Jacks bails out Chattogram

Will Jacks smashed a cracker of a match-winning innings and helped his side qualify for the playoff stage as Chattogram Challengers beat Sylhet Sunrisers by four wickets in the day game of the Bangabandhu Bangladesh Premier League at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur yesterday.

Chasing a competitive 186-run target set by Sylhet, Jacks played his career-best T20 knock and remained unbeaten on 92 off just 57 balls. The Englishman featured four sixes and five fours as Chattogram eventually reached their target with five balls to spare.

With five wins in ten matches, Chattogram finished the group stage with ten points and occupied the third spot after Fortune Barishal and Comilla Victorians had already confirmed the top two spots for the Playoffs.

Earlier, Sylhet posted a fighting total of 185 for 6, riding on quick-fire forties from Lendl Simmons and skipper Ravi Bopara while Mosaddek Hossain remained not out on 35 off 22 balls. Left-arm seamer Mrittunjoy Chowdhury bagged three wickets while Shoriful Islam and Mehedi Hasan Miraz each took a wicket for Chattogram.

Jacks, who struck his fourth fifty of

the tournament, informed he was wary of the situation where he had to play a responsible knock if Chattogram wanted to qualify for the last four.

"We obviously had a great win today [yesterday] and we needed a bit of emotion to get the momentum carried forward and play good cricket. We've qualified for the top four and would've been happy if we were in the top two," said Jacks after the game yesterday.

"I've come here and done what I wanted to do and I am near among the top run-scorers and it has been great to learn about the Bangladeshi pitches and challenge myself in different conditions."

first round of the auction for the Indian Premier League on Saturday.

Iyer went to Kolkata Knight Riders for \$1.62 million in the two-day auction in Bangalore.
