11 ZEBRAS' DEATHS High nitrate levels in grass linked: probe

High levels of nitrate in the grass fed to zebras at the Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Safari Park in Gazipur was linked to the deaths of 11 of the animals last month.

A member of the probe committee investigating the deaths revealed this information yesterday after the probe report was submitted on Sunday. The environment, forest and climate change ministry on January 26 formed the probe committee, led by Sanjay Kumar Bhowmik, additional secretary of the

Dr Noor Ali, the committee member and a professor of the pathology department of the veterinary science faculty at Bangladesh Agricultural University (BAU), said the samples of the zebras were tested at the university's pathology and pharmacology departments.

Noor Ali, also the director of BAU Research System, said the park authorities had asked the contractor to supply "tender" grass instead of "mature"grass for zebras since December 18 last

The presence of trace amounts of nitrate was higher than the normal limit in the tender grass, resulting in nitrate poisoning of the zebras, he said quoting the probe

In many cases, the cultivators of the grass use excess doses of urea for rapid growth and in those cases, they have to wait for a few days so that the concentration of nitrate naturally decreases, he said. Since the park authorities wanted tender grass for the zebras, they possibly did not wait long enough, he added.

Another member of the committee said nitrate was not the single cause of the deaths; the concentration of nitrate weakened the immune systems of the zebras, leading to the SEE PAGE 7 COL 1

Russia pours cold water

Says it's 'premature' to organise Biden-Putin meeting; UK claims Russia's plan to invade has 'already begun'

The Kremlin warned yesterday there are no concrete plans for a summit between the Russian and US leaders, as diplomats scrambled to head off the threat of a Russian invasion of Ukraine.

The idea of a meeting between presidents Vladimir Putin and Joe Biden has been championed by France and cautiously welcomed by Ukraine as a way to avert a catastrophic war in Europe.

But Putin's spokesman Dmitry Peskov said: "It's premature to talk about any specific plans for organising any kind of summits" adding that no "concrete plans" had been put in place.

France's President Emmanuel Macron called Putin on Sunday and afterwards his office said that both the Russian and Biden were open to the idea.

The summit would go ahead, however, only "on the condition that Russia does not invade Ukraine."

There is a diplomatic hope," France's minister for European Affairs Clement Beaune told LCI television.

"If there is still a chance to avoid war, to and diplomatic solution, then we need to

take it," he said.

But in Washington, a senior US administration official told AFP: "Timing to be determined. Format to be determined. So it's all completely notional."

Visiting Brussels, Ukraine's foreign minister welcomed the French effort. "We believe that every effort aimed a diplomatic solution is worth trying," Dmytro Kuleba

Kuleba also said the European Union had agreed "in principle" to set up an advisory military instructor mission in Ukraine, but the details have yet to be thrashed out.

Defence Minister Oleksiy Reznikov said there was no sign of Russian forces withdrawing from the border, and that Moscow-backed rebels continue to shell Ukrainian positions.

"Since the beginning of this day, as of 09:00, 14 attacks have already been recorded, 13 of them from weapons prohibited by the Minsk agreements," he told reporters in Kyiv.

Ukraine vesterday firmly denied Russian claims that Russian forces had killed five Ukrainian "saboteurs" who allegedly crossed the border to stage an attack.

Putin told his security council it was

necessary to consider an appeal from the leaders of two breakaway regions in eastern Ukraine for Russia to recognise them as independent.

Putin also said in televised remarks yesterday that the threat to Russia would substantially increase if Ukraine were to

In recent weeks, according to US intelligence, Moscow has massed more than 150,000 troops and sailors around Ukraine's borders in Belarus, Russia, Crimea and the Black Sea, reports Reuters.

A spokesman for UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson told a media briefing yesterday that intelligence reports suggest Putin intends to launch an invasion of Ukraine, reports BBC.

"The intelligence we are seeing suggests that Russia intends to launch an invasion and that President Putin's plan has already begun," the spokesman said.

US National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan said yesterday intelligence suggests any Russian invasion of Ukraine would employ a particularly brutal strategy to "crush" the civilian population.

The foreign ministers of the three Baltic states of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania will travel to Ukraine this week, officials said.

Man's death sparks protest

Family says he was tortured in custody

A man's death sparked protests in Shantiganj, Sunamganj, amid allegations that he was tortured in custody at a police station.

Wazir Mia, 40, of Shatrumardan area, died at Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital yesterday, 10 days after he was released on bail. Grieving family members said he died because police tortured him at Shantiganj Police Station after arresting him in the early hours of February

Villagers later blocked Sunamganj-Sylhet road at Pagla Bazar for three hours, demanding justice for Wazir.

Police said Wazir was arrested on charges of stealing cows.

His brother Dalim Mia said, "He was severely tortured. He was released on bail the next day, but fell ill. We took him to the hospital in critical

Superintendent of Police in Sunamganj Mizanur Rahman said there will be an autopsy and actions will be taken if evidence of torture is
