Deadly cost of freethinking

Verdict over DU professor's murder due tomorrow; families of slain bloggers yet to find closure

Both of them championed the causes of freethought and secularism. And both met the same fate.

They came under machete attacks by extremists near the Bangla Academy while returning from the country's biggest cultural and literary festival, Amar Ekushey Boi Mela.

Scholarly writer and academic Prof Humayun Azad was fatally wounded in a machete attack on February 27, 2004.

Exactly 11 years later, on February 26, 2015, writer-blogger Avijit Roy was hacked to death. His wife Rafida Ahmed Bonya suffered serious stab injuries when she tried to save her husband.

Militants also launched fatal attacks on at least six other secularist bloggers and freethinkers in a similar manner in Dhaka and Sylhet between 2013 and 2016. Four of them were killed within just seven months in 2015.

The motive of the attacks, as police investigation revealed, was to muzzle their secular voice, views and freethinking.

None of the families of the victims have yet got justice as four cases filed over the murder of as many secularist bloggers, including Bangladeshi-American Avijit Roy,

‘I forgive my students, will return to classroom’

Hriday Mondal, the teacher who spent 19 days in jail on charges of hurting religious sentiment, tells *Star*

“I will go back to the classroom and continue teaching my students. Forgiving them for their mistakes and helping them differentiate between right and wrong is my job.”

This is what Hriday Chandra Mondal, maths teacher of Munshiganj's Binodpur Ram Kumar High School, told The Daily Star yesterday, after spending 19 days in jail.

“There are some young, impressionable students who are being led astray. It's my job to tell them what is right,” he also said.

Just weeks ago, Hriday was thrown in jail “for his own safety” after a crowd of locals hurled rocks at his house and beat the door down with stakes.

His son still cannot go to his school. He is being

continuously taunted and bullied. Hriday's wife recently told this daily that they were passing days in fear.

Having suffered so badly, Hriday refuses to step back from his role as a teacher, which he has performed for 25 years.

“I faced similar things in the past. Some locals, probably students, threw brick chunks at my house. One day, some boys hurled abuse at me as I was walking by them. As I confronted them, they denied speaking anything abusive.”

There were several instances when he found the lock of his cupboard in the school broken. “I used to keep students' fees and the receipts in the cupboard. Now, I take the receipts home.”

Hriday believes he had to face all these because he did not agree to students' request to pass them

BTRC failing to stop hatred on Facebook

HC blasts the regulator

The High Court yesterday blasted BTRC for its failure to prevent the spread of hateful contents on Facebook, which has caused disruptions in social and communal harmony in the country.

The HC bench of Justice Md Mozibur Rahman Miah and Justice Khizir Hayat said if the Bangladesh Telecommunications Regulatory Commission had taken measures to stop the spread of fake news on Facebook, the communal attacks, militant activities and chaos during the Durga Puja festival last October would not have happened.

“There are specific provisions under Section 8 of the Digital Security Act, 2018 based on which the BTRC can regulate Facebook and remove or block publication and dissemination of hateful contents from the social media platform.”

“But why does the BTRC need order from this court each and every time to remove such content from

NID may be required for advance Eid train tickets

Sale starts April 23

The Bangladesh Railway is likely to make National Identity Cards or any other valid identity card mandatory for buying advance train tickets – the sales of which will begin on April 23 – ahead of Eid-ul-Fitr.

It is also considering an only-women compartment in each inter-city train during the Eid rush.

Advance tickets would be sold from counters at four spots – Kamalapur Station, Old Station at

‘Evil has been defeated’

Says Shehbaz after being elected new Pak PM, announces raft of populist measures

Pakistan lawmakers yesterday elected Shehbaz Sharif as the country's new prime minister following the weekend ouster of Imran Khan, who resigned his national assembly seat – along with most of his party members – ahead of the vote.

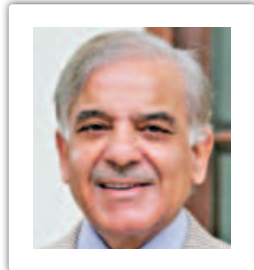
Khan was dismissed Sunday after losing a no-confidence vote, paving the way for an unlikely alliance that faces the same issues which bedeviled the cricket star-turned-politician – a weak economy, rising militancy, and soured relations with the West.

Shehbaz immediately announced a raft of populist measures, including a new minimum wage of 25,000 rupees (around \$135), pay rises for civil servants, and development projects in rural areas.

He also said he wanted better relations with neighbour India, but a solution needed to be found for Kashmir – the contested Himalayan territory at the heart of decades of their conflict.

Shehbaz, leader of the centrist Pakistan Muslim League-N (PML-N), was the only candidate for premier

PM laments lack of strong opposition

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday expressed her frustration for not having a strong opposition in the country as the two main opposition parties, created by military rulers, don't have a base among the mass people.

She said this at a views exchange meeting with the officials of the Prime Minister's Office.

The three-and-a-half hour meeting was held at the PMO with Hasina in the chair.

Regarding the BNP and Jatiya Party, she said both were created by the military dictators, who grabbed the state power defying the Constitution. "They don't have any interest in the country and its people," she said.

BNP demands probe into 'law minister-adviser convo'

Files complaint with ACC

The BNP has demanded that the Anti-Corruption Commission probe a leaked conversation allegedly between the law minister and an adviser to the prime minister over a government project.

It also demanded the ACC disclose the names of those who had laundered money abroad.

Syed Moazzem Hossain Alal, the party's joint secretary general, along with Taiful Islam Tipu, its assistant office secretary, submitted two letters with the demands to the anti-graft body yesterday.

Talking to reporters later, Moazzem said, "We've recently learned about a leaked conversation between Law Minister Anisul Huq and Salman F Rahman. It [the conversation] is sensational and it primarily gives proof of the highest level of corruption.

"We have asked them [ACC] to carry out a vigorous investigation. We'll help them [if needed]."

On the other hand, Awami League leader Khandaker Mohtesam Hossain

'Tens of thousands' killed in Mariupol

Claims President Zelensky, accuses Russia of slowing evacuations

Ukraine said yesterday that tens of thousands of people have likely been killed in Russia's assault on Mariupol and Russian forces have slowed down evacuations from the besieged southeastern city, where conditions are desperate.

"Mariupol has been destroyed, there are tens of thousands of dead, but even despite this, the Russians are not stopping their offensive," President Volodymyr Zelensky said in a video address to South Korean lawmakers.

Reuters has confirmed widespread destruction in Mariupol but could not verify the accuracy of his estimate of those killed in the strategic city, which lies between Russian-annexed Crimea and eastern areas of Ukraine held by Russian-backed separatists.

If confirmed, it would be by far the largest number of dead so far reported in one place in Ukraine, where cities, towns and villages have come under relentless bombardment and many bodies, including of civilians, have been seen in the streets.

The head of the Russia-backed

self-proclaimed Donetsk People's Republic, Denis Pushilin, told Russia's RIA news agency yesterday that more than 5,000 people may have been killed in Mariupol. He said Ukrainian forces were responsible.

Petro Andryushchenko, an aide to the mayor of Mariupol, said on the Telegram messaging service that numbers of people leaving the city had fallen, not because people

did not want to escape but because Russian forces had slowed pre-departure checks.

Around 10,000 people were awaiting screening by Russian forces, he said. Russia does not allow military personnel to leave with civilian evacuees. There was no immediate comment from Moscow, which has previously blamed Ukraine for blocking evacuations.

Zelensky also said yesterday that thousands of Russian troops were massing for a new offensive in the east, and Russia said it would not halt its military operation in Ukraine for any further peace talks.

British intelligence said Ukrainian forces had already repulsed several Russian assaults in eastern regions. Meanwhile, US President Joe Biden and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a virtual summit yesterday, clouded by US frustration over New Delhi's neutral stance on Russia's invasion of Ukraine, reports AFP.

New Delhi has raised concerns in Washington in particular by continuing to buy Russian oil and gas, despite pressure from Biden for world leaders to take a hard line against Moscow.

The United States has already warned that any country that actively helps Russia to circumvent international sanctions will suffer "consequences."

Yet this has not deterred India from working with Russia on a rupee-ruble payment mechanism to enable existing trade obligations in the wake of sanctions imposed on the Kremlin.

