Apple to sell iPhones via monthly subscriptions: reports

Apple is reportedly launching a brand new subscription-based service in which users can purchase iPhones and iPads. Reports state that this service could launch as early as late this year.

According to reports, this new project by Apple fits their latest goal of moving towards subscription-based services. Services like Apple Music, Apple TV, Apple Arcade, Apple News and Fitness Plus have already secured themselves as successful subscription services, with many of them being sold under the new Apple One bundles as well.

Reports state that hardware-based subscription services for Apple aren't entirely new. From 2019, Apple began a monthly subscription service called

AppleCare which allowed users to extend warranties on their iPhones. Since 2015, Apple have also offered its iPhone Upgrade Program, which added the option to physically exchange Apple devices after a year of periodic payment.

Reportedly, this new subscription service for buying iPhones will be based on a monthly cost, the amount which is unconfirmed as of yet. Reports suggest this service will also allow users to upgrade existing hardware to newer releases, and would likely be tied to only one specific Apple ID. It is currently unconfirmed whether AppleCare and Apple One services will be included in this new subscription service as well.



Tesla Inc Chief Executive Officer Elon Musk is giving "serious thought" to building a new social media platform, the billionaire said in a tweet on 26 March.

Musk was responding to a Twitter user's question on whether he would consider building a social media platform consisting of an opensource algorithm and one that would prioritise free speech, and where propaganda was minimal.

Musk, a prolific user of Twitter himself, has been critical of the social media platform and its policies of late. He has said the company is undermining democracy by failing to adhere to free speech principles. His tweet comes a day after he

put out a Twitter poll asking users if they believed Twitter adheres to the principle of free speech, to which over 70% voted "no".

"The consequences of this poll will be important. Please vote carefully," he said last Friday.

If Musk decides to go ahead with creating a new platform, he would

be joining a growing portfolio of technology companies that are positioning themselves as champions of free speech and which hope to draw users who feel their views are suppressed on platforms such as Twitter, Meta Platform's Facebook and Alphabet-owned Google's YouTube.

None of the companies, including Donald Trump's Truth Social, Twitter competitors Gettr and Parler and video site Rumble, have come close to matching the reach and popularity of the mainstream platforms so far.

Choosing your undergraduate major concentration: Things to consider

A concentration is a subsection of a major that focuses on a particular topic of study, though not all majors have one. This depends on the curriculum of that specific university for your particular major. As we all know, choosing the concentration of your major is crucial in determining your way forward for both further studies and a future career. However, there is no objective right or wrong choice for choosing a concentration. Instead, many relevant factors should be considered to make the best possible choice for students given their specific requirements.

What interests you more?

Students should choose the concentration of their most interest. Choosing otherwise may lead to mental dissatisfaction that impacts their studies and future job life. A mental projection of whether they would like to continue working in an industry related to their concentration is also helpful.

"Ask yourself where do you want to see yourself in five years or ten years? Then, you may choose the concentration that fits most with your answer," says Dr Shanawez Hossain, Assistant Professor at a country leading university.

What is your strength?

Each concentration requires a unique set of strengths as a priority. This can be quantitative skills, analytical skills, creative writing or anything else. Most students may generally have a strength of their own, and the concentration that aligns with their skills is usually the better choice. "Choosing a concentration where the required skills are something you are good at is highly recommended," says Dr Shanawez. What are the future employability options?

In most instances, a concentration helps to specialise your skills in a specific industry. Therefore, it is essential to consider whether there is ample job opportunity in that industry for you upon completing your studies. It is also important to note that employability is not strictly limited to your chosen concentration.

Instead, it is a factor that increases your possibility of receiving a job letter, given that you have enhanced specialisation in the industry of your concentration. "It is important to research the industry specifics of the concentrations you are considering to make a properly informed decision," says Refat Ara Jerin, faculty at a leading university.

What does your advisor recommend? You should consult with your university assigned advisor before making a final decision. They can offer you expert insights, valuable recommendations and a critical second opinion of your plans ahead. You can also consult with a faculty you prefer more and take into account their advice.

You can start planning early and speak with them at the start of your freshman year (equivalent to the first year). It is recommended that you remain open and honest with them about your vision and preferences so that they may give you advice accordingly.

Is it okay to change your concentration?

Most universities allow you to change your concentration, especially where the open credit system is in practice. However, this decision should be taken carefully, given this means that whatever progress you have made in your previous concentration will become obsolete towards your total credit count. As such, your graduation will be delayed, and there may be financial issues.

