#### TRAWLER CAPSIZE 300 fishers rescued, 124 still missing

As of vesterday night, over 124 Patuakhali fishermen remained missing as 15 fishing trawlers capsized in the Bay of Bengal due to turbulent sea on Friday.

Of them, 112 are from Alipur area and 12 from Mohipur of Patuakhali's Kalapara upazila. Around 300 fishermen

of the trawlers that sank in the Bay near Kuakata in Patuakhali have been rescued so far, said Ansar Uddin Molla, president of Alipur Fish Traders Association.

The latter are currently in the custody of South Sundarban Fishermen and Fish Workers Union of

India. Besides, some fishers were rescued by the trawlers of the owners' association and local fishermen, said officials.

# 'We want our land, not compensation'

Mongla port authorities to dump sand on croplands amidst farmers' protests

In the pretext of increasing navigability and capacity, the Mongla Port authorities are dredging the Pashur River.

Many fear that the plan to dump sands on over 300 acres of cropland in Banishanta union of Dacope upazila will have a disastrous impact on the environment and displace at least 5,000 farmers.

Goutom Roy, a farmer of Dacope, believes he may not be able to cultivate rice next year as the government is going to take over 300 acres of agricultural land in his village, including his 50 bighas of land.

"My only source of income is now in jeopardy," said Goutom.

The excavation project at the Inner Bar of the Mongla Port Channel was approved at Ecnec on January 28, 2020.

Under the project, about 216 lakh cubic metres of soil and sand will be extracted from Pashur river. Due to the lack of land in Mongla, the soil and sand are being dumped on private lands of Dacope's Banishanta.

The port authority has already dumped sand on 700 acres of land in Chila area of Mongla under the Bagerhat district.

Although the project was supposed to end in June, it looks as if the authorities are just getting started.

Visiting the area, this correspondent saw locals protesting the move. They fear that once the port authorities take control of these

## Women behind bars, men on the run

7 held, 174 sued after clash between villagers, admin over housing project on field

Most men of Boldipara and Haldighar villages in Sirajganj's Shahzadpur upazila have gone into hiding following police raids over a clash between villagers and local administration.

After visiting these areas vesterday, this correspondent did not find many men, while the women were fearing arrests

Meanwhile, seven women were arrested yesterday on charges of attacking government officials over the construction of houses under "Ashrayon Prakalpa" on a playground in Haldighar village.

The arrestees are Selina Begum, Jhorna Khatun, Ojufa Begum, Hosneara Begum, Maleka Begum, Aklima Khatun and Safia Begum, all hailing from Boldipara village.

The development comes after a government official named Md Abdul Hai filed a case against 174 people with Shahzadpur police station over the incident, confirmed officer-in-charge of the station Nazrul Islam. "Drives are underway to arrest others," he added.

The officer also said that the men of the villages are on the run since the clash.

## 'Don't write against us if you want to stay'

#### BCL activists 'force' student to leave DU hall over FB post on fuel price hike

A group of BCL activists based in Dhaka University's Haji Mohammad Mohsin Hall allegedly made a resident student of the hall leave the dormitory as the latter made a Facebook post

about the recent fuel price hike. Kazi Sakib Miah, a senior-year student of philosophy, alleged that on August 6, he made a satiric post on a Facebook group and his profile about the recent fuel price hike.

After a while, he was called back to his hall over the phone from the central library by Abu Hasan Roni, a student of world religion and culture. When Sakib returned, Hasan and Mohiur

Rahman Shanto, both students of Persian language and literature, asked him about the post and told him

to delete it from the group he posted it on. "We will not be reprimanded by the [BCL hall unit] president and seniors for the things you write. If you want to stay here, don't write against our agenda," Shanto told him, alleged Sakib.

On the night of August 15. some BCL leaders, including Shanto and Hasan, called him again and told him to leave the hall within a month. He left the hall on August 18.

However, Sakib did not remove the post from his personal profile.

Shanto and Hasan later asked him to choose between two options -- stop writing against BCL and shift from room 112 to room 1022 of the tinshed building with juniors or leave the hall. However, Sakib did neither. On the night of

August 15, some BCL leaders, including Shanto and Hasan, called him again and told him to leave the hall within a month. He left the hall on August 18. Asked whether he

informed the hall authorities of the matter, Sakib said he did not as he noticed the authorities hardly

The workers of a garment factory blocked a road in Hemayetpur area of Savar demanding their salaries yesterday.Nearly a thousand workers of Raquef Apparels Washing and Packaging Industries Ltd blocked Hemayetpur-Singair road at Tetuljhora area around 3:30pm, said Dhaka Industrial Police-1 assistant sub-inspector Korban Ali.

He said the workers were supposed to get their salary for the month of June at 2:00pm, but they were not paid."Agitating workers have blocked the road. We are trying to convince the workers to leave," he added.