Save us from dishonest deep tube-well operators

Aggrieved farmers write to PM

Aggrieved farmers in Rajshahi yesterday appealed to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for saving them from dishonest deep tube-well operators of Barind Multipurpose Development Authority (BMDA).

They forwarded a memorandum to the PM through Rajshahi Deputy Commissioner Md Abdul Jalil.

In the memorandum, they said the operators turned most of the deep tube-wells into tools for exploiting farmers because of lax monitoring by BMDA officials.

They added that the deaths of two Santal farmers in Godagari upazila by suicide for not getting water was the result of exploitation.

Around 500 farmers and their family members, mostly from different ethnic groups, also demonstrated on the DC's office premises.

They also laid siege to the BMDA office in Ambagan area, demanding removal of corrupt BMDA officials.

BCL man files complaint against teacher

A complaint has been filed against a college teacher in Rangpur over his alleged indecent Facebook post on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's comments.

Imran Hossain, 24, general secretary of ward-28 of Rangpur city unit Chhatra League, on Sunday night lodged the complaint with Tajhat Police Station accusing Delwar Hossain, 42, a teacher of information and communication department at Rangpur City College.

According to the complaint, Delowar made the post on April 8.

This correspondent could not contact the teacher for comments.

Nazmul Kader, officer-in-charge of the police station, yesterday said they sent the complaint to the Cyber Crime unit. Action will be taken after investigation, he said.

Five trawlers gutted at dockyard

Five fishing trawlers were gutted in a fire that broke out at a dockyard in Barguna's Patharghata upazila on Sunday night.

The origin of the fire could not be known immediately, said Shahjahan Sikder, an official of Patharghata Fire Service Station.

Quader, owner of Maulana Abdul Quader dockyard, said, "I don't know how the fire broke out as I was not there at that time. Someone may have set it on fire over enmity."

The loss caused by the fire could be around Tk 1.5 crore, the fire service official speculated.

Facebook?" the HC bench asked while hearing a writ petition regarding the issue.

It directed the authorities concerned to take necessary steps to remove the hateful contents from Facebook and stop their misuse.

The court also issued a rule asking respondents to explain in two weeks why their failure to prevent publishing, disseminating and spreading of despicable contents on Facebook should not be declared

illegal.

In the rule, the court also asked them to show cause why they should not be directed to regulate Facebook under Section 8 of DSA in order to stop circulation of such contents.

The BTRC chairman; secretary at the Ministry of Posts, Telecommunication and Information Technology; senior secretary at the public security division of the home ministry, director general of the digital

security agency and Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg, owner of Facebook, have been made respondents to the rule, petitioners' lawyer Tapas Kanti Baul told The Daily Star.

The writ petition was filed by four citizens -- Saleem Samad, a senior journalist; Dr SM Masum Billah, a teacher of law department at Jagannath University (JnU); George Chowdhury, a Supreme Court lawyer; and Victor Ray, a leader of Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian

Unity Council -- in December last year.

A Facebook post on October 13 last year claimed that Hindus insulted the Holy Quran by placing it in a Durga Puja mandap. Videos and photos of the Holy Quran kept at a mandap in Cumilla were circulated widely on social media, mostly Facebook.

Later, communal attacks took place in 27 districts against Hindu establishments from October 13 to November 1, they said in the petition.

in exams after they failed.

"On March 20, some students kept prodding me with questions on religion. It was something I had never encountered before," he said yesterday.

"We normally don't have debates on religion and science in classroom. But those students began the centuries-old debate on creationism versus the theory of evolution... I then explained Darwin's Theory of Evolution to them.

"I told them religion is about belief but science is based on proof. But they are free to decide what they will believe."

It was not just one or two questions -- there was a concerted effort to spark an incendiary debate. "This has not happened in my classroom before."

Students usually don't bring mobile phones in his classroom as the device is not allowed there, Hriday said. "At one point of the debate I noticed four to five

students huddled together. They were laughing. I didn't release they were recording the conversation. Another group of students kept asking me questions."

Two days later, Hriday was called to the school office where he saw a member of the institution's managing committee sitting next to the headmaster. They asked him why he spoke ill about religion.

"I was accused of saying things which I did not speak. I told them to call the students and hear from them about the matter. They then told me to come back the next day. They told me I was in trouble and I should not go to the school unless asked to go there."

The next day began the attack on his house.

"I heard voices of adults and children. They were shouting at us. My children began crying in panic. We thought they would kill us," he said.

He called the school administration for help, but they came with a letter which said he has been suspended.

"The letter mentioned false allegations against me," he said.

At one point, police arrived at Hriday's house and took him to the nearest police station.

"I told everything to the law enforcers and they advised me to go to jail for my own safety. I was told that I would be charged with some minor offence, so that I can get bail easily. I agreed."

Later a case was filed against Hriday for "hurting religious sentiments" by an office assistant of the school. The assistant had no issues with the teacher. He simply followed orders, found our correspondent there.

Hriday, however, was not told he was going to be charged under Sections 295 and 295 (A) of the

Penal Code. Both carry jail terms up to two years.

Section 295 criminalises vandalism of religious sites, while Section 295 (A) criminalises "deliberate and malicious intention of outraging the religious feelings of any class of the citizens of Bangladesh, by words, either spoken or written, or by visible representations of insults, or attempts to insult the religion or the religious beliefs of that class".

"I did nothing of that sort. I did not vandalise any religious site," said Hriday.

But the truth did not matter -- what mattered to the angry crowds was that Hriday be thrown in jail.

The police apparently appeased them. Hriday was released on bail on Sunday, after his lawyer proved in court that Hriday did not demean religion.

"This society needs science more than anything," he told The Daily Star yesterday.

Prof Azad died in Munich on August 12, 2004. Reviewing his death certificate, police in the charge sheet said that because of the wounds from the attack in February, Prof Azad suffered hypertension and his health was deteriorating -- which ultimately led to his death.

After his death, the case was turned into that of murder.

Inspector Kazi Abdul Malek of CID submitted a charge sheet to a Dhaka court on November 15, 2007 against five JMB men. But upon appeal by Azad's family, the court ordered reinvestigation.

The CID filed a fresh charge sheet on April 30, 2012 against four JMB men -- Salehin alias Salahuddin, Anwarul Alam alias Anwar, Mizanur Rahman alias Minhaz and Nur Mohammad. Of them, Salehin and Nur are on the run and the other two behind bars.

The investigators had found involvement of six other JMB leaders and activists including JMB chief Abdur Rahman and his second-in-command Siddiqui Islam Bangla Bhui, but the court acquitted them as they were either executed in other cases or killed in "gunfight".

In the face of massive crackdown and arrest and execution of top JMB leaders in the following years, the banned outfit's activities were largely contained.

But the IS-inspired militant group "Neo JMB"

and al-Qaeda-influenced Ansarullah Bangla Team (ABT), also known as Ansar Al Islam, started carrying out targeted killings between 2013 and 2016.

ABT was responsible for the attacks on writer-bloggers, including Avijit, publishers and LGBT activists.

For the killing of Avijit, a tribunal in Dhaka on February 16 last year handed down death sentence to five militants and life imprisonment to another.

Those sentenced to death are Syed Mohammad Ziaul Haque alias Major (sacked) Zia, Akram Hossain, Abu Siddique Soheli, Mozammel Hossain and Arafat Rahman. Life imprisonment was handed down to Shafiur Rahman Farabi.

While the case is still pending with the High Court, Major Zia and Akram remain fugitives and the rest are in prison.

After the verdict, Bonya had said simply prosecuting a few foot-soldiers -- and ignoring the rise and roots of extremism -- does not mean justice for Avijit's death.

The US State Department on December 20 last year announced a \$5 million reward for information on the killing of Avijit Roy and the concurrent attack on his wife Bonya.

ABT also brutally killed Faisal Arefin Dipan of Jagriti Prokashani at his Shahbagh office on October 31, 2015. Dipan's company had published

Biswasher Virus (The Virus of Faith), by Avijit Roy in 2014.

The same day, Ahmedur Rashid Tutul of Shuddhashwar Prokashani, another publisher of Avijit's books, survived a machete attack by ABT men.

On February 10, 2021, a trial court handed down death sentence to eight ABT leaders and operatives, including Zia and Akram, in the Dipan murder case.

The appeals filed by the convicts and death references (lower court documents for confirmation of death penalties) in the cases filed for the killings of Avijit and Dipan, are now pending with the HC.

