

Mohiuddin Ahmed no more

Former secretary, diplomat, and freedom fighter Mohiuddin Ahmed passed away yesterday at his Uttara home in Dhaka after a prolonged illness.

Mohiuddin (80) was undergoing treatment at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University and returned home four days ago. He left behind his wife and two daughters.

The diplomat was the first in Europe to join the Liberation War while he was the second secretary at the High Commission of Pakistan in London.

He expressed his allegiance to Bangladesh by addressing a public gathering at Trafalgar Square on the first day of August 1971. It was a huge protest rally that was held under the banner “Stop Genocide: Recognise Bangladesh.”

During his career, Mohiuddin served in different capacities at Bangladesh missions in Delhi, Geneva, Jakarta, Jeddah, and New York and as a secretary at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and principal at the Foreign Service Academy.

Commuters suffer as usual

Delayed drain construction making Durgabari Road non-functional

The suspension of a drain's construction in Mymensingh's Durgabari Road has been causing immense difficulties to hundreds of commuters.

Locals cannot even pass the area on foot due to construction materials being scattered all over the place. The non-functionality of the busy road has put students of Mahakali Girls School and College and the devotees and visitors to Durgabari Temple into a great inconvenience.

According to locals, the situation is getting even worse due to the frequent rainfalls in the last few days.

The construction has remained halted for more than a week now, according to local trader Kamal Mia. Durgabari resident Sukumar Das said Mymensingh City Corporation (MCC) is yet to take any step in this regard.



Moreover, construction materials for a high-rise building adjacent to the drain site have been lying on the road for months. Locals alleged that the authorities have not paid any attention to their sufferings.

Contacted, MCC executive engineer Md Rafiqul Islam said Masud Hightech, a construction firm from Dhaka, was appointed to construct the drain as part of the city's package construction

programme.

The firm was asked to complete the work immediately but a month has already passed since that, said the executive engineer.

“We would immediately contact the officials of the firm and instruct them to complete the construction as soon as possible,” he added.

The contractor could not be contacted for comments, despite repeated attempts.

Court refuses Foolproof security

Family rejects police probe

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Magistrate Muhammad Asaduzzaman Nur fixed August 3 for the next hearing.

Investigation Officer Kazi Shariful Islam, also an inspector of the Detective Branch, on June 19 submitted a charge sheet against victim's husband Iftekhar Abedin and his parents--Mohammad Amin, retired army personnel, and Shirin Amin to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's

Court of Dhaka.

In the charge sheet, the IO said the charges brought against them of abetting the victim to take her own life were primarily proved and they should be brought under trial for their alleged involvement.

Iftekhar is now in jail, while his parents are on bail.

Elma, a final year student of the dance department at DU, was allegedly tortured to death at her in-laws'

residence in Banani on December 14 last year. Elma married Iftekhar, who lives in Canada, six months ago from the date of her death and used to stay with her husband's family.

Her in-laws took her to United Hospital on December 14 last year where doctors declared her dead. Following her death, her father filed a murder case against Iftekhar and his parents with Banani Police Station.

No respite in sight for residents

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waterlogged blocks of Chawkbazar area, said the mayor's assistant personal secretary Md Mostafa Kamal.

“The situation has worsened. There has been a power outage of nine hours till 3:00pm. We have been stuck in our apartments,” said Saima Alam, assistant professor of Chattogram University and resident of Halishahar's Shantibagh.

Mobarak Ali, president of CCC Standing Committee to Prevent Water Logging, said excessive rainfall, high tide, the rise of water level in Karnaphuli and

blocked drains and canals are responsible for the waterlogging.

He also mentioned that several CCC teams with excavators got engaged and started clearing out the blocked drains and canals to direct the rainwater towards Karnaphuli.

Meanwhile, internal transportation of Chattogram University (CU), i.e. the operations of buses and shuttle trains, were disrupted due to landslides at several places on the campus on Sunday night caused by the two-day long rain.

Several departments

cancelled their classes, while the zoology department had to postpone their exams.

In Rangamati, a flash flood from the hill upstream has inundated Bhghaichari, Jurichari and Barkol areas. The rising water level in Kaptai lake has compelled the authority to suspend the operations of water vessels on the lake for an indefinite period.

Ten shelter centres have been opened in Khagrachari municipal area, where landslides also occurred. However, no casualty was reported.

Meanwhile, 2,036 cases have been filed in the mobile court run by the DGDA and a fine of Tk 2.67 crore has been realised on charges of producing and marketing fake, contaminated and

unregistered medicine.

In response to another query from M Abdul Latif, the minister said no medical personnel can refuse emergency medical services to anyone taken to hospitals, clinics or doctors.

Replying to a question by BNP MP Gulam Mohammad Siraj, Maleque said steps would be taken to introduce separate units in government hospitals of all districts to provide medical services to addicts in future.

The HC on April 10 granted ad-interim bail to Zakirul in a counterfeited case. On May 24, Zakirul appeared before the court of Jamalpur's Additional District and Sessions Judge Jinnat Jahan Jhunu for bail. But, Jhunu rejected his petition without any explanation.

On June 6, Zakirul's lawyer Md Sarwar Alam brought the matter to the notice of the HC bench, and on that day, the bench on a suo motu (voluntary) move directed Jhunu to appear before it yesterday for an explanation.

Deputy Attorney General Abul Hashem represented the state during the proceedings of the matter.

Flood fear fuels

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Mohammad Anowar Hossain, another boat trader, said the boat price ranges between Tk 3,500 to Tk 15,000.

“We make a boat with Chambal tree wood, since boats made of Garjan wood is very costly. These boats last for two to three years,” he said.

Abdur Rahman (75), a boat man who operates

on the Norai canal from Meradia ghat to Trimohoni since 1988, said he also purchased a boat in the first week of May at a cost of Tk 20,000.

“The water on the Norai canal which joins Balu river in the downstream is increasing. There is a chance of flood in the low-lying areas if the water level increases,” he said.
