Abahani, Saif slide off to winning starts

Both title contenders Abahani Dhaka and Saif Sporting Club notched identical 1-0 wins in their opening fixtures of Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) vesterday.

A first-half strike from Dorielton Gomes helped Abahani edge past Muktijoddha Sangsad at Shaheed Ahsan Ullah Master Stadium in Tongi while a stoppage-time strike from Emery Bayisenge saw Saif beat Bangladesh Police at Birshreshtha Fl. Lt Matiur Rahman Stadium in Munshiganj.

Abahani, following successive triumphs of Independence Cup and Federation Cup, initially struggled a bit in the midfield without their Brazilian playmaker Raphael Augusto. And even though the Sky Blues had threatened from both flanks but on a rain-soaked pitch, their forwards, the likes of Brazilian Dorielton, Rakib Hossain, Nabib Newaj Jibon and Colindres had struggled to maintain balance in the attacking third.

Muktijoddha, on the other hand, launched a couple of sporadic counterattacks early but failed to dismantle the Abahani backline, comprising Iranian defender Milad Sheikh, Tutul Hossain Badsha, Sushanta Tripura and Nurul Nayeem Faisal.

It was the Costa Rican Daniel Colindres who came close to breaking the deadlock at first, as his drive came off the crossbar, before Dorielton put Abahani ahead by tapping in a well-judged cross from Nurul Nayeem Faisal in the 12th minute.

Muktijoddha tried to hit back immediately and came tantalisingly close to equalising when Japanese Tetsuaki Misawa released a defence-split pass for Egyptian Ahmed Ayman but the forward somehow drove his shot wide from inside the box.

Again, Misawa played a decisive pass for his compatriot Soma Otani inside the box but Abahani goalkeeper Shahidul Alam Shohel denied Otani by recovering the ball from his feet in the 28th minute.

Two minutes later, Muktijoddha goalkeeper Mohammad Razib denied Abahani by diving on his left to grab a goal-bound header from Milad Sheikh while Muktijoddha were frustrated again as Misawa's flick came off the crossbar in the 34th minute.

Batting heroics from Ariful Islam, once again, was not enough for Bangladesh as the defending champions lost the seventh-place play-off encounter against South Africa and ended their disappointing ICC Under-19 World Cup campaign in West Indies on Thursday.

Ariful's second century of the tournament, and that too in succession, did drive Bangladesh to amass a fighting total of 293 for eight, their tournament-highest by a margin. But South African young sensation Dewald Brevis, also known as 'Baby AB', countered with a ton as well to successfully chase the target for his side with two wickets and seven balls to spare.

Previously, Bangladesh had kick started their campaign with a thrashing seven-wicket defeat against England, in which they were bundled out for a mere 97 runs.

Still, Rakibul Hasan and his troop featured in the quarter-final as runners up from group A, after having comfortably beaten, as expected, the two associate nations - Canada and the UAE.

But batting, the predictable culprit, let Bangladesh down against India in the quarterfinal. The young Tigers were all out for a dismal 111, eventually leading them to a five-wicket defeat


"Obviously, we didn't want to finish eighth in the tournament

However, in the end, a premier youth competition ideally becomes more about unearthing potential world-class talents, ones that can likely serve the nation in the long run. Thus, it can be argued that the salvation of this bleak campaign has somehow, and rightfully, clung to Ariful's consecutive centuries against Pakistan and South Africa. Indeed, the right-hander had punched well above his weight, showing great maturity and potential for the national side in the coming days.

Furthermore, pacer Ripon Mondol could be considered as the only worthy member of Ariful's supporting cast, as the right-arm seamer scalped 14 wickets in six games and remained handy with the bat in the latter stage of innings.

Which is why selector Sazzad finds the duo to be the biggest, if not the only, takeaway in an otherwise gloomy campaign.