Supreme Court spokesperson Saifur Rahman said the hearings and disposals of the death references and appeals in the cases will be held gradually.

The spate of blogger killing began in 2013 with ABT men murdering Ahmed Rajib Haider near his Mirpur house on February 15 when the Shahbagh movement demanding capital punishment of war criminals was in full swing.

ADhaka court sentenced two ABT members to death and six other operatives to different terms in jail on December 31, 2015 over Rajib's killing.

The High Court upheld the trial court verdict on April 2 in 2017. Rajib's father Nazimuddin expressed disappointment over the High Court

judgment saying that he did not get justice.

"The eight accused in the case are self-proclaimed terrorists, but all of them did not get capital punishment," he said after the HC verdict.

The Supreme Court is yet to start the hearing on the appeals filed by the convicts challenging the HC verdict.

Science writer and blogger Ananta Bijoy Das was hacked to death at Sylhet city's Subidbazar on May 12, 2015. The Anti-Terrorism Special Tribunal of Sylhet handed down death penalty to four ABT operatives on March 30 this year.

On March 30, 2015, blogger Oyashiquar Rahman Babu was attacked by three cleaver-wielding ABT members in the capital's Tejgaon industrial area. The case filed over his murder is under trial at a Dhaka court.

Trials of the cases filed over murders of two other bloggers -- Niladri Chattopadhyay Niloy in the capital's Goran on August 7, 2015, and Nazim Uddin Samad in old Dhaka on April 6, 2016 -- are yet to begin. Police pressed charges against a number of ABT operatives in the cases.

Khurshid Alam Khan, a senior lawyer of the Supreme Court, told The Daily Star that due to the long delay of trial proceedings of the cases witnesses lose their interest, evidence gets damaged and justice is hampered.

'All the roads need is a bit of discipline'

Speakers point out sorry state of transport sector

It is still possible to significantly reduce Dhaka's traffic congestion with the existing road network, by just bringing discipline in the transport sector, said Ilias Kanchan, chairperson of road-safety organisation Nirapad Sarak Chai.

Addressing a programme organised by Dhaka Utility Reporters Association (DURA) at Dhaka Reporters Unity, Kanchan said Narayanganj's police commissioner solved the traffic congestion problem in the area, which means doing so just needs a bit of effort. The authorities did this in the most traffic-jam prone area by clearing footpaths and disallowing battery-run vehicles to ply.

"So, we have to make a decision and work accordingly. But no one is taking that responsibility," he said.

Responding to a comment of LGRD Minister Md Tazul Islam, Kanchan said this government has been in power for the last 13 years, but people are just getting bombarded by dust and have been watching pillars standing idle at airport road for the last five years.

"Why have the pillars been standing idle, with no work being done, for the last five years? The work will have to be done properly. You [government] are even awarding contractors and engineers for not finishing the work timely. Will you find an example like this anywhere else in the world?" he commented.

Questioning the minister's comment on increasing the number of roads, Kanchan said people will not benefit from the roads if major parts of them remain occupied by parked vehicles, an example being the situation in front of Mohakhali bus terminal.

"We can do one thing. We can sit on the roads for two or three days to block the path of VIPs' vehicles, which ply the wrong way. When they'll be unable to move, they'll solve the problem," he added.

Prof Shamsul Hoque of Buet said to solve Dhaka's traffic problem, it is very important to discourage the use of small vehicles and prioritise public transport.

Shamsul said the government will have to stop construction of flyovers in the country and increase infrastructure of public transport.

He emphasised the importance of bus route rationalisation and said as the government is doing "transit-oriented development", there is no scope to discard the plan.

Shamsul said the philosophy of transit-oriented development is to develop cities centring metro stations. In the system, shops, residences and offices will be near the stations. So, a person will get everything within reach and will not need to use cars for transportation.

Work progress ahead of target

Says state minister on 3rd terminal at Dhaka airport

Construction of the third terminal at Dhaka airport is 1.9 percent ahead of expectations. It is likely to be inaugurated by October next year, said State Minister for Civil Aviation M Mahbub Ali yesterday.

He was briefing reporters after visiting the construction site at Kurmitola.

He said 32.7 percent of the construction work of the terminal was supposed to be completed by April 8. In reality, 34.6 percent has been done by this time.

Extorting money on social media

Hacker who would take control of Facebook profiles and threaten users arrested, says DB

"Pay up to get your Facebook profile back, or we'll post anti-state and militant content through it."

With such threats, a man was extorting money from social media users, after hacking their accounts using phishing links.

If anyone ignored the threats and did not pay the money, militant content would be posted through the profiles, and then, the hacker would threaten to file cases.

Cyber-crime unit of police's detective branch (DB) yesterday claimed to have arrested the so-called hacker after conducting a drive in Savar's Ashulia.

The arrestee is Liton Islam (28). Police seized a desktop computer, two mobile phones and 10 SIM cards from his possession.

Harun-or-Rashid, joint commissioner of DB, said Liton used to extort around Tk 10,000 from victims, after taking control of the accounts. The

arrestee is a member of an international "hacker-gang".

Around 2,500 local and international Facebook accounts and passwords were also found in his possession, officials said.

Md Najmul Hoque, additional deputy commissioner of DB, said the arrestee was merely a computer operator and used to work in a shop. Watching online tutorials, he learned to create phishing links.

A case was filed against the arrestee with Kadamtali Police Station on March 1, and while investigating the case, police came to know about Liton, said Najmul.

One of the victims, Anowar Hossain, said one "Olyulla Kari" sent a link in his Messenger. When Anowar entered the link, he was directed to a different page, which looked just like Facebook.

Unaware of the trickery, Anowar gave his account details, and soon after, lost all control of his account.

They look great in photos, but to find out what they're really like, we paid a visit to the place and checked out the available items for a first-hand experience.

ITEMS THAT STOOD OUT

Pesta badam er sharbat: while the market is mostly dominated

by kebabs and meat-based items, there are a number of small stalls scattered all over the market that sell matha, badamer sharbat, firni, faluda and other desserts. Matha might not be appealing to some people, but the "pesta badam er sharbat" is highly recommended, and they are often overlooked.


Pigeon roast: if you come to Chawkbazar and don't try a meat-based item, it's not a proper iftar shopping. That being said, there are too many kebab items to choose from. Amongst all them, the pigeon roast was the one that stood out

the most, not just by its colour but most definitely by its taste. The flavour is deliciously fulfilling.

Shahi jilapi: they stand out because of their size, and the taste is brilliantly sweet. Even if you don't have a sweet tooth, this item will make an impression. With the enticing colour, the crunchy pieces combined with the sweet taste, the shahi jilapi was the one popular item that actually stood true to its reputation.

Sweet naan: unlike most naans that we are used to, instead of pale



in colour, the sweet naan had a saturated hue that makes it stand out. This naan is sweet and soft, reminding you of butter naan and most definitely worth trying. Last but not least, the pitha stalls in the iftar market offer a variety of items such as patishapta, pakan, teler pitha, ful pitha, etc. Interestingly, most of the pithas are delicious, as is the firni. **ITEMS THAT FAILED TO IMPRESS** Every time you see news about Chawkbazar's iftar, you will see the mouth-watering pictures of a mutton leg roast. Unfortunately, this item does not live up to expectations. Because the item is a whole leg roasted, the meat is often not tender enough to be an iftar item. The spices look great on the surface, but the meat underneath lacks juice and spices. In short, it's probably a good item for a kebab party, but not iftar.

Quail roast was another item that looks appealing but was an absolute let-down. The roasted quail flavour is not one you want on your tongue after fasting for a whole day. Beef/chicken balls and the average ball-like kebab items are not recommended either. You will find doi bora, which is inherently a difficult dish to make. There is a clever play of flavours in a properly made doi bora, but the ones found at Chawkbazar failed to deliver. **ITEMS YOU HAVE TO TRY** Boro baper polai khai: a traditional item that has gained its fame all across the country for its name and the making process. Made with items like chickpea, ox brain, liver, eggs, mutton, flattened rice and more than 40 different spices, it's one of the highlights of the Chawkbazar iftar market that you have to try. Suti kebab: another popular item that has been sold for ages; both beef and mutton suti kebab are available. It's well suited when you mix it with other items. If you like making pulled rice based iftar with a mixture of chola, bundia, cutlets and all that, suti kebab is a must have item. Remember, kebabs will go bad soon under the scorching heat. Keep track of time while shopping and try to explore rather than following the hype.

