





Be careful next time you take a Messenger chat screenshot

Mark Zuckerberg, CEO of Facebook and its parent company Meta, recently announced a brand new feature for Messenger end-to-end encrypted chats. In this update, if someone takes a screenshot of the disappearing message, the other person will get a notification.

According to the screenshot shared by Zuckerberg, the encrypted chat will show a notification inside the chatbox whenever a screenshot is taken, and include the name of the user who took the screenshot. This feature can be used only after activating disappearing messages, in which messages will be removed 12 hours after they have been seen.

The announcement was made on 27 January on Zuckerberg's official Facebook page. In the post, Zuckerberg further added that reactions, stickers



and GIFs, which are commonly used features in regular Messenger chats, will be added to Messenger end-to-end encrypted chats as well. Encrypted chats were added to both Facebook and Instagram in November 2020, and have been a popular feature among users since.

Unique ID program for online traders launched this week

To bring the e-commerce sector of the country under further regulation, the government is launching Unique Business Identification (UBID) numbers for e-commerce platforms. Traders who operate in the f-commerce industry, meaning any individual or business, small or large, that trades goods and items on Facebook, must also register to get their own UBIDs.

An app, called UBID Apps, has been created to facilitate the registration process. Commerce Minister Tipu Munshi inaugurated the app at the Secretariat on 6 February.

Apart from this, the Central Logistics Management System (CCMS) is also being set up to resolve any grievances against any registered organisation. Preliminary work is also underway to create a digital financial transaction platform called 'Binimoy'. Money can be sent to any bank from any existing mobile financial service providers (MFS) through the 'Binimoy' app.

These two services will also be officially launched in a few weeks. A Central Logistics Tracking Platform (CLTP) will also be launched soon after CCMS and 'Binimoy'.

Rockstar announces Grand Theft Auto 6



Rockstar has confirmed that it is working on a new Grand Theft Auto, GTA, game. In a recent Grand Theft Auto community update post, a Rockstar spokesperson wrote, "We are pleased to confirm that active development for the next entry in the Grand Theft Auto series is well underway. We look forward to sharing more as soon as we are ready, so please stay tuned to the Rockstar Newswire for official details."

Rockstar hasn't revealed much about the game itself as of yet. According to previous reports, the initial version of GTA 6--if it's called GTA 6--may be smaller than GTA 5, with updates used to improve it over time. According to other reports, the game will be set in a Miami-inspired Vice City.

Rockstar patented a new NPC navigation system last year, which some believe will be used in the next GTA. The system is intended to create more lifelike road users and more realistic traffic behaviour, among other updates.

Unilever is transforming the way it does business

The local FMCG company Unilever Bangladesh Ltd (UBL) is known for its wide brand portfolio, which includes brands such as Sunsilk, CloseUp, Lifebuoy and Dove. Recently, Unilever



has branched out by introducing a transformative change in its operations through the app Lever Bazar.

Lever Bazar is a business-to-business (B2B) self-ordering digital platform. It is marketed as an e-commerce solution through which retailers can easily place their orders without waiting for company representatives. Lever Bazar is intended to make the product ordering processes easier and more accessible for thousands of retailers from the most remote, rural and urban areas of the country.

I was panic-stricken when our stock was almost running out and the sales representative couldn't visit us in that particular week due to the strict lockdown," said Uzzal Mia. The shopkeeper also added that the app can be translated into Bangla, which makes it much easier to use for those lacking proper English education.



Engine placement is one of the more crucial elements when it comes to automobile design. It can affect the handling, cabin space, cooling necessities and weight distribution of the automobile. Commonly, when it comes to four-wheelers, there are three configurations of engine placement: front, mid and rear-engined. Each type comes with a unique setup and a set of characteristics that make it good for some applications but bad for others. Let's break down what each engine placement is useful for and why they are used.Frontengined cars

As we all know, a little over 90% of cars have a front-engined layout. Why? For starters, they are mostly front-wheeldrive (FWD) cars. So it makes sense to have the engine over the front wheels for more traction, to make it more forgiving to steer for run off the mill econoboxes. This makes the vehicle stable while maintaining a balanced weight distribution when accelerating.

However, FWD front-engine cars often suffer from understeer as they lose traction when accelerating, due to the weight of the car being shifted to the rear wheels. It's still a very efficient way to get the power down, since the distance from the engine to wheels is short, which minimises losses through rotational components. They are also very efficient due to easier and more effective cooling.

