Mother, two children found dead in Narsingdi

Police recovered slit-throat bodies of a mother and her two children from their residence in Belabo upazila of Narsingdi yesterday.

The bodies of Rahima Begum (36), wife of Gias Uddin Sheikh, and their son Rabbi Sheikh (12) and daughter Rakiba Sheikh (7) were recovered from Babla village around 8:00am, said Safayet Hossain Palash, officer-in-charge of Belabo Police Station.

Quoting the family members, the OC said the three might have been killed following a conflict over a disputed land.

Family members said Gias Uddin Sheikh worked as house painter at Kapasia upazila of Gazipur district. The assailants might

Nurjahan Begum's 6th death anniversary today

In the tumultuous times of the 1940s, when women, particularly belonging to conservative Muslim families, were mostly absent in the public sphere, weekly magazine Begum emerged to give them a voice of their own. Established by renowned journalist and Saogat editor Mohammad Nasiruddin, in 194 $\bar{7}$, the weekly was run by her daughter Nurjahan.

And thus, the girl who started handson-training on journalism by assisting her father at Saogat's office, went on to become

the first female journalist of the country, and a pioneer of female journalism in South Asia.

On her sixth death anniversary, Nurjahan Begum's granddaughter Priota Iftekhar remembered her with great fondness. "Nanu's mementoes have always given

me strength and courage in the toughest of times. I'm trying to preserve her awards, clothes and Begum's old copies in my residence as best as I can," said Priota.

However, no collective effort is in action to preserve her memories. Most of her

belongings were given to National Museum for security reasons, who failed to keep them on display due to lack of space.

Born in Chalitatali of Chandpur on June 4, 1925, Nurjahan, at the age of four, moved to Kolkata, where her father, renowned journalist and editor of the monthly Saogat, Mohammad Nasiruddin worked. She was initially admitted into Baby Class Sakhawat Memorial School upon Begum Rokeya's request.

Begum's first issue was published on July 20, 1947. For the first four months,

Says survey

The width of the river Karnaphuli, which is known as the lifeline of the port city, has decreased at the Shah Amanat Bridge point, according to a survey conducted by Chattogram Nodi o Khal Raksha Andolon.

The organisation conducted the survey from March to April.

Its secretary Aliur Rahman presented the survey report during a press conference at Chattogram Press Club yesterday.

According to the Bangladesh Survey (BS), the width of the river at the Shah Amanat Bridge point used to be 930 metres. However, it currently stands at 410 metres, said the survey by Chattogram Nodi o Khal Raksha Andolon.

The survey also found that the depth of the river has been continuously decreasing. The depth at the mouth of Chaktai canal is only two feet. Landmasses have emerged at several points of the river, it added.

Environmentalist Prof Noman Siddique, river researcher Idris Ali and member of the organisation Pear Ali were present at the press conference, among others.

When it rains, farmers in haor suffer

Salvaged crops damaged, submerged ones yet to be salvaged

"When the first signs of rain came, I harvested the paddy in a hurry. But now, four days

since the downpour, I've lost both my house and the paddy. I don't know how I'll harvest the rest of it. We're in

> Shafik Mia, a farmer from the Lalpur area of Sunamganj Sadar upazila, said while talking to this correspondent recently.

Sayed Mia of Rayanagar village in Doarabazar upazila said, "I cultivated four acres of paddy but I couldn't bring a single stalk home. Some of the paddy is still submerged in water. I harvested some paddy but they rotted due to the incessant rain. Now we're sitting helpless."

Due to continuous rains and water from the hills, the water level in the haors and rivers is increasing. The water is entering the lowlands of

In Lalpur, Gaurarang and Sahebbari Ghat area of Sunamganj, houses have been flooded due to the rising water level of nearby waterbodies.

Jamila Begum, a farmer of Lalpur area, said, "I could collect paddy from only one acre of land out of three acres that were submerged in water. Now this collected paddy is also wet. I've tried to dry the paddy for three days, but to no avail since they've started to germinate."

The farmers near the Haor area are in dire straits also because of the rising prices of commodities in the market. Even if there's rice is in the house, they're struggling to buy oil, salt and vegetables.

Farmer Rothi Das said, "Even if the government fixes the price of paddy, we won't be able to sell it at this price due to the loss incurred."

According to the district agriculture extension

department, boro paddy was planted in 2 lakh 22 thousand 805 hectares of land in 137 haors in Sunamganj. About 6,000 hectares of crops have been damaged in 20 small and large haors in April.

The paddy inside the haor has been harvested. But now 9,000 hectares of land in the upper part of the haor is left, which will take another 15 days to harvest. The floods have inundated 650 hectares of paddy land. Besides, 60 hectares of almonds, 48 hectares of aus paddy seedbed and 40 hectares of land were damaged.

Bimal Chandra Some, deputy director of the district agriculture extension department, said due to continuous rain, people were unable to dry paddy. If wet paddy is stored in the house for more than a week, it can get spoiled. If the water recedes quickly, the submerged paddy will not be

Sunamganj Deputy Commissioner Jahangir Hossain said the flood victims have been listed and assistance is being provided to them accordingly.