SAINIK FIGHTS on with his tunes

“No matter what I did, it never seemed to matter to some people. It was 1989 when T W Sainik first came from Nilphamari to Dhaka, as a culturally active young man. Even after two decades of successful work as a cinematographer – more than 500 tele-fictions, 40 TVCs and 4 films, we know the artiste as the voice behind “Tumi Amar Ghum”, a song that captured the hearts of music listeners regardless of taste.

Sainik, after his arrival to the city, was involved in theatre through Momtajjudin Ahmed’s theatre troupe, and music through Chhayanaut. However, his turnabout came when he starred in an ad film as an extra.

“I was awestruck after I watched cinematographer Samir Kushari – his poise, personality and dedication. At that moment, I knew that I wanted to be in the entertainment industry, in whatever medium.”

When he did pick up the camera, the artiste was exposed to many stars in the industry, who encouraged him to sing.

“I started working in Eju Audio Video, where I got exposure to the entertainment business. We did musical programmes for many companies like Benson & Hedges, who was doing a ‘star search’ at that point.”

The likes of Ayub Bachchu, Naquib Khan, Foad Nasser Babu and Labu Rahman encouraged him to sing. Sainik thus contacted Sohel Arman, with whom he had worked on many television projects, to write a lyric for him.

“He brushed me off at first, but I persisted, and he finally wrote ‘Tumi Amar Ghum’ for me,” he said.

The album, which went by the same name, was composed by Ibrar Tipu. Two of the songs were written by Sohel Arman, two by his father, Abdul Wahab, and five by Zulfikar Russell. “The album was a revelation for me, as everyone in the industry started to admire me.”

Owing to the song’s popularity, Sainik went on to win the Popular Choice Award at the Benson & Hedges Star Search, the Channel i Music awards, among many accolades.

“Kumar Bishwajit *da* was instrumental in encouraging me to finish the album,” continued the singer.

However, the success that Sainik saw did not translate into any monetary benefits. “We did not sign any written agreements with the company which released the album,” says the disappointed artiste. “I did not receive any money from the album, that resonated in arguably every household in the country.”

The rift between music labels and artistes is a problem that plagues the industry, especially when many artistes cannot even upload their own tracks to streaming services.

After “Tumi Amar Ghum”, Sainik’s second album “Ghumer Por Megh” came out in 2015, almost a decade after his first hit. After that, “Monchora”, a mixed album featuring Sainik, Chanchal Chowdhury and Fazlur Rahman Babu was released.

GOVT’S 40-DAY JOB SCHEME PROJECT

Wait for wages lingers

OUR CORRESPONDENT, Lalmonirhat

Most of labourers in Lalmonirhat and Kurigram have yet to receive wages even after the completion of the government’s 40-day job scheme project. As a result, the labourers have run into debt to run their families.

According to district relief and rehabilitation sources, the government has allocated Tk 13 crore 38 lakh and 40 thousand for 8,365 beneficiary labourers in five upazilas of Lalmonirhat and Tk 43 crore and 52 lakh has been allocated for 27,200 beneficiary labourers in nine upazilas of Kurigram.

These allocations were made in mid-December last year. But the project got delayed due to complexities in preparing the list of the beneficiaries by the local representatives. The labourers were

given their wages to their respective bank accounts last year but this year they are going to be paid by e-payment system through mobile financial services-- Nagad and bKash.

Alema Bewa, a beneficiary labourer in Burirbazar area under Mahindranagar union in Lalmonirhat Sadar upazila, said their work has been completed but they have not received any wages yet.

“We have run into debt as we haven’t got wages in time,” she said.

Ekramul Haque, another beneficiary labourer of the same village, said they got a wage of Tk 200 in previous years, which has been doubled this year.

Sakhina Bewa, a beneficiary labourer from Nawdanga village in Phulbari upazila of Kurigram, said she was supposed to get Tk 16,000 for working 40 days this year but

has not received any wage yet.

Abdul Majid, chairman of Mahendranagar Union Parishad in Lalmonirhat Sadar upazila, said the work of the project was delayed due to some complications in preparing the list of beneficiary labourers.

The concerned department has been contacted regarding the wages of the labourers, he said.

Lalmonirhat Sadar Upazila Project Implementation Officer (PIO) Mashiur Rahman said the wage was paid by the PIO office of the concerned upazila in the past years but it is being paid directly from Dhaka this year.

District Relief and Rehabilitation Officer in Kurigram Abdul Hai said there was a slight delay in payment of wages as the labourers’ mobile numbers were incorrect.

All the labourers will get their wages soon, he hoped.

Phulbaria, Cantonment Station and Airport Station – in the capital.

Fifty percent of the tickets would be sold online.

All these decisions were taken and proposals discussed at an inter-ministerial meeting at the Rail Bhaban yesterday with Railways Minister Nurul Islam Sujan in the chair.

The minister will brief the media about the decisions on these issues on Wednesday.

With Eid likely to be celebrated on May 2 or 3, depending on the moonsighting, advance tickets for April 27 will be sold on April 23. Tickets for April 28, 29, 30 and May 1 will be sold on April 24, 25, 26, and 27 respectively, meeting sources said.

At the meeting, Sujan directed the authorities concerned to make NID or other valid identity cards mandatory for purchasing advance ticket to check the black marketing of tickets.

However, some BR officials said making identity cards mandatory may adversely affect ticket sales amid the huge rush of holiday-goers.

Rail Secretary Humayun Kabir proposed a compartment dedicated for women in every inter-city train to ensure hassle-free journeys for them.

Several officials argued that ahead of Eid, women usually travel with family and may not prefer travelling separately.

to dredge 14 rivers in the Sylhet region has been taken up.

However, experts opined that dredging a few rivers at random would not solve the problem. A massive dredging plan followed by a complete study is compulsory for a fruitful outcome.

Flash floods first hit haors on April 1. Boro on over 7,000 hectares have so far been submerged, damaging crop worth about Tk 125 crore.

At least three major levees broke and many more are at risk.

Things could take a turn for worse as it has started raining again in the country’s north-eastern region and in India’s Meghalaya and Assam.

Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre has forecast flash floods.

AKM Saiful Islam, professor of Buet’s Institute of Water and Flood Management, said, “The timespan of flash floods hitting haor areas is advancing which we can relate to the climate change.”

“PICs [project implementation committees] must be formed way before the water recedes post-monsoon so that the construction can

start and finish early,” he said, adding that the dykes’ compaction must be done properly.

The professor urged to build up a long-term collaboration with India so that Bangladesh can get information about weather and water level in the rivers upstream.

Ali Muhammad Omar Faruque, director of water resources ministry’s Department of Bangladesh Haor and Wetlands Development, said a study was required for long-term steps. “We will be planning a study soon.”

Kashmir Reza, president of Haor O Paribesh Unnayan Sangtha, a rights organisation, said, “Rivers upstream must be dredged along with all major rivers downstream so that the excessive water recedes easily.”

SM Shahidul Islam, additional chief engineer of BWDB in Sylhet, said, “There is nothing wrong with the compaction of the closures, but the older parts become week over time and break. It needs more budget allocation to construct stronger levees.”

State Minister Zaheed yesterday said constructing permanent levees in the haors was not possible.

On the project to dredge

14 rivers in Sylhet region, he said it would increase the capacity of the rivers holding rainwater from upstream.

“We’ve identified the problems and will start our work in November .. and hopefully there will be no problem next year.”

A committee has been formed to identify why the incident happened, who was responsible and to assess the damage.

Babar, brother of former minister Khandaker Mosharraf Hossain, is allegedly involved in laundering over Tk 2,000 crore abroad, the BNP said in the letter.

In its letter, the BNP asked the ACC to find out where the money was laundered.

“How much money was

laundered in the last five years, who were involved and what measures are being taken by the ACC? What are the problems the ACC has faced in bringing the money back?” the letter asked.

Asked why such complaints were filed with the ACC, Moazzem said they did this out of their sense of responsibility and that they would do so

regularly from now on.

ACC’s Secretary Mahbub Hossain said anyone can file complaints with them. “We have received the complaints [filed by some BNP leaders]. The next course of action will be taken based on the ACC’s act and rules.”

