Facebook parent Meta opening first physical store

Meta, Facebook's parent company, is opening its very first physical store in Burlingame, California, US. Officially announced by Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg on his Facebook page, the store is opening on May 9.

Aside from selling Meta-branded products, the store will be promoting Meta's virtual reality project, Quest 2.

Meta Quest 2 is the rebranded name of Oculus Ouest 2, a series of virtual reality headsets developed by the VR hardware company Oculus. The rebranding took place after Meta bought Oculus for \$2 billion in 2014.

Meta Quest headsets can run virtual simulations and VR games, many of which were recently announced in the Meta Quest Gaming Showcase, hosted April 20. Among Us VR, Red Matter 2 and The Walking Dead: Saints & Sinners - Chapter 2: Retribution are some VR games slated to launch in the



Metaverse within the next year.

In the photos of the new store Zuckerberg shared on social media, he demonstrated how Meta Quest 2 can be used to project what the wearer is experiencing on a big wall.

According to Zuckerberg, the projection wall is "a great way to see how Meta products connect people today". He says that this store is a big first step towards building the

Samsung Bangladesh has recently launched the Galaxy A23, the latest addition to its A-Series.

Samsung Galaxy A23 features a Snapdragon 680 2.4GHz+1.9GHz Octa-core processor, Samsung One UI 4.1 powered by Android 12. The device boasts 128GB ROM storage alongside 6GB RAM.

Samsung Galaxy A23 also features Samsung Knox Security and a Sensor Side Fingerprint.

It has a 6.6-inch Infinity V-Cut display with a 90Hz refresh rate. The

Corning Gorilla Glass 5 ensures its durability. The Galaxy A23 also has a 5000mAh battery and supports 25W Super-fast charging.

The device has a quad-camera setup, consisting of a 50MP OIS primary camera, 5MP ultra-wide camera, 2MP depth camera and 2MP macro camera, as well as an 8MP front camera.

Samsung Galaxy A23 comes in three colours: blue, peach and black. It is currently available at Tk. 25,599/- in Samsung outlets.

Changes we can expect in Twitter after Musk's takeover

Removal/revision of shadow ban rules: Since Musk is an advocate of free speech, he might consider revising or removing 'shadow bans' altogether. Currently, Twitter can delete your posts without any notification and also block or 'shadow ban' you if you disobey the community

guidelines, effectively removing you from the platform.

Spam control: The Tesla CEO said on April 14 that one of his top priorities for Twitter would be to eliminate "spam and scam bots and the bot armies", including those connected to crypto scams.

All things considered, Musk's buyout of Twitter consolidates his remarkable business portfolio as the world's richest man adds another feather to his cap with the latest acquisition of the microblogging giant.
