Boris Johnson resigns after party revolt

FROM PAGE 1 MPs moving against him, while paying tribute to the "brilliant Darwinian system" that caused his downfall. "Them's the breaks," he added. The prime minister said he had "appointed a cabinet to serve, as I will, until a new leader is in place", pointing to a sense of duty and obligation to the public.

However, senior Conservative MPs are pushing back against the idea that Johnson should be allowed to stay in office for any longer and want to see an interim leader in place, such as Dominic Raab. Labour also said it would force a confidence vote on the prime minister unless he stepped down from No 10 in short order.

"It was a short and bizarre resignation speech which didn't mention the word resign or resignation once. There was no apology, no contrition," Conservative lawmaker

Andrew Bridgen said. Conservative leadership election will take place over the summer and the victor will replace Johnson by the party's annual conference

The process could take weeks or months. Details of the process will be announced next week, reports Reuters. A snap YouGov poll found that

defence minister Ben Wallace was the favourite among Conservative members replace followed by Johnson, junior trade minister Penny Mordaunt and former finance minister Rishi Sunak. Keir Starmer, leader

of the main opposition Labour Party, said he would call a parliamentary confidence vote if the Conservatives did not remove Johnson at once.

The crisis comes as Britons are facing the tightest squeeze on their finances in decades, in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic, with soaring inflation, and the economy forecast to be the weakest among major nations in 2023 apart from Russia.

Support drained away from Johnson as more than 50 ministers and government aides resigned in a rolling walkout, while

backbenchers declared no confidence in his leadership.

The revolt began on Tuesday evening with the resignations of Sajid Javid and Rishi Sunak as health secretary and chancellor respectively.