Asked, ACC secretary said he was yet to see BNP’s complaint.

Shehbaz steps out of shadows to lead Pak

Shehbaz Sharif, who became Pakistan's new prime minister yesterday after leading the opposition alliance that ousted Imran Khan, is a tough administrator with a penchant for quoting revolutionary poetry.

Shehbaz is the younger brother of three-time prime minister Nawaz Sharif, who was dismissed then jailed on corruption charges in 2017 and is currently in Britain after being released from prison two years later for medical treatment.

He is a seasoned politician in his own right, however, having served for years as chief minister of Punjab province, the Sharif family's power base, and also president of the Pakistan Muslim League-N (PML-N).

The 70-year-old jointly inherited the family's steel business as a young man and was first elected to provincial office in 1988.

Officials were reportedly kept on their toes by workaholic Shehbaz's habit of surprise visits to government offices, which he would inspect clad in a favoured safari suit and hat.

Shehbaz has also been linked to graft and corruption -- charges supporters say sprang from a political vendetta by Khan. Unlike his elder brother -- whose relations with the country's powerful military and his opponents were strained -- Shehbaz is seen as a more flexible dealmaker, capable of compromising even with his enemies.

FRENCH PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION Macron, Le Pen qualify for run-off

AFP, Paris

French President Emmanuel Macron and far-right rival Marine Le Pen yesterday embarked on a final fortnight of bruising campaigning for a French presidential election run-off whose outcome is far more uncertain than their encounter five years ago.

With 97 percent votes counted, Macron came in first in Sunday's first round of voting with 27.6 percent of the vote. Le Pen was second with 23.4 percent.

As the top two finishers, they



advance to a second round on April 24.

Far-left candidate Jean-Luc Melenchon came close to beating Le Pen for the second spot, after a late surge gave him a score of just under 22 percent.

The duel between Macron and Le Pen is a re-run of the 2017 election final from which Macron emerged victorious with 66 percent. But this time polls predict a closer contest which will crucially hinge on voters who backed other candidates in the first round.

"Make no mistake: nothing is decided," Macron told cheering supporters at his campaign headquarters Sunday night.

Le Monde daily headlined: "Macron-Le Pen -- A more uncertain Act II."

ANTI-WAR STUNT German paper hires Russian journo

German newspaper Die Welt said yesterday it has hired Marina Ovsyannikova, the Russian journalist who protested against Moscow's military action in Ukraine during a prime-time news broadcast on state TV. Ovsyannikova, 43, "is now a freelance correspondent for Die Welt, reporting from Ukraine and Russia, among other places", the newspaper said in a statement.

Ovsyannikova, an editor at Russia's Channel One television, barged onto the set of its flagship Vremya (Time) evening news in March holding a poster reading "No War" in English. After her protest she was detained and questioned for 14 hours before being released and ordered to pay a fine of 30,000 rubles (\$280).

Israel army in new operations around West Bank city

Israeli forces yesterday launched a third day of operations around the flashpoint West Bank city of Jenin following heavy gun battles in recent days and 20 arrests overnight, the army said. Tensions have soared since a spree of attacks in Israel left 14 people dead in the past three weeks, with Prime Minister Naftali Bennett warning the Jewish state is now "on the offensive". Four Palestinians were killed in separate incidents across the occupied territory Sunday, and militant groups in Jenin braced for more battles.

after Khan loyalist Shah Mahmood Qureshi, the former foreign minister, withdrew his candidacy and resigned his seat.

"It's a victory of righteousness, and evil has been defeated," he said in his maiden speech as premier, suggesting no end to what has been a bitter political battle.

Later in the day, Shehbaz was sworn in as the country's prime minister at the President House.

The oath was administered by the chairman of Pakistan's Senate, Sadiq Sanjrani, in the absence of President Arif Alvi, a member of Khan's party, who said he was unwell.

Shehbaz's first task will be to form a cabinet that will also draw heavily from the centre-left Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), as well as find space for the smaller

conservative Jamiat-ulema-e-Islam-F (JUI-F) group.

The PPP and PML-N are dynastic parties that have dominated Pakistani politics for decades -- usually as bitter rivals -- but their relations are sure to fray in the lead-up to the next election, which must be held by October 2023.

"History knows there is no ideological convergence among them," Qureshi said before storming out.

They need to tackle soaring inflation, a feeble rupee and crippling debt, while militancy is also on the rise -- with Pakistan's Taliban emboldened by the return to power last year of the hardline Islamist group in neighbouring Afghanistan.

"The situation is very bad, but I am sure that we will change it with the blessing of Allah and with hard work," said Shehbaz.

In the long term, if the Russia-Ukraine conflict affects the planting seasons in Ukraine, which seems quite likely, then the shortages of wheat, maize and corn could become more acute.

Eventually, it could also put price pressure on rice as some countries start to substitute rice consumption for other grain consumption, he added.

Asia is going to see a 5.2 percent GDP growth this year and 5.3 percent growth next year.

Besides, South Asian countries will see 7 percent growth this year and 7.4 percent growth next year, outperforming their East Asian and Southeast Asian peers.

Among the South Asian nations, Bangladesh will see 6.9 percent growth this year and 7.1 percent growth next year.

On the other hand, ADB's headline forecast on inflation in Asia is "modest", Park said.

To manage the challenges, each government needs to do a "balancing act", Park said.

On the one hand, governments want to support recovery, achieve sustainable development goals and support a green transition.

But at the same time, they are worried about elevated

risks, he said.

If inflation stays modest as per the ADB's projection, some central banks in Asian countries might resist raising the interest rates.

However, that could lead to the depreciation of their currencies, Park added.

India can provide some answer to the concerns surrounding food grain supply, said Raimondo Serra, the EU's directorate-general for Agriculture and Rural Development for Asia and Australasia.

The neighbouring country is the world's second-largest producer of wheat but because of its population size, it is not a big player in the global market.

India accounted for less than 1 percent of global wheat exports in the past seven years, he said.

However, there has been a boom in Indian wheat exports between 2021 and 2022, he added.

Pauline Weil, research analyst at Brussels-based think-tank Bruegel; Anintita Praokaew, vice-president of PTT's international trading business unit; and Prinn Panichpakdi, chairman of the advisory committee to the Thai commerce minister, also spoke at the webinar.

Inflation pushing people to the brink

Government needs to wake up and take effective action

THE unabated rise in prices that we have witnessed for months now has really started to take its toll on low- and middle-income groups. Two separate reports published by this newspaper on April 11 reveal the story of ordinary people, who have either been compelled to stop eating meat and fish altogether (if not more food items), stop sending money to their village homes to their parents (who are being forced to live off of loans), cut down on expenditure for their children, and worry about how they can afford basic medical treatment should they fall sick. Amid such suffering, the lack of urgency in action and legitimate concern and sympathy shown by the government towards people is shameful.

For months the media has reported on how terribly the people have been suffering. Reportedly, prices of rice, flour, pulses, oil, fish, meat, vegetables, soap and milk rose by 12 percent in February. Prices of other essentials including edible oil, sugar, red lentils, eggs and onions have risen by 10 to 40 percent in the last one year. If the government, in any way, had an effective market monitoring system, how could this have happened? Experts have been discussing possible solutions to the unbearable rise in prices, which they have said can be mitigated despite unfavourable external factors—if the government adopts proper policies and implements them correctly. And yet, government officials mostly seem to have shut their eyes and stuffed their ears. What else explains their lack of earnestness in taking meaningful action to check inflation and help the suffering people? Is it contempt?

The size of our market dictates that it cannot be controlled by enacting laws alone. It has to be backed up by enforcement. When people are suffering to the extent that they have been, enforcing price controls should have been the government's number one priority. But in its absence, trade syndicates have been having a field day again, hiking prices of essentials during Ramadan.

We urgently call on the government to wake up from its slumber and take note of the reality unfolding before its eyes. Given the situation, having a few sporadic Open Market Sales is not enough. It is not sufficient to cover many of the poor and almost the entirety of the middle class who also need help at this stage.

As around 70 percent of the population, who don't have any financial resilience, are not covered by the government's safety net programmes, it urgently needs to expand its social safety net programmes, and ensure that during this great crisis, these programmes are kept corruption free. For this, it should involve all stakeholders from society. Additionally, it needs to provide services such as electricity, water and gas at affordable prices through better governance and transparency in these sectors.

