The main challenge for the power sector would be providing uninterrupted power at an affordable cost, Hamid said. But it is unlikely that

would happen in another 5-6 years as it entails huge outlays. "If we go for ensuring

uninterrupted power supply, the entire power distribution and transmission lines will have to go underground. Those are very costly projects," he said, adding that it would cost Tk 16,000 crore to take the system underground in Purbachal alone.

US has concerns

rights. Following repeated requests from Bangladesh for lifting the sanctions, Haas recently said they want "concrete steps" by the government.

"It is not really the question of providing a list of things that must be accomplished. It is about those two principles [accountability and reforms in Rab] that need to be held in order for those who have been sanctioned to request relief from the US," the diplomat said yesterday.

Haas said the US gives utmost importance to holding free, fair and transparent election in Bangladesh in line with the international standards. He said freedom of press, lack of violence and the Election Commission's capacity of overseeing are some of the important factors for holding a fair election.

"This is a job of the Bangladesh government, people, media and the civil society to create conditions for a free and fair election," he said, adding it is important to remain vigilant as people are already talking about elections.

The envoy said he has raised concerns with the Bangladesh authorities publicly and privately when it comes to democracy and human rights, especially extrajudicial killings and enforced disappearances, press freedom, especially the Digital Security Act, and several draft laws and regulations that could inhibit press freedom.

The US also has concerns about insufficient labour rights and poor working conditions that cost Bangladesh access to the US Generalised System of Lanka, though it has other

Preferences (GSP) in 2013, challenges including high while Bangladesh is also missing out on investment capital from the US International Development

Finance Corporation. "As Bangladesh is going to become a middle-income country, it is important labour rights, freedom to association and forming unions," Haas said.

He said he has discussed with the foreign ministry for creating a catalogue on the outstanding issues between the two countries so that they can work more effectively to address those.

Recently, the US has announced formation Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF) with 12 countries. Haas said the IPEF is designed to take into account what the 21st century economic landscape would look like.

The various aspects of IPEF are: making supply chain resilient, digital and emerging trade technologies, clean energy and decarbonisation and preventing corruption, which are quite important for Bangladesh. As its membership expands, the diplomat expressed optimism that Bangladesh will consider joining it.

Asked if Bangladesh was at any risk of falling into a debt trap like Sri Lanka did, Haas said Bangladesh has a strong macro-economic management and a substantial foreign currency reserve. It is also careful about borrowing from international financers.

The amount of foreign debt to China is relatively small, but it is bigger to the ADB, the World Bank and Japan, the diplomat said, adding that the situation in Bangladesh will not be like that of Sri