The engine in the front offers more space in the cabin, which makes the vehicle more comfortable for passengers. This is relatively safer than other engine placements due to the crumple zone being longer when compared to the rear and mid-engined cars. The engine in the front will also, more likely, absorb more

impact in an event of a collision. The front of the cabin is often larger than the rear and when properly designed can provide plenty of room for engine work. Although, many modern cars' engine bays are cramped with new technology. Rearengined cars

The world's first car was rear-engined but in the modern world, these cars are hard to come by - unless you are on a racetrack. The cars with a rearengine layout are often rear-wheel-drive (RWD), as having an engine on top of the driven wheels at the rear provides more accelerative traction. Not only will the accelerative traction be good from a standstill because of the weight distribution at the rear end but also will have a greater grip as the car accelerates when the weight is shifted to the back of the car. This allows the rear-engined cars to strongly accelerate without losing out the tires.

However, that same power to the back wheels can cause problems as the rear tends to snap out. These cars are prone to a lot of oversteers since the power and weight in the back will tend to shift to the front. Oversteering is not easy to fix as understeering in FWD cars. But with the right chassis and suspension tuning. these sports cars can be amazing to drive, like the Porsche 911.

When it comes down to braking performance, these cars provide the best among the setups mentioned. When decelerating, the load is transferred to the front wheels. Rear-engined cars tend to have a weight distributed towards the backend, and this load tends to even out between the front and rear axles, which allows for optimal braking.

Having the engine in the back of


the car usually moves the passenger compartment forward, reducing the crumple zone, which can be more dangerous compared to front-engined cars. The front of the car in this case is usually used for small cargo space.Midengined cars

Mid-engined cars are self-explanatory for the most part, where the engine sits in between the front and rear axles of the car. Cars with this layout are said to have the best handling among the setups, as the weight distribution tends to be in a more neutral position. By putting the engine close to the centre of the car, engineers balance the front and rear weight putting out equal traction on four wheels. Since its mass is in the centre of the car, it tends to be nimble, more agile and less resistant to rotation, making the cars incredibly stable in corners.

Cars with this layout will have a much more even weight distribution under deceleration compared to front-engined cars. The rear tires can perform a major portion of the braking, ultimately allowing for better stopping distances as the tires are evenly weight distributed. This also helps disperse the heat from deceleration better across four brake discs, thus reducing brake fade.

As good as mid-engined cars sound, it comes with a couple of drawbacks. The cabin space is very small as the engine is located where the back seat of a car should be. If by any chance you ever lose control of such a vehicle and once it starts to spin, it will be hard to stop as the centre of gravity is low with a mass that is distributed at the centre of the car. Still, most supercars and hypercars follow this layout for the best control of the car.

DAREU A87 (DREAM/ SWALLOW/ SUMMER)

SUMMER) Price: Tk. 5,800/-

Switch: Cherry MX Blue/Brown/Red The design of Dareu A87 is genuinely aesthetically pleasing. It comes with unique color schemes and themes that change the eloquence of any setup. Even the packaging of the keyboard is outstanding. The Dareu A87 comes with PBT keycaps that are known for higher resistance in wear and comes with high-quality Cherry MX switches that are often considered one of the best-manufactured switches in the current market. There is no RGB lighting, only LED lights, but still perfectly complement the aesthetics of the rest of the design. If you are looking for a stunning keyboard, this is definitely recommended.

SKYLOONG

SK64S Price: Tk. 5,600/-Switch type: Gateron Optical Switch Blue/Brown/Red Our pick for the top compact gaming keyboard goes to Skyloong SK64s. With its compact 60% layout, this hot-swappable keyboard comes with the N-Key Rollover feature, allowing many keys to be pressed simultaneously. The keyboard's optical switches also make it a good pick for gamers who do not prefer mechanical switches. This

keyboard is fully

programmable, so the switches can be adjusted however you want. If you prefer your keyboard to take up less space in your gaming setup, consider this as a good option.



RK84

Price: Tk. 4,800/-

The RK84 is a popular choice for customisation. This is a great pick for enthusiasts who do not want a barebone kit and build a keyboard from scratch but looking for a well-built quality keyboard that can be customised. The keyboard has good ergonomics - the magnetic padfoot makes it easier on the user's hand. The RK84 hot-swappable switches allow the swapping of three pins and five pins. For gaming where latency matters less and you want to try wireless gaming, the RK84 is a good option to consider thanks to its three-mode connectivity, including a 2.4 GHz dongle for convenience.