Why is the birth registration process so chaotic?

Take action against those harassing applicants, make process people-friendly

WE remain cautiously optimistic about the LGRD minister's assurance that the birth registration process would be made simpler and harassment-free. Md Tazul Islam recently told the media that action will be taken against those harassing the applicants who are trying to make or correct their birth registration certificates. We can only hope that he delivers on his promises.

Since the government made online birth registration mandatory for all citizens from January last year—to avail 18 citizen services, including enrolment in educational institutions, registration for secondary school certificate exams, applying for a passport, and driving license—people have been subjected to unbearable sufferings. They have had to deal with numerous difficulties while filling out the forms online as well as face harassment at the relevant government offices where they have to go in person to submit the forms or correct the errors.

According to our reports, applicants who submit the application following due process and without seeking any assistance from the brokers do not get their certificates on time. Thus, in order to avoid further harassment, people are paying the brokers' Tk 500 to Tk 1,000 to get the certificates.

Strangely, the government also asked those who previously had a 16-digit birth certificate to apply for new ones as the government is now issuing all the citizens a 17-digit birth certificate. The result is, unbelievable pressure was put on the Office of the Registrar General, Birth and Death Registration (ORGBDR). As of February 10, 2022, the number of pending applications was 17,86,0094. Every day, they are receiving 100,000 new applications, which means there is always a huge backlog. Taking advantage of the situation, brokers are exploiting the applicants and making some easy money.

What this all means is that the digitisation of the application process is not truly efficient and the government has actually forced the citizens to go through this without properly preparing the service delivery system. Experts believe that this huge backlog in delivering certificates and other problems, such as correcting the information errors, could be easily solved by using better and more efficient technology. Could the government not have easily updated the 16-digit certificates to 17-digit ones, instead of wasting so much time and energy to manually update things?

We urge the government to make the digital birth registration process easier, faster and harassment-free. We appreciate the LGRD minister's assurance to stop harassment of the applicants, but it means little without concrete actions by the relevant authorities to stop rampant corruption. The entire process needs to be re-evaluated so that it is people-friendly, as digitised procedures are supposed to be.

Can traffic get any worse than this? Yes, it can.

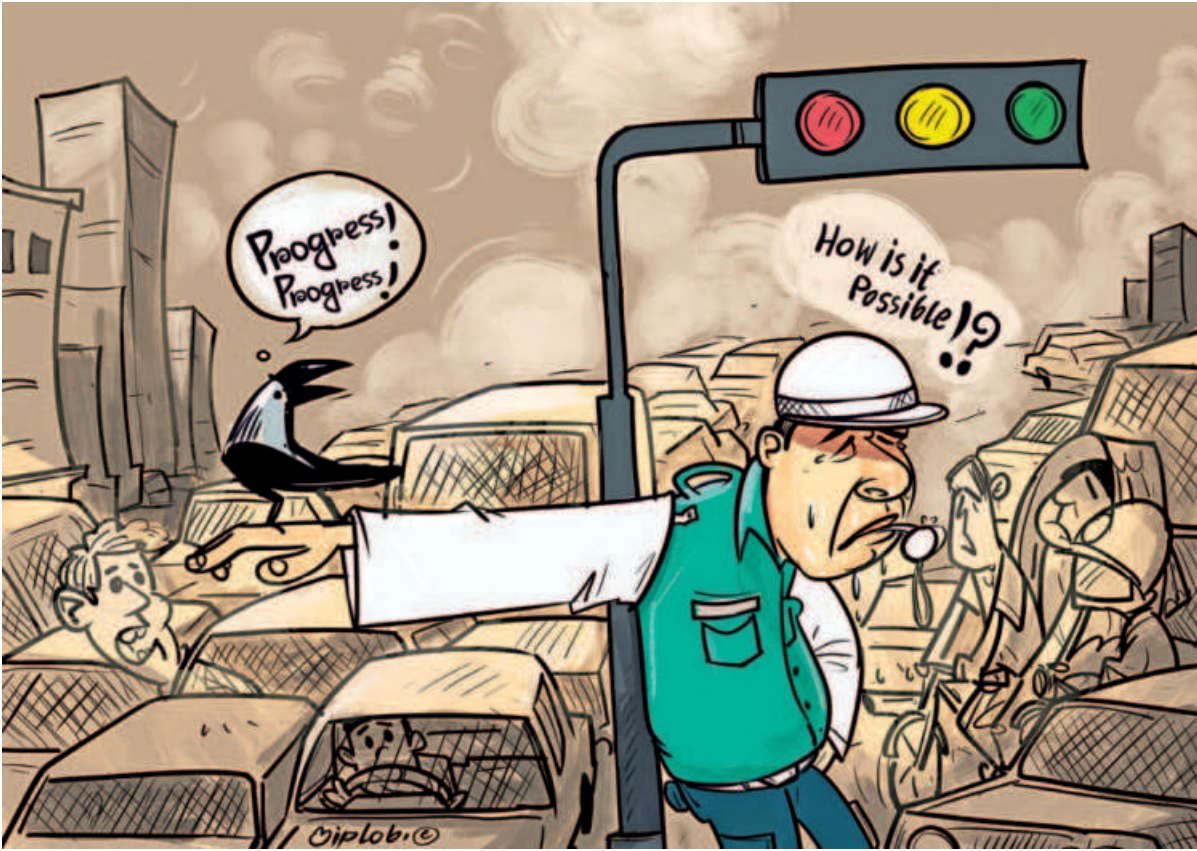
WHY is it that, no matter how many times we have experienced something unpleasant, we continue to do the exact same things we did before, expecting a different outcome? This illogical perspective that is described as insanity cannot be more manifested than in our traffic situation. Before Ramadan, it was bad enough. Travelling from A to B took a minimum of one hour no matter what the location, whether it was from Kachukhet to Gulshan or Gulshan 1 to Gulshan 2. Now, with the holy month in progress, public office goers are out by 3 pm, people are already shopping for Eid, and schools have reopened, making an already untenable situation worse.

Dhaka is at a total standstill, most of the time. We hear of school students arriving an hour late for class or commuters from Uttara spending two and a half hours on the road to reach Karwan Bazar, making their total number of travel hours (up and down) around five hours—every day, except maybe Friday. One cannot but reiterate the refrain: How are we to function if we spend so much time just on the road? On top of that, it's hot and dusty thanks to perpetual construction, the air is thick with choking smog—why must something as basic as travelling within the city be such a miserable experience? What happens when there is a medical emergency, how will an ambulance reach the hospital on time before someone's breath runs out?

With most of our energy sapped from being trapped in traffic, we are washed out by the time we reach our workplace, irritable and demotivated, especially because we are already thinking of the gruelling ride back home.

They say that once the metro rail is complete, all problems will be solved. Yes, they could be, to an extent, if most people decide to use the train, especially private car owners. The question is: Will they? And what do we do in the meantime? There are over three lakh private cars plying our roads currently, taking up 60-65 percent of their capacity. How can we get a large number of these vehicles off the roads?

Reducing the number of private cars and motorcycles would be an obvious solution. What about taking off CNG-run private vehicles from the main roads of Dhaka? This is no doubt a controversial suggestion as it will hurt the middle class

fuel-run SUVs, would be huge. As for school-goers, if there were enough safe, reliable school buses, the unnecessary jams near schools could also be avoided.

The bottom line is that policymakers must wake up from their slumber and come up with real solutions instead of keeping their eyes closed as their flag-flying cars whiz by while the rest of the population sweats it out in the chokehold of traffic. They must repair the footpaths (so people are not maimed by open manholes, potholes and broken debris from construction) and free them from hawkers who have to pay a fee to the local mafia for a piece of pavement. Many people have already resorted to walking instead of being stuck in hours of traffic, but the broken and encroached upon pavements make it hazardous and difficult to travel on foot. Public transport vehicles must be dramatically increased—we only have 37,593 registered buses for a city of over two crore. Our city fathers, moreover, must give up their indulgence of rickety murir tin buses, owned by powerful quarters, that emit black fumes and stop

burden of people moving around in the city. The Covid experience has given us a logical solution: A hybrid model—with some days working from home and the rest in the workplace. Government offices that deal with processing documents digitally could adopt this model and make sure all applications can be processed online without disruption. Other offices where most or all of the work is done on digital platforms, too, could benefit from this—especially during Ramadan.

