Acne is a common disorder of the skin involving hair follicles and sebaceous glands. Most teens and young adults -- between the ages of 11 and 30 -- will have acne at some point.

During puberty, hormones increase in both boys and girls causing the sebaceous glands to make more oil. Acne appears when the pores get clogged with the oil and dead skin cells. The clogged pores may further get affected by

Acne can occur anywhere on the body, but it is most common in areas where there are more sebaceous glands. Face, chest, upper back, shoulders and neck are where acne usually

There are various types of acne like whiteheads, blackheads, nodules, pimples, etc.

# Fleeing horror, finding hope

Bangladeshis crossing to neighbouring European countries from war-torn Ukraine looking for ways to move on

Fleeing the horrors of war in Ukraine, Bangladeshis are finding new hope in other European countries.

They had been experiencing the worst time in accessories business and a flat in Kyiv. heir life since the Russian invasion of Ukraine began on February 24. They had to hide in bunkers for hours amid bombings and missile attacks in their neighbourhoods.

Polash Ahmed fled Ukraine on February 26 leaving behind \$250,000 business in Kyiv.

After staying in Poland for three days, he moved to Germany which is issuing resident permits and work permits to Ukrainian citizens.

Polash, who hails from Shariatpur's Naria upazila, had been living in Ukraine for 16 years. He also took citizenship there. Leaving Ukraine was a hard decision, but he had to do it to be

"I am in Berlin now. I have applied for residency and work permits. I am confident that I will have those as I have Ukrainian citizenship. Germany is granting Ukrainian citizens such privileges for up to three years,"he told this correspondent on Thursday.

Polash said he is getting a warm welcome in

"When I went to a petrol filling station, I was asked if I had money. That means they are not even charging those travelling from Ukraine for

He said he left behind his wholesale fashion

Polash, whose wife and two children on a visit to Bangladesh, hoped he would return to Ukraine soon after the war is over.

According to Foreign Secretary Masud Bin Momen, about 1,000 Bangladeshis have so far left Ukraine and taken shelter in other European countries.

Officials at the Bangladesh embassy in Poland said a majority of those who went to Warsaw from Ukraine, left for other European countries in search of better work.

They said taking advantage of Schengen visa, most of them moved to Germany, Denmark, Italy, France and Portugal from Ukraine via

A Schengen visa holder can enter and travel freely within the Schengen zone, and leave from any Schengen member country.

Bangladeshi community leaders in Ukraine said an estimated 2,000 Bangladeshis lived in the European country before the war.

#### Hadisur's body to arrive March 13-14 Says state minister

The body of engineer Md Hadisur Rahman, who was killed in a rocket attack on the Bangladesh Shipping Corporation (BSC) vessel stranded at a Ukraine port, is expected to reach Dhaka on March 13 or 14, said State Minister for Foreign Affairs Md Shahriar Alam yesterday.

Snanriar said and "Hadisur's body has arrived in Moldova from Ukraine. We hope it will reach Bucharest, the capital of Romania by morning."

After some official procedure there, the body will be sent to Bangladesh, he added.

Earlier on Wednesday, the 28 surviving crew members of Bangladeshi ship Banglar Samriddhi, who were stranded in wartorn Ukraine, arrived in Dhaka.

They went from Ukraine to Moldova to reach Bucharest, from where they flew to Dhaka.

## Buzz Aldrin's 1969 moon walk picture sold for \$172,000

More than 70 original Nasa photographs including a celebrated image of Buzz Aldrin's moon walk taken by Neil Armstrong were sold at auction in Copenhagen on Wednesday for more than 155,000 euros (\$172,000).

The Aldrin image, which fetched 5,373 euros, shows the astronaut on the surface of the moon in July 1969 during the first manned lunar landing. It was famously used on the cover of

LIFE magazine. Armstrong, the first man to step onto the Moon, can be seen in the reflection of Aldrin's visor.

A total of 74 Nasa photographs were put up for sale including 26 taken on the Moon during the Apollo missions in the 1960s and 1970s.

"We sold 73 of the 74 photos," the Bruun Rasmussen auction house told AFP.

Put up for sale by a foreign collector who has asked to remain anonymous, the auction house had estimated the collection at almost 190,000

The most valuable item, the first shot of an "Earthrise" photographed by US astronaut William Anders while orbiting the Moon in December 1968 on Apollo 8, sold for 11,800

The last time man set foot on the Moon was in 1972 during the Apollo 17 mission, but Nasa is planning to send astronauts again in 2025-2026.

# WHO says Ukraine acted on its advice

The World Health Organization advised Ukraine to destroy high-threat pathogens housed in the country's public health laboratories to prevent "any potential spills" that would spread disease among the population, the agency told Reuters.

The WHO statement came ahead of a UN Security Council emergency meeting on alleged manufacture of biological weapons in Ukraine at the request of Moscow.

Russia on Thursday accused the United States of funding research into the development of biological weapons in Ukraine, which has faced an assault by tens of thousands of Russian troops since February 24.

Both Washington and Kyiv have denied the allegations, with the United States saying they were a sign that Moscow could soon use the weapons itself.