So, if you just started on a concentration and have completed only one or two concentration courses, it is okay to make the change since there is less trade-off. However, if you are nearly at the end of a given concentration, and there may be a

couple of courses remaining to complete your concentration courses, it may not be recommended to make the change. "If you have completed more than eighty per cent of your concentration, it is usually not recommended to change it," says Ms Refat.

5 USEFUL TIPS when considering protective gear for your motorcycle

Helmets, gloves, rugged shoes, and a flashy leather jacket - is that all that comes to your mind when considering protective gears for your motorbike? Some bikers don't think they should bother with protective gear when just going for a short ride. But statistics say that you're more likely to face trouble near your home than on a vacation. That's why your best bet is to stick to the old slogan: ATGATT (All The Gears, All The Time).



What are these protective gears you ask? Well, wearing a helmet is mandatory, but there are other crucial ones: protective goggles, ear guards, hand gloves, kneeshinbone-elbow caps, arm guards, jagged boots and protective jackets or bodysuits. Below are some useful tips to consider when choosing the right protective gear for yourself.

Choosing the right helmet

This one can be a bit tricky as there are many options available these days. When deciding on a helmet you should always consider the safety mechanisms, visor efficiency, functionality, weight, air ventilation, locking mechanism, internal

padding materials and of course, style and cost. An ideal helmet should be made of polycarbonatebased material as it is both lightweight and can reliably withstand the impact of a crash. The inner layer should

have a soft foam or clothing piece to keep you comfortable. There should be inlet and outlet air vents at the top of your helmet.

Good visibility is a must, so your helmet must come with an effective visor. There are now anti-sun, anti-fog and anti-glare options available to save you rom further hassles. But the best way to gauge the effectiveness of the helmet you are buying is to wear it and walk outside for some time. If it fits perfectly and ticks all the above boxes, then it's a perfect match!

Finding the appropriate pair of riding gloves

Juman fingers and wrists are extremely ragile and need paramount protection while riding. That's where riding gloves come in. A perfect

pair of riding gloves should be ightweight and resistant to scratch and water. It should fit perfectly on your hands - not too tight or not too loose. The outer layer should be thick enough to protect you but also thin enough for you



trousers Riding jackets are not just for fashion. If there is a serious crash, your risk grave injuries. Riding jackets have internal protective padding on arms, shoulders, elbows, chest, hip joints and backs to protect you from many possible angles of impact. The jacket requires double stitching and sealing, and should perfectly fit you. It is better to get a waterproof one as it will protect you from harsh weather as well. The outer layer is often leather or other tough material

> For biking trousers, you can choose leather or nylon. These days there are denim specifically made for riding motorbikes. You can also opt for a bodysuit in this case. It is advisable to wear reflective jackets during nighttime and bright coloured jackets during daytime as they make you more visible to distant drivers. Things to look for in

your jagged motorcycle boots People often wear casual shoes while riding a motorbike. This can lead

to deadly scenarios in the case of an accident, as your toes and ankles are highly vulnerable to sudden shocks. Motorcycle boots will provide you with traction while protecting your toes at all times. Biking boots are usually

the top preference but you can also opt for biking shoes. Make sure they are strong, comfortable and give you just adequate control over your feet to operate the brake and the gear lever.

Choosing gears The following items are not mandatory but are critical if you are a regular rider.

Back protectors will absorb most of the shock from the crash

and protect your spines, internal organs, bones and nerves. Choose one that fits perfectly under your riding gear.

Knee and elbow guards are often parts of the main protective

gear ensemble According to experts, the knee and elbow joints need extra covering when riding

at high velocity. Most knee protective pads will cover the knees and the shin area. Some cover the thighs. Elbow guards will protect you from a forced fall on your elbows. They

will protect you on uneven and rocky roads in the case of a crash.

Motorcycle insurance can give you a refund if your bike gets stolen or damaged. Some even cover the expenses of other people involved in a crash. But most insurances will cover expenses

for the damage to the bike and to the rider.

Protective gears are strictly relevant for you whether you are riding a motorcycle for the first time or it's been a decade since your first ride. So you simply cannot take this matter lightly. Always research and plan ahead before buying new gear, and remember to replace the old ones once they are worn out



Local ed-tech platform Edutechs raise \$100K in pre-seed funding

Edutechs, an edtech startup based in Bangladesh has raised USD 100K in its pre-seed round, led by serial investor Mohammad Maaz and industrialist F. K. Md. Emdad Khan.

According to a press release, Edutechs aims to bring futuristic advanced