These are not difficult measures to implement and it is surprising that most of what has been mentioned constitutes the bare minimum that ordinary citizens can expect from their capital city. Dhaka's population is now around 22,478,000 and is estimated to reach 31.2 million by 2035. One can only shudder to think how Dhaka will cope with another nine million or more city dwellers, most of whom will be moving around the city at any given time. Will those responsible for this city finally take notice of our misery and allow Dhaka's arteries to flow freely again?

Renewable energy, not imported LNG

ON March 21, 2022, Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina declared 100 percent electricity coverage of the country. As one of the fast-growing economies in the world, Bangladesh needs a reliable energy grid, so this is a milestone moment.

As Bangladesh scales up its energy supply, its leaders face a choice: do they double down on imported fossil fuels, or invest in renewable energy instead?

Last year, it made a major leap forward when it scrapped plans for 10 new coal-fired power plants.

But there are some expectations that at least some of the cancelled coal-fired projects would be replaced with LNG-fired power. There is a distinct possibility that the new Integrated Energy and Power Master Plan (IEPMP)—currently being developed by Japan—will lock in further commitment to LNG-fired power. This would be unsurprising, given that Japan is keen to sell its LNG power technology overseas.

A closer look at fossil fuel markets shows that this approach has major economic risks, and would be a backwards step for a country in need of an affordable and reliable energy system.

Relying on LNG imports means locking into an unstable market and the price spikes that go with it. Even before the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Asian LNG prices reached their highest level ever late last year. Japan is well aware

how such LNG price spikes impact power prices—2021 saw Japan's worst power crisis since the Fukushima disaster, prompted by high LNG prices.

Now, Russia's invasion of Ukraine means that the fossil fuel market will become even more volatile. Countries who normally source gas from Russia are looking elsewhere, putting supply under pressure. Already, that's driven up LNG prices to new record highs.

That global dash for gas triggers sky-high costs for people, business, and government in Bangladesh. The government has already paid through the nose in subsidies and other losses to soften the blow of huge price rises in 2021. As a result, Bangladesh Power Development Board (PDB) proposed raising the cost of electricity by 66 percent—a rise that's likely to be passed on, at least in part, to consumers and businesses, too.

Locking into more LNG reliance would mean that Bangladesh is even more exposed to the risks of volatile fossil fuel imports. It's no foundation for growth.

Instead, the government's efforts should be redirected to the two things needed to safeguard the sustainability of the power system: grid investments to make better use of existing capacity and scaling up renewable energy.

Given the power system's already very low overall utilisation rate of just 42 percent, the new IEPMP must focus on grid investment to improve reliability and limit the country's future dependence on expensive, imported fossil fuels.

Overcapacity problems means the PDB is forced to pay high capacity payments to plants, causing worsening operating losses for the government. Investing in the transmission system would get power to the parts of Bangladesh that need it the most and help end the stream of financial losses from the PDB. Fixing this

should be a priority in the IEPMP—not importing expensive LNG.

Renewables are a secure energy source, and that's why the world's most powerful countries are now accelerating their investment in renewables amid current geopolitical instability. Take Germany, which has just announced its accelerating its journey towards 100 percent renewable energy after the war in Ukraine exposed the cost and insecurity of relying on gas. Every day Bangladesh doesn't invest in renewables is another day spent paying through the nose for fossil fuels—while ignoring the almost limitless energy sources on its doorstep.

Energy that Bangladesh can control also means more reliable power for its citizens. A USAID report highlighted that only 11 percent of grid-connected houses receive more than 16 hours of energy supply a day. Secure renewable energy solves this by getting reliable power flowing to the businesses and homes that need it at a fixed cost, unaffected by global fossil fuel price volatility.

Bangladesh's Sustainable and Renewable Energy Development Authority (SREDA) has recently proposed that a new clean energy target of 25 percent (including renewable and nuclear) by 2030 be incorporated into the new IEPMP. This target would amount to 10,000MW of power, including 5,000MW of wind power.

Other countries are shifting fast from their reliance on fossil fuels. They're planning for the energy markets of the future—not those of the last century. The recent fossil fuel volatility will only accelerate that transition.

If its new IEPMP wants to prepare Bangladesh for a prosperous, energy-secure future, it will invest in grid upgrades and clean, affordable, and sovereign power. That means renewables, not LNG imports.

‘We need a lot of time to improve in Tests’

Bangladesh Test captain Mominul Haque drew a clear picture of where Bangladesh are as a Test side after their 332-run loss in the second Test against South Africa at Port Elizabeth saw them lose the series 2-0. In his post-match press conference, the disappointed skipper gave indications of where it had all gone wrong. The excerpts are below:

On the lack of fight on the field:
There is only one explanation. We batted really badly and that's all there is to it. As a team, we didn't play the way we wanted. If you look at the previous Test, although we lost we batted well as a team in the first innings. We could not replicate that effort as a team. Team-wise, we couldn't bat from session to session or bat for a long time. Those things were missing.

On the win Test win against New Zealand in Mount Maunganui appearing to be a fluke after such performances:

The conditions there were different to conditions here. Whether you say it's a fluke or not is up to you. It's not in my hands. Whether playing in a Test for five days is a fluke or not, I don't know. Perhaps you can say better. However, you can't look for similarities between the conditions in Mount Maunganui and here.

On the change in approach
The thing is that you have to adapt to the conditions quickly. It's not like we don't play on spinning wickets. I think our execution was flawed in one or two areas.

On wavering from Test mentality
Test cricket is the kind of game that demands you

improve on a daily basis as a team. You can't just play well for one session or even three days in a Test. You have to play well all five days. You may make mistakes in one or two sessions, but you still have to play well over five days. I think we need to improve more in Test cricket. From the way you speak, it feels like we're already the number one Test team. But I feel we are still in the same place we were before we won the Test [against New Zealand in Mount Maunganui]. Maybe your expectations rose. So did ours, but there is lot to improve on.

Mushfiqur's dismissal and whether anyone talked to him
A reverse sweep is a cricketing shot. It's not like it's not a cricketing shot. He can play that shot and he will play it according to his game plan. I support him. No one [talked to him regarding that shot]. I will make a request of you because it will benefit Bangladesh cricket. If you emphasise this issue, it will be bad for his mood, for our team and for our country.

On losing wickets to spinners
Everyone knows that we, bar one or two players, are not very good at playing spinners. It sounds bad but

that's how I feel. Maybe some play [well], but we don't understand which areas to target square of the wicket.

On being used to Shakib [Al Hasan] and Taijul [Islam] but struggling against Keshav Maharaj
The fundamental thing is the difference between wickets in the subcontinent and here. Side spin is very effective in our country but here it's not so effective. In these conditions, over spin [flighted with top spin] is very effective. Our bowlers' technique would be hampered if they tried over spin after two days.

On not picking a third seamer
Picking five bowlers is difficult for us because it shortens the batting line-up. Bangladesh are number nine or ten in the Test rankings. You can't forget that winning one Test hasn't made us the number one team in the world. You have to understand that we need a lot of time to improve in Tests. Maybe there will be success from time to time, but we can't think we have become number one. When we're number four or five in the rankings, I will be able to play with five bowlers. It's difficult for us with six batters because contributions from the lower-order is still small other than maybe [Mehedi Hasan] Miraz.

Chelsea face ‘incredibly high’ challenge

Bayern won't play badly twice, promises Nagelsmann

Chelsea manager Thomas Tuchel said his team need a "fantastic script" to overturn a two-goal deficit against Real Madrid on Tuesday and qualify for the Champions League semi-finals.

Chelsea's 3-1 defeat in the first leg at Stamford Bridge last week followed a surprise 4-1 home defeat to Brentford in the Premier League, although Chelsea got back on track with a 6-0 thrashing of Southampton this weekend.

"It is one of the biggest challenges to perform away at the Bernabeu," Tuchel said. "We need nothing else than a fantastic script if we want to overcome this. The task is incredibly high," the German said.

Carlo Ancelotti said Real Madrid will not under-estimate Chelsea. "Chelsea are here to bring the fight to us. It will be tough for them of course but they will try. Good teams never give up," Ancelotti said in a press conference.

"I know my players very well," said Ancelotti. "They are well aware of what happened a few weeks ago (against Barca) and what is required tomorrow. We won't be under-estimating anyone. This is a great opportunity to reach the semis but Chelsea are a very good team. We have to respect them."

