HINDU LAW HC seeks experts' opinions on inheritance

The High Court yesterday decided to take opinions from some jurists and researchers on the rules of a customary law that deprives Hindu women of inheriting their deceased fathers' properties.

Supreme Court lawyers AM Amin Uddin, Prabir Neogi, Subrata Chowdhury, Md Qumrul Haque Siddique and Tapan Chakrabarty; General Secretary of Bangladesh Hindu Law Reform Council Pulack Ghatack; and a few others have been asked to place their opinions on the issue before the HC as amici curiae (friends of the court).

While hearing a writ petition, the HC bench of Justice Mamnoon Rahman and Justice Khandaker Diliruzzaman also allowed five rights organisations to become an additional party to this case so that they too could place their opinions.

The rights organisations are Bangladesh Legal Aid and Services Trust (BLAST), Ain O Salish Kendra (ASK), Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF), Bangladesh Mahila Parishad (BMP) and Nari

The HC bench also sent the case to the chief justice to constitute a larger bench for hearing and disposing of the matter.

The writ petitioner's lawyer Khairul Alam Chowdhury told The Daily Star that a larger bench of the HC, which will be constituted by Chief Justice Hasan Foez Siddique, will fix a date for hearing the matter.

The larger bench will hear expert opinions from the amici curiae on the issue and that details of the HC order will be known after its written text is released, he said.

Lawyer Sharmin Akhter appeared for the rights organisations during the virtual hearing.

ICC prosecutor for collective efforts

Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court Karim AA Khan QC has laid emphasis on a collective responsibility which can actually help them move beyond talking about justice to delivering it for the Rohingyas.

"We have to work together to achieve justice. That is what required," Khan told reporters at a media briefing at a city hotel, noting that justice is an absolutely essential prerequisite for indicating people and rights.

Expressing satisfaction over the support he received from Bangladesh so far, the ICC prosecutor said he looks forward to working with all in Bangladesh, international community and the Rohingyas so that they can actually move forward.

The ICC Office of the prosecutor is investigating alleged crimes against the Rohingya within the Court's jurisdiction.

The ICC prosecutor, earlier, had a meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and thanked her for her steadfast support for international criminal justice and her continued leadership in quest of accountability.

Bangladeshi ship with 29 on board stuck in Ukraine

A commercial ship of Bangladesh and its 29 crews remained stranded at the outer anchorage of a Ukrainian port because of Ukraine-Russia

The crew members, all Bangladeshis, are safe, said Captain Mujibur Rahman, general manager of Bangladesh Shipping Corporation.

Bangladesh Shipping Corporation owns the 180-metre long bulk carrier MV Banglar Samriddhi that reached the outer anchorage of Ukrainian port Olvia on February 23.

"As the situation deteriorated, we cancelled the plan of loading the cargo from the port and asked the ship master to leave the port immediately and reach international waters," said Captain

But it took some time to get the port clearance and by then all operations at the port stopped due to Russian invasion, he added.
