ukraine!
Moscow denounce ‘disinformation’ as UK says Kremlin trying to install
pro-Russian leader; German navy chief quits over Putin comments

Russia will face severe economic sanctions if it installs a puppet regime in Ukraine, a senior UK minister said yesterday after Britain accused the Kremlin of seeking to install a pro-Russian leader there.

Britain made the accusation late on Saturday, also saying Russian intelligence officers had been in contact with a number of former Ukrainian politicians as part of plans for an invasion.

The Russian Foreign Ministry dismissed the comments as “disinformation”, accusing Britain and Nato of “escalating tensions” over Ukraine.

Mykhailo Podolyak, a Ukrainian adviser to the presidential office, said the allegations should be taken seriously.

“There’ll be very serious consequences if Russia takes this move to try and invade

but also install a puppet regime,” British Deputy Prime Minister Dominic Raab told Sky News yesterday.

The British accusations, first made in a statement late on Saturday by the foreign ministry, come at a time of high tensions between Russia and the West over Russia’s massing of troops near its border with Ukraine. Moscow has insisted it has no plans to invade.

The foreign ministry said it had information the Russian government was considering former Ukrainian lawmaker Yevhen Murayev as a potential candidate to head a pro-Russian leadership.

The British foreign ministry declined to provide evidence to back its accusations.

The British claims came after the top US and Russian diplomats failed on Friday to make a major breakthrough in talks to

resolve the crisis over Ukraine, although they agreed to keep talking.

Russia has made security demands on the United States including a halt to Nato’s eastward expansion and a pledge that Ukraine will never be allowed to join the Western military alliance.

Meanwhile, Germany’s new government was facing pressure to get tough on Russia, after a German navy chief’s pro-Moscow remarks angered Kyiv.

The spat was triggered by German navy chief Kay-Achim Schoenbach’s musings that it was “nonsense” to think Russia was about to march on Ukraine and that President Vladimir Putin deserves respect.

In New Delhi, Schoenbach, speaking in English, said Putin seeks to be treated as an equal by the West. Schoenbach resigned late Saturday but the damage was done.

IS-Kurds battle toll
in Syria crosses 120



At least 120 people have been killed in Syria including seven civilians as battles between US-backed Kurdish forces and Islamic State group fighters raged for a fourth day, a war monitor said yesterday. Fighting began late Thursday with an assault by more than 100 IS insurgents on the Kurdish-run Ghwayran jail in Hasakeh city -- which housed the largest number of jihadists in the country -- marking the group’s most significant operation since its “caliphate” was declared defeated in Syria nearly three years ago. According to the Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights at least 77 IS members and 39 Kurdish fighters, including internal security forces, prison guards and counter-terrorism forces have been killed so far.

Covid curbs: NZ PM
cancels her wedding

New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Arden has cancelled her wedding as the nation imposes new restrictions to slow the community spread of the Covid-19 Omicron variant, she told reporters yesterday. “My wedding will not be going ahead,” she told reporters, adding she was sorry for anyone caught up in a similar scenario. Arden had not disclosed her wedding date, but it was rumored to be imminent. New Zealand imposed mask rules and limit gathering from midnight yesterday after a cluster of nine Covid-19 Omicron cases showed community spread from the North to South islands after a wedding.



South Korea pays
Iran’s UN dues

Iran is expected to regain its vote in the UN General Assembly after South Korea paid Tehran’s delinquent dues to the world body with frozen Iranian funds in the country, South Korea said yesterday. Iran had regained its UN voting rights in June after a similar payment, but said this month it had lost them again because it could not transfer the funds to pay its dues as a result of US sanctions. Release of Iran’s frozen funds requires the approval of the United States, which joined its European allies this week in saying only weeks remain to salvage the 2015 Iran nuclear deal.

Although making progress, shortage and maldistribution of doctors is critical. There are only 1.1 doctors per 10 000 population in rural areas, compared to 18.2 per 10 000 in urban areas.
