# Be cautious about taking up projects

Says PM, suspends Teletalk's 5G scheme to save foreign currency

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday directed the authorities concerned to be more careful about taking up projects involving foreign loans.

She, however, said implementation of projects with local funds would continue to keep the country's economy vibrant

and channel money to the poor.

Speaking at a meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec), Hasina also instructed the authorities to suspend Teletalk's Tk 236 crore 5G project to keep the country's foreign exchange reserves stable.

Briefing reporters after the meeting, Planning Minister MA Mannan said about 80 percent of the project items would have to be imported.

## Dhaka calls back its diplomat in Jakarta

Bangladesh authorities have called Kazi Anarkoly, deputy head of mission in Indonesia, back to Dhaka as she was accused of possessing marijuana at her Jakarta residence and sharing it with another foreign citizen.

"She has already been called back and we have started investigating the allegations," said State Minister for Foreign Affairs Shahriar Alam.

Talking to journalists yesterday, he also said the standard of foreign cadres was very high and such allegations were extremely embarrassing.

"If the allegations are proved, stern actions will be taken against the official. We will not compromise," he said. On July 5, Indonesian police raided Anarkoly's Jakarta

flat and found marijuana. She remained detained for a few hours but was later

released as the Bangladesh embassy intervened, said sources at the ministry.

The foreign ministry called her back to Dhaka last week, the ministry sources added.

Asked about the legality of the Indonesian authority's raid at her residence ignoring her impunity under the Vienna Convention, State Minister Shahriar said there was nothing wrong as she was sharing the flat with a

Anarkoly shared her flat with a Nigerian citizen, said a

She is a career diplomat and has served Bangladesh missions in Hong Kong, Rome, and Los Angeles prior to her posting in Jakarta.

A United States drone strike killed Al-Qaeda chief Ayman al-Zawahiri at a hideout in Kabul, President Joe Biden said Monday, declaring "justice had been delivered" to the families of the 9/11 attacks. Zawahiri's assassination is the

biggest blow to Al-Qaeda since US special forces killed Osama bin Laden in 2011, and calls into question the Taliban's promise not to harbour militant groups.

It was the first known over-thehorizon strike by the US on a target in Afghanistan since Washington withdrew its forces from the country on August 31 last year, days after the Taliban swept back to power.

The Taliban condemned the drone strike yesterday, but made no name Zawahiri.

"Justice has been delivered and this terrorist leader is no more," Biden said in a sombre televised multiple occasions for sustained address, adding he hoped Zawahiri's death would bring "closure" to where he was ultimately struck," families of the 3,000 people killed in the US on September 11, 2001.

Early yesterday, however, Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid tweeted that an "aerial attack" was carried out. "The nature of the incident was not revealed at first," he said.

"The security and intelligence agencies of the Islamic Emirate investigated the incident and found in their preliminary investigations that the attack was carried out by American drones."

Although Biden did not mention the Taliban in his televised address, Secretary of State Antony Blinken said "by hosting and sheltering" Zawahiri, the Islamist group had "grossly violated the Doha Agreement" which paved the way for America's withdrawal.

Zabihullah, in turn, accused Washington of breaking the 2020 deal.

## Giant panda species found in Europe

Scientists have uncovered a new species of giant panda in the wetlands of Bulgaria which they say could be the "last known" and "most evolved" of the kind discovered in Europe.

Unlike its modern-day black and white relative, researchers, including those from the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences, say the

ancient species, named A. nikolovi, was not reliant purely on

"Although not a direct ancestor of the modern genus of the giant panda, it is its close relative," explains study coauthor Professor

Nikolai Spassov from the Bulgarian National Museum of Natural History.

The findings, published last week in the Journal of Vertebrate Paleontology, suggest the ancient panda likely fed on softer plant materials - aligning with the general trend toward increased reliance on plants in this group's evolutionary history.

"This discovery shows how little we still know about ancient nature and demonstrates also that historic discoveries in paleontology can lead to

unexpected results, even today," Dr Spassov said. Scientists assessed the upper carnassial tooth, and an upper canine, originally unearthed in

#### Rohingya man shot dead in Ukhiya



A 26-year-old Rohingya refugee was allegedly shot dead on Monday night at Balukhali Camp in Ūkhiya upazila of Cox's Bazaar for working as a volunteer for a private organisation, police said.

The dead is Nurul Amin, who used to work as a volunteer in the camp for a private organisation, said Mohammad Ali, OC of Ukhiya Police Station.

The incident occurred on Monday night in the Modhurchara area of Camp-4, he said.

"A group of Rohingyas was angry with him as he had been working as a volunteer for a private organisation. We suspect they shot him dead and fled," said the OC.
