TEACHER IN JAIL Call for his release gets louder

Calls for freeing Hriday Chandra Mondal, the Munshigani school teacher arrested in a case defaming Islam, are getting louder, with local and global rights organisations yesterday issuing statements demanding

"It is outrageous that a teacher finds himself behind bars simply for voicing his opinion while teaching a class," said Amnesty International in a statement

On March 20, Mondal, an assistant teacher of Binodpur Ram Kumar High School in Munshiganj, was having a conversation with students about the difference between science and religion, during which he is said to have made derogatory comments on Islam.

Two days later, he was arrested after the school's principal filed a case against him.

Teachers should be free to discuss ideas and opinions of all kinds without fear of reprisals, said the London-based nongovernmental organisation.

The detention has set a dangerous precedent, it said, while calling upon the authorities to take urgent measures to improve the conditions that allow people to express themselves freely and safely.

Mondal's detention is "emblematic of a disturbing trend in Bangladesh where the space for free expression is rapidly shrinking" and "a shameful demonstration of the erosion of the human rights situation" in the country, Amnesty added.

Meanwhile, the Bangladesh Legal Aid and Services Trust (BLAST) expressed deep concerns over the incident and went on to demand Mondal's immediate release ensuring his treatment, compensation for harassment and justice.

Mondal has the right to get bail as he has been sued under section 295 (A) of The Penal Code, 1860. If anyone commits crimes under the section, a two-year jail time or fine or both can be applied.

"Considering that ground, it can be said that it is a bailable offence," said the BLAST statement quoting its trustee member ZI Khan Panna, also a Supreme Court lawyer. But his bail petition has been rejected

Over in Shahbagh, a group of academicians, rights activists and social

workers under the banner of "Nipironer biruddhe Shabagh" held a rally demanding Mondal's release.

"We want to take forward the country with the development of science and technology. We want to extend our greetings to teachers like Hriday Chandra Mondal who are discharging their duties properly," said Muhammed Zafar Iqbal, the renowned writer and academic while

He demanded unconditional release of Mondal and withdrawal of the case against

"An evil force is trying to take back the country by misinterpreting the religion we must resist the force to establish a secular Bangladesh," said the rights activist Khushi Khabir.

Ukraine faces 'hard battle' in the east

Says Zelensky, calls for 'firm global response' to rail station attack

Ukraine is ready for a tough battle with Russian forces amassing in the east of the country, President Volodymyr Zelensky said yesterday, a day after a missile attack in the east that officials said killed more than 50 civilians trying to evacuate.

Air-raid sirens sounded in cities across eastern Ukraine, which has become the focus of Russian military action following a withdrawal from areas close to the capital, Kyiv.

After Friday's strike on a train station crowded with women, children and the elderly in the Donetsk region city of Kramatorsk, officials urged civilians in the neighbouring Luhansk region to flee.

Yes, (Russian) forces are gathering in the east (of Ukraine)," Zelensky told a joint news conference with Austrian Chancellor Karl Nehammer in Kyiv.

"This will be a hard battle, we believe in this fight and our victory. We are ready to simultaneously fight and look for diplomatic ways to put an end to this war," Zelensky added.

Russia's invasion, which began on Feb 24, has forced more than 4 the population homeless, and turned cities into rubble.

The civilian casualties have triggered a wave of international condemnation, in particular over the deaths in the town of Bucha, a town to the northwest of Kyiv that until last week was occupied by Russian forces. Russia has denied targetting civilians

in what it calls a "special operation" to demilitarise and "denazify" its southern neighbour. Ukraine and Western nations have dismissed this as a baseless pretext for war.

Nehammer visited Ukraine a day after European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen - visits aimed at underlining the West's support for Zelensky. In another such move, Italy said it would re-open its embassy in Kyiv after Easter.

Friday's missile attack on the train station in Kramatorsk, a hub for or injured thousands, left a quarter of of blood-stained clothes, toys and

damaged luggage strewn across the station's platform.

City Mayor Oleksander Honcharenko, who estimated 4,000 people were gathered there at the time, said that the death toll had risen to least 52.

This is another Russian war crime for which everyone involved will be held accountable," Zelensky said in a video message, referring to Friday's missile strike, whose victims included

"World powers have already condemned Russia's attack on Kramatorsk. We expect a firm global response to this war crime," he said.

