Germany in Bangladesh: 50 years of Diplomatic Relationship

This year marks the 50 years of diplomatic relationship between Bangladesh and Germany. In 1972, Germany was one of the first countries in Europe to recognize the People's Republic of Bangladesh. On 4 February 1972, the Consulate General of the Federal Republic of Germany in Dhaka sent a Verbal Note to the Foreign Ministry of the Republic of Bangladesh, which 11 months earlier had declared its independence from Pakistan. Over the past five decades, Bangladesh has achieved outstanding socio-economic development and Germany is delighted to contribute in the process. A strong pillar of our bilateral relationship remains the development cooperation in the areas of climate change, good governance, renewable energy and recently also for the Rohingyas and host communities.

Bangladesh, despite frequent natural poverty, has shown resilience and growth. has been halved since of the highest rates in Asia even pandemic. By 2026,

officially graduate to the status of a Least Developed Country (LDC), and by 2041, the country aims to become a high-income industrialized country (HIC). In order to meet the increased energy demand without harming the environment and climate, Germany supports Bangladesh's efforts to achieve a maximum coverage through renewable energies sharing the experience from our own transition to renewable energies.

It is impressive what Bangladesh has achieved since independence. Germany is the largest trading partner of Bangladesh in Europe and the second largest globally. RMG exports to Germany in FY20-21 stood at \$5.95 billion as against \$6.97 billion in earnings from the US market. Currently, around 65 German companies are working in Bangladesh, particularly in the textile, transport, energy, logistics sectors and the building materials industry. In cooperation with the German company Veridos, Bangladesh has officially entered the era of e-Passports in 2020. BGCCI is one of our partners that promote business between the two countries. Since the beginning of bilateral development cooperation in the 1970s, Germany has provided more than 3 billion EUR in bilateral development cooperation projects in Bangladesh. A special focus is put on improving labor conditions and environmental standards in the Ready Made Garment (RMG) sector. Besides, Germany has helped Bangladesh fight the challenges of Covid-19 by donating vaccines, ventilators and medical masks. Germany also extends its support to the humanitarian crisis in Bangladesh, investing more than 53 million EUR to support the Rohingya refugees and the host communities since 2018. Besides, we are working together with our partners in the EU to find a political solution together with the UN.

The cultural and educational cooperation between Germany and Bangladesh dates back even before their diplomatic relationship. The cultural and educational cooperation is mainly channelled through the Goethe Institut Dhaka that facilitates exchange of literature, music, film, arts and ideas. The cultural and educational cooperation has significantly expanded with more students choosing Germany as their key destination for higher-studies.

After fifty years, the excellent relationship between Bangladesh and Germany continues to reach new heights with deeper and stronger cooperation. Due to its strategic location in the Indo-Pacific region and its growing importance as a strong political and economic actor, Bangladesh today is an important economic and political partner of Germany. We share the same values enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations and numerous international conventions, and we work together for a rule-based international order. Both Bangladesh and Germany are committed to democracy, respect for human rights and the rule of law. As we reflect on our close relationship on the 50th anniversary, it is evident that Germany will continue to remain a committed partner in Bangladesh's development journey in the years to come.
