#### JOURNEY FROM

2002 - 2022

Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF) is celebrating 20 years of its journey and is committed to standing beside the most marginalised communities in Bangladesh.

MJF, a non-government organisation, promotes Human Rights and Good Governance. It has partnered with more than 400 CSOs and NGOs in the past 20 years reaching 3 Million (30 lac) marginalised people in Bangladesh.

With funding from UKaid, Manusher Jonno Foundation started operating as Manusher Jonno "For People" from 2002 and registered itself as an independent organisation in 2006 with the mandate of providing funding and capacity-building support to CSOs and NGOs working on Human Rights and Good Governance.

## PARTNERSHIP

With the Development Partners

2002 HUGO (Human Rights and Governance Programme) Project: MJF partnered with 50 NGOs and CSOs to work on Prevention of Violence against Women and Girls, Rights of Workers and Rights of Marginalised groups.

2007 Rights Governance Challenge Fund (RGCF): MJF expanded its network and partners from 50 to 100 between 2007 and 2013. The Norwegian Embassy and AusAID both extended their financial assistance. Since 2009, MJF has been supporting marginalised community movements.

2013 Creating Opportunity for Poor and Excluded (COPE): In 2013, MJF embarked upon COPE, a new program funded by UKaid and AusAid that focused on land and property rights, prevention and protection of violence against women and child marriage, the withdrawal of children from hazardous work, decent working conditions for readymade garments and migrant and female agriculture workers.

2016 The project Strengthening civil society and public institutions to address gender-based violence and to build community resilience to climate change was launched with financial support from the Embassy of Sweden to strengthen civil society and public institutions' capacity to combat violence against women and build greater resilience of vulnerable communities to climate change.

2017 Excluded People's Rights in Bangladesh (EPR): MJF launched a five-year initiative with the assistance of UKaid through (now Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office-FCDO) to improve the quality of life of poor, marginalised and vulnerable people in an environment of democratic freedom and security, with a focus on combating marginalisation and discrimination, securing the rights of women and girls, promoting decent and safe work, protecting working children and uplifting youth and social cohesion.

2019 Global Affairs Canada (GAC) supported the Women's Voice and Leadership (WVL) project for five years to strengthen women's rights organisations (WROs) and empower women, girls and transgender to advance gender equality.



CAMPAIGN **Equality through Dignity** 

MJF launched a campaign, 'Equality through Dignity,' in 2012 to improve the status of women in the public and private domains by recognising their contributions and thereby reducing discrimination and violence against them. It is lobbying with the government for statutory recognition of women's domestic and care work to achieve SDG-5, gender equality

#### MJF is Lobbying for

- Gender budgeting and satellite accounting system
- Creating opportunities for women to join the labour market
- Reducing women's work burden at home
- Building stronger coordination among different ministries to address the care economy sector.

# Journey of a Campaign for Gender Equality Equality .... E

#### **Outcomes**

- Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS) in their "Time Use Survey", June 20, 2022 mentioned that women spend eightfold more time than men in domestic and care work. According to the survey, men spend around 1.6 hours in a day in domestic and care work while women do that for 11.7 hours, which is nearly half of the day. These works also do not meet the criteria of being productive, so these remain unpaid and unrecognised, the report said.
- The government is now analysing the Ministerial Budgets through Gender Lens. MJF collaborates and works together on these initiatives.
- Forty three (43) ministries have introduced Gender Responsive Budgets (GBR)
