POWER INTERRUPTION Nasrul Hamid blames it on trees

State Minister for Power Nasrul Hamid yesterday in parliament blamed the excessive number of trees in rural areas for hindering uninterrupted power supply.

Responding to a tabled question of Jatiya Party MP Rustam Ali Farazi, the junior minister said, "There is no deficit of power production, when the country's demand is taken into account. As a result, there is no loadshedding due to any deficit."

In response to a query from Awami League MP Mahfuzur Rahman, Hamid said before 2009, only 47 percent of citizens could avail facilities that use electricity.

He said work is underway to bring 100 percent of people under electrification in areas under Bangladesh Power Development Board. "That work is expected to be completed by June 2023.'

Meanwhile, replying to a question from ruling party MP M Abdul Latif, Industries Minister Nurul Majid Mahmud Humayun said 4,095 tonnes of paper produced by Karnaphuli Paper Mills remained unsold

4 killed, 4 hurt in road accidents

Four people were killed and four injured in road accidents in three districts yesterday, according to reports from our correspondents.

In Chattogram, two people were killed and two injured in a collision between a truck and a rickshaw in Mirasarai

Mohammed Rubel (30) and rickshaw-puller Md Yousuf (40) died on the spot, said Sufal Chandra, sub-inspector of Zorarganj Police Station.

In Patuakhali, a UP member was killed and another injured as a motorcycle they were riding fell on a road in Sadar upazila. The accident took place on Patuakhali-Kuakata highway after the rider lost control over the vehicle while he was trying to save a pedestrian, said

Hanif Gazi (52), member of ward-2 of Amkhola in Galachipa, died on the spot.

In Panchagarh, a motorcyclist was killed and his son injured in a collision with a truck. Jahirul Islam (50) died instantly. His son Anamul Haque (35) was undergoing treatment at a hospital.

Scale up Rohingya repatriation efforts Bangladesh urges UN

Bangladesh has urged the UN to scale up its programme and create conducive conditions in the Rakhine State of Myanmar for Rohingya repatriation, arguing that the efforts on Bangladesh's side alone will not bring about any lasting solution to the problem.

"Actions and programmes are needed in Myanmar, to create the conditions conducive for the return of this population, in dignity, to their homes. And that is the most desired durable solution and the aspiration of the Rohingyas themselves," said Bangladesh's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador Rabab Fatima.

She was addressing the UN General Assembly in New York yesterday following the briefing by Dr Noeleen Heyzer, the Special Envoy of the UN Secretary General on

Besides, at the fifth meeting of the Joint Working Group (JWG) on the repatriation of Rohingyas held virtually yesterday, Bangladesh also stressed on ensuring security, livelihood and wellbeing of the returnees.

Foreign Secretary Masud Bin Momen led Bangladesh side and Myanmar's Foreign Ministry Permanent Secretary U Chan Aye led the Myanmar side in the meeting.

"Both sides agreed to work on addressing verification related problems and holding regular meetings of the Joint Working Group (JWG) and Technical Working Group for early commencement of repatriation," according to a statement of the foreign ministry.

Cuet closed for 22 days Amid student unrest,

authorities order them to vacate hall

Chittagong University of Engineering and Technology (Cuet) has been closed for 22 days till vesterday due to the ongoing student unrest on campus over the last few days. The university announced the closure through a notice signed by its Registrar Prof Dr Farooq-uz-Zaman Chowdhury.

According to the notification, a meeting chaired by the vice chancellor announced that undergraduate academic activities will remain suspended till July 5. All examinations scheduled to be held during this period have been postponed and residential halls will remain closed also.

The male students have been asked to vacate the halls by 5pm today, while female students by 10:00am today (June 15,

DARSHANA-MEHERPUR VIA MUJIBNAGAR

Tk 2,000cr needed for new rail link

Bangladesh Railway (BR) will have to spend over Tk 2,000 crore to build a rail line from Darshana to Meherpur via Mujibnagar, the historic place where the first Bangladesh government took oath in 1971.

Construction of a 34.5-km main line along with a 10-km loop line would cost Tk 2,058.51 crore, according to the recently completed feasibility

There would be six stations along the line -- at Darshana, Bastopur, Kanaidanga, Mujibnagar, Monakhali and Meherpur.

The information came to light as project officials made an elaborate presentation on the scheme at a meeting on Saturday at a city hotel, where BR Director General Dhirendra Nath Mazumder and other top officials were present.

"We've completed the feasibility study and detailed designs for the line and hope to submit a full report soon," Project Director Ariful Islam told The Daily Star vesterday.

He said the feasibility study found the project "economically viable", but the government has to give subsidies to make the project "financially viable".

"Now the higher authorities will take a decision on whether an investment project would be taken to build the line." he added. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in April 2011 gave

an announcement to build a rail line to connect Meherpur with Darshana, which did not see any visible progress till 2018. In September 2018, BR took up a project for

conducting a feasibility study and preparing a detailed design for the line at a cost of Tk 12.48 Although the project's deadline was in August

2020, authorities in March 2020 signed a contract with an Australia-Bangladesh joint-venture company for the job.

The authorities had to spend a long time to finalise the alignment of the line following a dispute raised by local representatives, BR sources said. Besides, the pandemic delayed preparatory

DARSHANA-MEHERPUR RAIL LINK

As per the study, 56 km of rail tracks have to be installed, of which 34.5 km would be the main line, 10 km the loop line and 3.5 km the side lines. Besides, the existing 6.6 km line has to be replaced.

There would be three major bridges -- one over Mathabhanga river and two over the Bhairab river and 63 culverts along the line.

The authorities have to acquire around 421 acres of land to implement the project.

BR sources said funding may be a major

challenge for the rail line's construction. Although it will connect Mujibnagar, which is historically significant for Bangladesh, no financier

has yet shown interest in the project, they said. In that case, the government may build the line with its own fund, they added.

The Daily Star could not get in touch with BR director general for comments, despite repeated attempts over phone and texts.