"It's the only way we can prepare for this game, thinking that Chelsea will be better tomorrow and be ready. There is no other way. We are ready. We know we will have to suffer and we are ready to suffer," Ancelotti added.

Karim Benzema scored a hat-trick against Chelsea last week, with the Frenchman now on 42 goals in 42 games this season.

His scintillating form comes in stark contrast to Chelsea's Romelu Lukaku, who cost the club 115 million euros (\$125 million) last summer but has fallen out of favour under Tuchel.

"Karim has to be a modern striker," Ancelotti said. "In the old

days strikers would hang around the box and just tap the ball in when they could. Now they have to do more.

"Modern strikers don't just score the tap-ins. They have to defend. They have to fight. In my opinion Karim is the model modern striker."

Meanwhile, Bayern Munich will deliver against Villarreal in their Champions League quarter-final second leg on Tuesday despite a bad first-leg performance because too much is at stake, Bayern coach Julian Nagelsmann said on Monday.

The Bavarians suffered their first defeat in the competition this season, losing 1-0 in Spain last week with Villarreal the dominant side after also hitting the woodwork and missing several chances to score more goals.

"We played a bad game and they played their best game," Nagelsmann told a virtual news conference. "This will not happen again, to play badly against the same opponent twice."

Time to focus on long-term solutions

Say experts

Farmers of Sunamganj, Kishoreganj, Netrakona and Sylhet grow Boro on around 4 lakh hectares every year, but the government has been spending money on the vital levees that protect them on a piecemeal basis. They produce paddy worth over Tk 7,500 crore yearly and the government this year has spent just Tk 159 crore on the levees that save their fields from flash floods. Experts and activists for years have been saying that it is high time to focus on long-term solutions like river dredging as short-term solutions like constructing levees is not working due to their poor quality. Zaheed Farooque, state minister for water resources, at a press conference in Dhaka yesterday said a project

Outrage over torture of schoolboy

Video of the incident goes viral

Video footage of a child being tied to a pole and tortured by a shopkeeper has shocked many in Chuadanga town. In the clip that went viral on Facebook, Ali Ahmed is seen hitting the boy in school uniform with a stick. Ahmed later told reporters that he thought the boy had stolen Tk 5 from his shop in the Dost area. He left the 5th grader of Dost Government Primary School tied to the pole for nearly three hours in scorching heat until the head teacher of his school, Momin Hossain, came to rescue him. The boy told this correspondent that he went to the shop on lunch break to buy some snacks. But he didn't like the ones at the shop and was about to leave when Ahmed's 13-year-old daughter accused him of stealing Tk 5 from their shop. Within moments, several other shopkeepers tied him to a pole, he added. Ahmed came to the shop a little later and started slapping him and hitting him with a stick. The boy said he went to the shop with a coin of Tk 5 which was his pocket money. But the shopkeepers insisted that he had stolen it. Hearing the news from locals, head teacher Momin rushed to the spot and rescued the boy. Contacted, shopkeeper Ahmed said the torture was justified. AHM Lutful Kabir, officer-in-charge of Darshana Police Station, said legal action will be taken if someone presses charges.

SRI LANKA ECONOMIC CRISIS

3 parties seek interim govt with new PM

Three political parties that recently withdrew from Sri Lanka's ruling coalition have proposed forming an interim government with a new prime minister replacing President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's older brother, they said yesterday. Facing an economic crisis and dragged down by debt, the island nation of 22 million people is running short of power, fuel, food and medicines due to a lack of foreign exchange for imports. It has reached out to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and countries such as India and China for urgent financial help. Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa called for patience and announced the reinstatement of a critical fertiliser subsidy for farmers. "The president and I are spending every moment to formulate solutions on how to get Sri Lanka out of this current crisis," he said in a televised address, as protesters camped outside the president's office for

the third consecutive day. President Rajapaksa dissolved his cabinet last week and called for a unity government to help tackle the crisis, as 41 lawmakers walked out of the ruling coalition to become independents in the 225-seat parliament. The government has said it retains a majority in the house.

Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa called for patience and announced the reinstatement of a critical fertiliser subsidy for farmers.

Three parties represented by 16 of the lawmakers told reporters that they had met the president and the prime minister and that more talks were scheduled for today. "The main proposal is to have an all-party committee to make key decisions and the appointment of a new prime minister and a limited Cabinet," said Udaya Gammanpila, chief of

the Jathika Hela Urumaya party. "We want this before a new election. We have to reverse shortages and stabilise the economy." Sri Lanka's next parliamentary election is not due until 2025. The Sri Lanka Freedom Party (SLFP), with 14 lawmakers, said the independents would speak with other political parties to come to a consensus, as the government prepares to hold loan discussions with the IMF next week. "Talks with the IMF will need a stable government capable of implementing clear policies," SLFP General Secretary Dayasiri Jayasekera said. "This is necessary to repair the economy and bring relief to the people." In his address, the prime minister said the government would reintroduce a critical fertiliser subsidy to assist farmers who have been hit by crop losses after a ban on chemical fertilisers last year. Sri Lankans, holding street demonstrations for more than a month, have focused their anger on the Rajapaksa dynasty.

Biman plane tugged into another

Both aircraft out of service with damage

A Dubai bound flight of Biman Bangladesh Airlines was forced to reschedule on Sunday after the aircraft hit the tail of another when entering the hangar after completing regular maintenance. Both the aircraft – Boeing 737-800 and Boeing 777-300ER – were left with scratches after the collision on Sunday at the Dhaka airport and are now out of commission. This is the third such incident in two months, raising questions about the national flag carrier's fleet maintenance. The accidents are due to carelessness, aviation experts said. On February 15, a Boeing 737 aircraft of Biman was brought back from Malaysia after a windshield crack was noticed mid-air en route to Kuala Lumpur. On March 6, another Boeing was damaged when a bird hit an engine of the plane during landing at Sylhet MAG Osmani International Airport. With the recent accident, as many as four aircraft out of a fleet of 21 are grounded – a development that will leave Biman's flight schedule in disorder, according to the airline's officials. For instance, the Dubai flight had to be

Scientists reverse ageing in human cells by 30yrs

Researchers have reversed ageing in human skin cells by 30 years, according to a new study. Scientists say they have developed a method to time jump human skin cells by three decades – longer than previous reprogramming methods, rewinding the ageing clock without the cells losing their function. Researchers describe being able to partly restore the function of older cells, as well as renew the biological age. According to the study, in experiments that simulated a skin wound, the partially rejuvenated cells showed signs of behaving more like youthful cells. Experts suggest that, while in their early stages, the findings could eventually revolutionise regenerative medicine, especially if it can be replicated in other cell types. Professor Wolf Reik, a group leader in the Epigenetics research programme who has recently moved to lead the Altos Labs Cambridge Institute, said: "This work has very exciting implications. "Eventually, we may be able to identify genes that rejuvenate without reprogramming, and

RUSSIA-UKRAINE WAR

Energy, commodity prices may rise in Asia

Experts say at ANN webinar co-presented by Star, Philippine Daily Inquirer

Escalating global geopolitical tensions arising from Russia's invasion of Ukraine could spill over to Asia through sharper-than-expected increases in energy and other commodity prices, said experts yesterday. "There are several risk factors that really cloud the horizon despite our overall somewhat optimistic take on Asia's economy going forward," said Albert Park, chief economist of the Asian Development Bank, in a webinar hosted by the Asia News Network (ANN). The Daily Star and the Philippine Daily Inquirer, both members of ANN, an alliance of 20 national media in 19 Asian countries, co-presented the webinar on the "impacts of food and energy crises on Asia" due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine. It was the second of a series of webinars

hosted by ANN on the Ukraine crisis. In his presentation styled "Managing Asia's Economies during Troubling Times", Park said "aggressive tightening" by the US could trigger financial market volatility, capital outflows and currency depreciation, raising financial stability risks in the region. The emergence of more deadly Covid-19 variants and China's current Omicron outbreak could jeopardise regional growth and supply chains. Besides, scarring effects of learning losses from continued school closures and high youth unemployment rates could affect future productivity, he added. Park, however, stressed that Asian countries need to continue investing in digitalisation, green energy and human capital to support sustained growth despite all other challenges that they are facing.
