The Daily Star talked to some of his closest colleagues in the entertainment industry.

He is irreplaceable: Khurshid Alam

We have known each other since 1970. That year, I voiced a song written by him for the film “Shadharon Meye”. The ER Khan directorial

film featured Zafar Iqbal. Our collaboration “Chhobi Jeno Shudhu Chhobi Noy” was one of our most successful collaborations. It was for the film “Moner Manush”. Later we had numerous collaborations, including “Dhire Dhire Ghora Chole”, “Mago Ma Ogo Ma”, which became iconic. Although it was from the film “Shomadhi”, due to the popularity of the song, the producers started to call the films’ name by the song’s title.

Aside from film tracks, he was incomparable in the field of patriotic songs as well. Few people have been able to write them in such simple and beautiful way.

He was so talented that he could literally write a song in five minutes. He is irreplaceable. It is our pride that we had an artiste like him.

His father wanted him to be a doctor, but thankfully, he pursued his passion. Though this made his father upset, his talent was evident and it ultimately made him proud.

We met on August at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy -- I could never imagine it was out last meet.

He was my travel partner: Rafiqul Alam

I have lost a friend with whom I could talk about art and culture. We had so many memories together. He was my travel partner. We travelled to Cox's Bazar, Chattogram, and even went for hunting. What breaks my heart is I cannot ever call ‘Gazi Bhai’ again. We shared a bond of 50 years, which death took away. His works will keep him alive.

I was amazed by his wit and humour, which he could successfully bring into his writings. From film to patriotic music, he was equally mastered in everything he did.

For the last six decades, there were few songwriters like him.

For the past one decade, many senior artistes have left us, who were our guardians. He was an institution. We have many songwriters in our time, but he was one of a kind. His works have enhanced the level of Bangladeshi music and played a great role for the prosperity of a generation who have listened to his songs. His works were extremely versatile, from love songs, to patriotic songs and tracks for films, he was dominant in every genre.

I was lucky to be featured in two of his directorial films. One was “Shorto”, and another “Shondhi”.

He will remain one of the best people in my life. He was extremely hardworking and dedicated. I felt extremely honoured that he respected me a lot as an artiste. We resided nearby, and now that he is no more, the fact that we cannot visit him anymore will always break my heart.