Russia's defence ministry denied responsibility, saying in a statement the missiles that struck the station were used only by Ukraine's military and that Russia's armed forces had no targets assigned in Kramatorsk on

Russian state television described the attack as a "bloody provocation" by Ukraine.

The Ukrainian military says Moscow is preparing for a thrust to try to gain full control of the Donbas regions of Donetsk and Luhansk that have been partly held by Mo

NUSRAT MURDER 3yrs on, family awaits 'final justice'

Three years have passed since Nusrat Jahan Rafi, a madrasa student in Feni, was set on fire and killed, but her family's wait for final justice is yet to end due to lengthy legal procedures.

It may take another five years for the final settlement of her murder case at the High Court and then at the Appellate Division, unless the chief justice assigns an HC bench for early hearings on a priority basis, breaking the serial of the hearing of such cases.

The death reference (lower court documents) and the appeals, filed by those convicted in the Nusrat murder case, have been registered with the HC in 2019.

The HC, maintaining its serial, is now hearing and disposing of such documents that were registered in 2018.

Talking the The Daily Star on Friday, the victim's mother Shirin Akter said, "We just want the High Court to hold a hearing and dispose of the case. We are waiting for final justice.

brother Mahmudul Hasan Noman said the government has provided police protection to their family for three years since the incident.

"Three police personnel have been giving us security round the clock... But we are [still] indirectly receiving threats

from fake Facebook accounts. We request the government to keep the police protection until the case is completely disposed of.'

Contacted, Law Minister Anisul Huq on Friday said he will ask the attorney general's office to take necessary steps to hold the hearing of the Nusrat murder case on a priority basis after Eid-ul-Fitr.

Deputy Attorney General Bashir Ahmed said a HC bench led by Justice Soumendra Sarker was ready to hold hearing in last week of March in 2020 but it could not as its functions were halted due to the pandemic.

The then chief justice Syed Mahmud Hossain had earlier assigned the HC bench led by Justice Soumendra Sarker (now retired) for the hearing and disposal, he said, adding that it is uncertain whether the current chief justice will assign another bench for this.

"It will take at least three months for the HC to start the hearing of the case."

On April 6, 2019, Nusrat Jahan Rafi was set on fire by four people under the direction of the then principle of Sonagazi Islamia Fazil Madrasa Siraj ud Daula after she refused to withdraw a rape case filed by her mother against him. The case was filed after Siraj had sexually harassed Nusrat the month before.

After fighting for her life with 80 percent burns on her body, Nusrat died on April 10, 2019. After PM Sheikh Hasina gave priority to

FFWC Executive Engineer Bhuiyan said, "Considering the rainfall, we are forecasting another flash flood by the end of this week.

"Given the water level in the rivers, moderate rainfall will cause huge damage in Sunamganj, Netrakona and

Kishoreganj.' Tara Miah, a farmer Sunamangaj's upazila, said, "Only a few days remaining for the paddy to ripen enough for cutting. If another flood hits, I will lose everything as the nearby levee is in a poor state and cannot take another blow."

To protect the harvest, 520 kilometres of levees

were "We tried hard to protect repaired in Sunamganj district alone spending Tk 120 crore.

However, two large levees one at Chandra Shonar Jagannathpur upazilas. Thal in Dharmapasha upazila and another at upazila broke and thousands of hectares were inundated.

According to the BWDB, all levees are now at risk as they suffered the first blow and may not sustain another.

Mohammad Shamsuddoha, executive engineer of Sunamganj BWDB, said, "We are focusing on protecting the standing levees and mobilising sandbags and other materials to the volunteering farmers to protect all damaged levees."

After the 2017 flash flood that devastated the haor region, the government revised the "Kajer Binimoye Taka Rules -2017" and Arifuzzaman Project Implementation Committees (PIC) formed by the farmers are given authority to construct levees.

According to the policy, all PICs must be formed by November 30 of a year, the repair work is to start by December 15 and to be completed by February 28.

Kashmir Reza, president of Haor O Paribesh Unnnayan Sangtha, said, "The levees are weaker than it should be because they delayed starting the work and hurried to finish them. As the compaction was not properly done, these levees are not holding up the floodwater."