KEYCHRON C1 Price: Tk. 6,500/-

For Tenkeyless (TKL) layout lovers, the Keychron C1 is a good choice. This keyboard is a balance for those who are into light gaming but also wish to use the same keyboard for professional work purposes. The KT87 has an excellent build quality that is very durable, fully customisable and makes it a solid pick for anyone considering a safe bet on gaming keyboard choices.


DRAGON ANYWHERE

Improv on its toes: Murderville

Regular viewers of Saturday Night Live (SNL) know that SNL sketches like Debbie Downer or The Californians maintain viewership thanks to the crew's consistent improvisation capabilities. Netflix's new crime-solving improv show Murderville allows viewers to get a taste, albeit acquired, of improv in a six-episode season.

Terry Seattle (played by Will Arnett) is a loose cannon homicide detective who just can't seem to keep a partner. Struggling to get over his divorce with the police chief Rhonda Jenkins-Seattle (played by Haneefah Wood), Terry is assigned a new murder case and a new celebrity detective partner each episode. The catch - these celebrities do not have a script to follow and have to improvise their way out of the ordeal. There are obvious and not-soobvious clues carefully placed throughout the scenes and at the end of each episode, the guest stars have to piece the clues to find the real murderer.

Murderville is the US adaptation of the award-winning British comedy Murder in Successville. Creator Krister Johnson intended to deliver a cross between a comedy reality show and a large-scale prank for the celebrities involved, though the success is debatable. Will Arnett deserves special credit for maintaining the arduous task of keeping a straight face and carrying on with the script even during the most ridiculous moments. The guest stars have to combat the gruelling situation Terry puts them through, with only their improv skills to keep the show's comedy quotient up.

Improvising is a skill few can do masterfully. The first guest star of Murderville, Conan O'Brien, who has many years of comedy under his belt, obviously has more experience at comedy improv than the established. yet relatively inexperienced in comedy, actress Annie Murphy. Scenes tend to quickly devolve if there aren't enough prompts and castmates who know how to read the room. However, there are still some hysterical moments that look as smooth as scripted comedy, such as the unexpected chemistry between Will Arnett and NFL star Marshawn Lynch in the second episode's introduction scene.

It is this chemistry that makes or breaks this show. Guest stars Kumail Nanjiani, Annie Murphy and Sharon Tate were more muted as Terry's partners. Will Arnett had to do most of the work to keep the show a



'comedy', and in most of the episodes, he tries his best to fling random lines at his guests - to which the replies range from hilarious to cringe.

Murderville works because of Arnett's adaptability and whimsy, but it also because of good celebrity casting, which stops the show's generally predictable gags from becoming tedious. Each celebrity reacts to Terry's shenanigans differently so it is a surprise for the viewers each episode. Some of the scenes are funny because of how ridiculous the situations are created to be. There are even scenes where both Arnett and the featured guest star could not contain their laughter - such is the ridiculousness of some improvised scenario.

The episodes follow the same formula: having exactly three suspects each episode, detective Terry getting in the way of the interviews and an undercover scene where Terry gets the guests into trouble. Due to the repetitiveness, there are times the show feels repetitive and tiresome. How much of the show is unscripted? How do they know which questions to ask? In an interview with Yahoo Entertainment, creator Krister Johnson confirmed that the guest stars are only given story points and signposts to work with. These signposts are placed to ensure the guests see the important clues and are actually able to solve the murder.

TO-DOLIST

According to the creator, the show's unscripted components include a lot of scripted moments, but at the heart of it, it is still the guest stars who drive the show forward. They are at the crux of Murderville's improvisation. The rest of the cast has to improvise according to the guests' reaction, and sometimes, the accompanying cast is the best part of a scene.

Murderville is a show that requires minimum to zero brain effort to enjoy. Improv is not everyone's cup of tea and Netflix is testing grounds to welcome new shows that the audiences are not familiar with. While the show is not jam-packed with hysterical jokes and sometimes the awkwardness of bad lines is palpable, the natural zaniness of the guests shines throughout the six episodes released so far.

Yes, this is not a genre-defining or lifealtering show that the viewers are going to remember for a long time. But this is still a sweet, short and easy watch to unwind to after a long day.
