## Kings ignite celebrations with revenge victory

Having confirmed their third Bangladesh Premier League title on the trot in their previous game, Bashundhara Kings readied their home venue to celebrate the glory and ahead of their match against Abahani yesterday and the celebrations were kicked off in raucous fashion after a 3-2 win over the Sky Blues in their penultimate league match at the Bashundhara Kings Arena yesterday.

The triumph against Abahani was not only further evidence of Kings' consistent performances, but also served as revenge against the Sky Blues, who beat Kings 3-0 in the Independence Cup final in the season's first meeting before a 2-2 draw in the first league meeting of the season.

Six-time champions Abahani looked on course for a rare domestic treble after winning the Independence Cup and Federation Cup to start the season, but Bashundhara Kings shattered that dream by clinching their hattrick of league titles with two games in hand.

Yesterday's tie was merely a battle for prestige, but Kings were determined to celebrate the championship with a win against Bangladesh's most successful outfit and they came out successfully, courtesy of a strong bench.

The tie itself was once again an ill-tempered affair, with



players on both sides losing their tempers and becoming embroiled in scuffles, forcing the referee to book players on

Abahani had the lion's share of procession and created more opportunities but Kings had the final laugh with their lethal finishing, capitalising on three of five chances. Abahani could cash in on only two of their 10 chances, thanks to a bold performance from goalkeeper Anisur Rahman Zico.

Zico denied Daniel Colindres in the second minute before Gambian forward Nuha Marong gave the hosts a 20th-minute lead with a glancing header.

Dorielton Gomes then set up Rakib Hossain to drive home from the right side of the box to level the margin for Abahani added time of the first half.

Abahani kept creating chances one after another after resumption, but their forwards squandered those opportunities before Kings coach Oscar Bruzon made four chances to bolster his side's spirt.

Robson restored the lead with a lethal finish from the right side in the 71st minute before making it 3-1 by chipping the ball over the goalkeeper, who had ventured to the edge of his box during a three-on-one counter in stoppage time to kill off the game.

Brazilian Raphael Augusto reduced the margin with his second effort from the spot but it was too late to stop Kings, who began their celebrations in fine fashion at home with fireworks and the presence of the players' families, club officials and fans.

### Ali's 'Rumble' belt fetches \$6.18m

Boxing legend Muhammad Ali's championship belt from his 1974 "Rumble in the Jungle" victory over George Foreman has been purchased by Indianapolis Colts owner Jim Irsay for \$6.18 million.

Noted memorabilia collector Irsay announced the purchase Sunday on Twitter, saying he was "proud to be the steward" of the historic World Boxing Council belt.

Irsay hinted the item might be shown at an August show of his collection in Chicago as well as in September at Indianapolis.

The sale price early Sunday through Heritage Auctions, reported by Sports Collectors Daily, was called among the highest prices ever paid for a sports memorabilia item.

Ali upset previously undefeated Foreman in Kinshasa, Zaire (now the Democratic Republic of Congo) with an eighth-round knockout to reclaim the world heavyweight crown.

Ali, who died in 2016 at age 74, kept the WBC crown until losing to Leon Spinks in 1978.

The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) arranged a get-together and lunch for cricketers at a city hotel today and, although members of the team management downplayed the significance of the 'special' lunch ahead of the Tigers' tour of Zimbabwe, scraping past the surface the motive may have been to communicate some issues to the senior stars who might have been left a bit disappointed with the BCB's refurbishment of the T20I line-up for the upcoming T20I series.

Current decisions are in line with the BCB's aim to give more immunity to the young leader and the rest of the young side, away from the seniors' dispositions or lack of agreement on leadership issues in the shortest format.

The discussions in the get together also ensured that players act more professionally in the face of disappointments due to lack of form or omissions from the squad. The lunch was also a means for the team to bond through the changes taking place as the BCB did not tinker with the experienced ODI outfit for the Zimbabwe tour, where both Riyad and Mushfiqur were included.

"It's not a big deal. It was a special lunch to encourage the Tigers. We will hold such gatherings more going forward. It's mainly to inspire players who may be going through hard times. We also talked about keeping responsibility to make younger their distance from criticism on social media or elsewhere," BCB

Ramesh Mendis led an inspired Sri Lanka spin attack to leave Pakistan in trouble at 191-7 in reply to the hosts' 378 on day two of the second Test on Monday

The tourists, who lead the two-match series 1-0, ended the day still trailing Sri Lanka by 187 runs in their first innings at Galle.

Agha Salman resisted the bowling attack with his maiden Test fifty but fell to Prabath Jayasuriya's left-arm spin for 62 in the final moments of play before stumps was called.

Jayasuriya got Salman caught at slip with a drifter coming into the right-handed batsman.

Salman, who made his debut in the previous match, put on 46 runs with Yasir Shah, batting on 13, to lift Pakistan from 145-6.

Ramesh rattled Pakistan's middle-order with his off-spin bowling on a pitch expected to turn more from day three onwards.

Pakistan suffered from a lack of partnerships after losing first-match hero Abdullah Shafique for a duck and skipper Babar Azam for 16 on either side of the lunch break.

Jayasuriya, who took 21 wickets in his first two Tests, bowled Azam on a turning delivery that got the edge of the dangerman's bat to crash onto the
