

RU student held over death of wife

Police yesterday arrested a Rajshahi University student in a case filed for killing his wife, also a student of the university.

Arrestee Abdullah Ishtiaq Rabbi is a student of applied mathematics department, said Anwar Ali Tuhin, officer in-charge of Motihar Police Station.

His wife Rikta Akhter (21) was a student of law department.

Rikta's friends said the couple used to live in Rajshahi city's Dharampur area, adjacent to the university.

Quoting her husband Rabbi, they said he found Rikta hanging from a window grille on Friday night.

He took her to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital where she passed away while undergoing treatment.

OC Anwar further said Rikta's father filed a murder case accusing Rabbi yesterday.

Quoting the case statement, the OC said the couple used to have arguments often.

Rikta's father claimed that following an altercation, Rabbi killed her, said the police official.

The body was handed over to the family members after an autopsy, he said.

Talking to this correspondent, Prof Hasibul Alam Prodhan, chairman of RU law department, said, "We demand immediate action after an investigation."

Construction material blocking key M'singh road

All forms of vehicular movement on Durgabari Road, an important road in Mymensingh city, have halted due to slow construction work of a drain for over a week now.

It's uncertain how many days will be required to complete the work. There are many doctors' chambers in the area, which became inaccessible due to scattered construction materials on the road, said locals.

As there is no proper monitoring by Mymensingh City Corporation (MCC), the construction firm is continuing work as per its will, overlooking the harm caused to hundreds of residents, alleged locals.

The contractors can finish the work in the scheduled time by engaging more workers, but only a few workers were seen at the site, they said.

Talking to this correspondent, a construction worker said it would take more than a week to finish work. But no representatives of the construction site was available when this correspondent visited the area recently.

Contacted, MCC executive engineer Md Rafiqul Islam, said Masud Hightech, a Dhaka-based construction firm, is responsible for constructing the drain as part of the city's development programme.

He said the firm has no right to block the road for construction work, creating public sufferings.

"I wasn't informed about the nuisance. As I'm aware of the matter now, the construction authority will be asked to remove the materials from the road," he said.

Contacted, Nurul Amin Kalam, secretary of Mymensingh Nagorik Andolon, said contractors must keep a passage to ease traffic movement, and in no way can they block the road. This correspondent could not get in touch with any officials of Masud Hightech despite repeated attempts.

RANI THE RESILIENT

Around 30 years ago, Jatri Rani Barman came to Sunamganj town from a village with her family. Even though they came to the city with new hope, Rani lost her father when she was just a teenager.

After her father's demise, she shouldered all the responsibilities of running her family and took a job at a local tailoring shop.

She even bore the marriage expenses of her two sisters.

At one stage, she thought she should settle in her life and decided to marry her husband Hridaya Dutta.

What was supposed to be a happy beginning, turned out to be a living nightmare. Just a few days after her marriage, she found out that her husband abused drugs heavily.

"He used to torture me both mentally and physically. He was a vagabond. He didn't work and took all the money I earned. I even bought him an easy-bike, taking out loans so that he could earn some money," said Rani.

"But all my efforts went in vain. My husband kept torturing me. One day in 2018, he beat me mercilessly and left the house, never to return again," she said.

"I fell in deep trouble. But I always kept one thing in mind -- that only I hold the solution to my problems."

After her husband left, she was a wreck. She had no money left and



was not sure what she would do. The easy-bike she bought him was still there.

One morning out of desperation, Rani came out of her house and tried to operate the vehicle. But it was not an easy task. As she was driving on a narrow road she got stuck.

Slowly by surely, the resilient Rani, now 36 years old, eventually learned how to operate it and became the first female easy-bike rider in her town.

"In the beginning, I faced huge setbacks. All the people around discouraged me. Many hurled abusive words at me. But their words couldn't stop me," said Rani.

"I've been operating this vehicle for around six years now. I drive the easy-bike for around 10 to 12

hours per day. Now, most of the townspeople know me and co-operate with me," she said.

However, working so hard, Rani's physical condition has deteriorated now. The loans she took haven't been paid off yet. Still, a persistent Rani pushes on, working hard to support her family of four.

At present, she lives at a rented house in the town's Nabinagar area with her son, two daughters and her 73-year-old mother, Swetha Rani Barman.

Contacted, Sunamganj Jela Nari Parishad President Gauri Bhattacharjee said, "Rani has now become a symbol of inspiration for women. We will extend all-out cooperation and support to her."

Four killed in road accidents

A truck driver and his helper were killed after their parked vehicle was hit by another truck in Habiganj's Bahubal yesterday.

The deceased are Liton Sheikh (55) and his helper Abdul Al Nabin (20).

OC Saleh Ahmed of Sayestaganj Highway Police Station said the wheel of Liton's truck got damaged on Sylhet-Dhaka highway. As they got out to fix the wheel, another truck hit their vehicle from behind. Due to the impact, the parked truck then hit the two. Abdul died on the spot while Liton was declared dead at a local hospital.

Meanwhile in Noakhali, two people were killed in separate road accidents early yesterday.

The identities of the deceased, both in their 40s, could not be known immediately.

SI Saiful Islam of Chandraganj Highway Police said the first accident occurred at the busy Begumganj intersection and the second one near Begumganj Eye Hospital on Feni-Laxmipur regional highway.

Ensure transparency in humanitarian support: speakers

The country's local non governmental organisations (NGOs) have said that global NGOs and United Nations agencies -- which are providing humanitarian support for flood-affected people in Sylhet division -- should limit their role to providing technical assistance only and hand over the responsibility to implement projects to local stakeholders.

The Sylhet wing of BDCSO, a forum of around 700 national NGOs and civil society organisations, came up with the suggestions at a press conference yesterday.

Rezaul Karim Chowdhury, national coordinator of BDCSO Process and executive director of COAST Trust, said, UN announced \$5 million for flood victims, and this fund should not be distributed among UN agencies, Red Cross and big national NGOs.
