An unusual inspiration

Australia all-rounder Ashton Agar has vowed to overcome self-doubt and focus on the joy of cricket after finding his inspiration in an unusual place - a concert by south London rapper Loyle Carner.

Agar is aiming to return to test cricket for the first time since September 2017 after the 28-year-old was named in Australia's squad for the three-test tour of Pakistan next month.

Agar, who played a key role in Tuesday's Twenty20 win over Sri Lanka, said rapper Carner's fearlessness on stage at a Perth concert motivated the Australian to do the same on the cricket field. "He was owning the stage and it was beautiful. I thought, 'This is so cool, he just has such great presence,' and we're all there to watch him," Agar told reporters on Wednesday.

Chattogram lacklustre in penultimate hurdle

Mehedi Hasan Miraz and Akbar Ali, between them, one just cannot get away from the media focus while the latter has not blossomed in the domestic circuit following one of Bangladesh cricket's greatest-ever achievements. Chattogram Challengers' batting has largely been carried by their English stars Will Jacks and Benny Howell throughout the ongoing BPL while other overseas star Chadwick Walton came up with vital runs just when they needed in the first Eliminator game against Khulna Tigers on Monday. Jacks and Walton departed very early in the Chattogram innings during the second Qualifier match against Comilla Victorians yesterday. Thus, the responsibility fell to local stars such as captain Afif Hossain and Shamim Hossain but Comilla's Moeen Ali accounted for both in a tremendous spell as Chattogram slumped to 50 for five in eight overs. From that point, it looked like Chattogram would have no response but it was the duo of Akbar and Miraz, considered by many to be capable of great leadership qualities, that carried Chattogram towards a challenging score. Akbar bided his time initially as he was content on rotating the strike and

consolidating their disastrous starts. Moeen had gotten three wickets in his first two overs, conceding just four runs but Akbar took him on in the Englishman's third over, hitting a well-timed slog sweep to bring his side back into some relief. Next over, Mehedi came to the party as well, swinging his willow to find the boundary at cow corner against

Youngster Mrittunjoy hit two back-to-back sixes off Shohidul to take his side closer to 150-mark before he fell to strange circumstances, caught on the boundary ropes by Hider – who seemed unsure himself initially whether his foot was touching the ropes -- and given out perhaps because onfield umpire had given the soft signal of dismissal.

Bashundhara Kings Arena set for historic debut

The Bashundhara Kings Arena is set to become the first privately-owned football ground to host a match of the Bangladesh Premier League, the top-tier professional football of the country.

Situated in Block N of the Bashundhara Residential Area in the capital and owned by Bashundhara Group, the venue has so far been used to hold practice sessions and friendly matches of Bashundhara Kings, but today this modern facility will go into history books when it hosts the defending league champions against Bangladesh Police.

Although the venue is still a work in progress, at least six months away from becoming what it aspires to be -- a firstof-its-kind private football club with state-of-the-art facilities and certification to stage international matches -- the Kings Arena is already a thing to admire and be proud of.

And certainly proud was Bashundhara Kings president Imrul Hassan, who provided the invited journalists a glimpse of the Kings Arena -- a part of an establishment that promises to be a gigantic sports complex -- on the eve of its BPL debut yesterday.

"We don't have much to be proud of on the international stage. The sports complex would be something we can be really proud of," Hasan said in his speech.

"We will host international matches from next season. This venue will be of a standard to host even World Cup matches. We hope other clubs will be inspired by this and will follow our example," the Kings president added.

According to Hasan and the project officials, the stadium, once completed, will host 14,000 spectators with seating facilities and will have floodlights installed for staging night matches. For the moment, though, only limited spectators will be allowed through invitations for the BPL matches.

And Bashundhara Kings, the twotime defending champions, might as well need all of that support when they host Bangladesh Police today as they are currently fourth in the points table with six points, one behind Abahani and Sheikh Jamal and level with Saif Sporting Club, following three match-days.

Having missed out on the first two domestic titles of the season -- the Independence Cup and the Federation Cup -- the defending champions started with a defeat against newcomers Swadhinata KS before bouncing back with single-goal victories against Uttar Baridhara and Muktijoddha Sangsad KS. Grappling with injuries to key players, the Leviathans of Bangladesh football can definitely allow themselves some breathing space, even if momentarily, with a victory today ahead of Sheikh Jamal's match against Rahmatganj later in the day at the Sylhet District Stadium.

Sunil Narine then hit fifty in the tournament's history to make Chattogram's total look very small.
