

Port city lost 120 hills in 4 decades

Claim Environment Forum

A total of 120 hills disappeared from Chattogram city in four decades, Bangladesh Environment Forum, an environmental organisation, claimed yesterday.

In 1976, there were 32.37 square kilometers of hills in the port city and it decreased to 14.02 square kilometers in 2008, Aliur Rahman, general secretary of the forum, said in a written statement.

He was speaking at a press conference at Chattogram Press Club.

Aliur said there were 200 hills in the port city 40 years ago and 60 percent of those have disappeared now. Of them, Chattogram Development Authority (CDA) cut 15 hills due to construction of Bayezid Link Road, he claimed.

In the written statement, he also said the total hilly area

A case was filed against a local Awami League leader and his three sons on charges of assaulting three journalists and breaking their cameras in Panchagram area of Lalmonirhat yesterday. One of the victims, Anisur Rahman, Jamuna Television's Lalmonirhat correspondent, filed the case with Lalmonirhat Sadar Police Station, said OC Ershadul Alam.

The accused are Azizar Rahman Mandal (60), president of Panchagram Union unit of AL, and his three sons Sultan Mandal (37), Shahjahan Ali Mandal (28) and Saheb Ali Mandal (35).

Cumilla choked by congestion

Locals blame illegal parking, lack of monitoring as reasons

Commuters suffering in the sweltering heat on the roads, as most of them had to spend at least 30 minutes to an hour more than the usual time to reach their destinations due to gridlocks, has become a common situation in Cumilla city.

A large part of the congestion the city dwellers face each day is due to the illegal parking of buses, trucks and auto rickshaws. To make things worse, buses stop in the middle of streets to take on extra passengers instead of designated bus stops.

After visiting Chawkbazar Old Chattogram road of Cumilla recently, the eastern entry and exit point of the town, this correspondent saw a huge tailback that stretched for at least a few kilometers, if not more.

"There is no limited time for traffic congestion in the



area. It starts in the morning and continues till midnight," said Jakir Hossain, a local vendor.

However, the Jangalia bus stand of the city has been expanded and developed lately, meaning the vehicles, which had to park outside the terminal a few years ago due to lack of space and poor infrastructure, can now be stationed inside.

So people get on the buses from their designated place, which has significantly reduced traffic jams in the nearby areas.

But those using the Padurbazar Bus

Stand on the Dhaka-Chattogram Highway are not so lucky. Passengers board on and off the buses from the road in front as the terminal has not been expanded for years, triggering huge traffic snarls-ups on the busy highway.

Five Chhatra Union men hurt in BCL attack

At least five leaders and activists of Chhatra Union were injured yesterday when some BCL men allegedly attacked them during a protest programme on Sir Asutosh College campus in Boalkhali area of Chattogram. The injured are Himel Chowdhury, convenor of the college unit's Chhatra Union, Sajjad Hossain, a member of the unit and activists Yasin, Amit and Rashed.

Himel said protesting the shortage of teachers and drinking water crisis at the college, they formed a human chain in front of the main gate in the morning.

"Suddenly, a group of BCL activists attacked us when other students wanted to join our protest,"

CTG-SYLHET ROUTE

No new train in 20 years

Although the demand for railway tickets on the Chattogram-Sylhet route has been increasing every year, the authorities of Bangladesh Railway could not add a single passenger train to the route in the last two decades.

The railway authorities said they attempted to increase the number of trains in the route earlier but failed due to a crisis of coach and engine.

According to BR officials, Paharika train was started in 1986 and Udayan Express in 1998 on Sylhet-Chattogram route.

But there have been no major changes in the trains since their inception.

According to officials, two passenger trains are running daily on the route. The seats in these trains are around 1,300. Earlier, a mail train called Jalalabad Express used to run on this route but the service stopped in 2019 due to the pandemic.

Ansar Ali, divisional traffic officer of railway in Chattogram, said second class coaches are required to run the mail train. "But we have a coach crisis in this class. Besides, due to the engine



Ripon Chandra Das came to the station to buy a ticket to travel to Sylhet for business purposes. He could not get any as all the tickets were sold out.

Mozammel Hoque Chowdhury, secretary general of Jatri Kalyan Samity, said the railway's development is not balanced. As a result, despite the demand of passengers on many routes, the authorities are not increasing the number of trains.

"We demand more train on Chattogram-Sylhet route," he added.
