

Russia revokes licence of Novaya Gazeta

Blacklists two Hollywood actors

A Russian court yesterday stripped investigative newspaper Novaya Gazeta, whose chief editor last year was co-awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, of its print licence, in the latest blow to the country's independent media.

Another court in Moscow jailed respected former defence reporter Ivan Safronov for 22 years on treason charges for divulging state secrets. The judge said Safronov will serve the time in a "strict regime penal colony."

Russian independent media have in recent years faced unprecedented pressure, with authorities further tightening the screws since the start of Moscow's February offensive in Ukraine.

Novaya Gazeta said in a statement that the decision "killed" the paper.

Russia yesterday blacklisted 25 US citizens including Hollywood actors Ben Stiller and Sean Penn, in response to sanctions from the United States.

The Russian foreign ministry said in a statement the new names were added in response to the "ever-expanding" US sanctions "against Russian citizens".

STRONG EARTHQUAKE

30 people killed in southwest China

At least 30 people were killed when a strong earthquake struck southwestern China yesterday, state media reported, as violent tremors in a remote region damaged homes and left some areas without electricity.

The magnitude 6.6 quake hit about 43 kilometres southeast of the city of Kangding in Sichuan province at a depth of 10 kilometres, according to US Geological Survey.

The death toll now stands at "more than 30 dead", according to CCTV. Tremors shook buildings in the provincial capital of Chengdu -- where millions are confined to their homes under a strict Covid lockdown -- and in the nearby megalopolis of Chongqing, local residents told AFP.

"Some of my neighbours on the ground floor said they felt it very noticeably," said Chen, a resident of Chengdu. "But because Chengdu is currently under epidemic management, people aren't allowed to leave compounds, so many of them rushed out into their courtyards," she added.

Pak flooding death toll tops 1,300

Engineers breach lake to avert danger

Engineers breached Pakistan's biggest freshwater lake to drain water threatening nearby towns, officials said yesterday, as heavy rain poured misery on millions affected by the country's worst floods in history.

Nearly a third of Pakistan is under water -- an area the size of the United Kingdom -- following months of record monsoon rains that have killed more than 1,300 people and washed away homes, businesses, roads and bridges.

Officials say the repair bill will top \$10 billion for a country already in the grip of economic crisis, with hundreds of thousands homeless as the monsoon draws to an end and winter approaches.

"There is nowhere to shower or go to the bathroom," said Zebunnisa Bibi, sheltering near Fazilpur, in Punjab province, where 65 tents are now home to more than 500 people who fled their inundated villages for higher land. Similar tent camps have mushroomed across much of the south and west of Pakistan.

'Buck up' in enforcing Myanmar peace plan

Malaysia urges Asean; junta chief makes another visit to Russia

Malaysia's Foreign Minister Saifuddin Abdullah yesterday called on the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (Asean) to act more urgently in its efforts to provide humanitarian assistance and spur a peace process in junta-ruled Myanmar.

The 10-nation bloc has been pushing Myanmar's military rulers to follow a peace "consensus" they agreed to last year, with some member countries expressing disappointment over a lack of progress on the plan.

Myanmar has been trapped in a cycle of violence since the military overthrew an elected government last year and launched a bloody crackdown on protests and dissent.

Saifuddin said he had written to the Asean Secretary-General on Saturday to ask for updates on the situation in Myanmar, as he had yet to receive any reports from the bloc's leadership since the grouping met in Cambodia last month.

"The Asean Secretariat must have a sense of urgency to look into what is actually happening in Myanmar," he told reporters in Kuala Lumpur, adding that the bloc could not afford to wait until its next major summit in November. "They (the Asean secretariat) must have a full-time team working on the conflict, otherwise people get killed in between all of our meetings... We must buck up."

The Asean Secretariat in Jakarta did not immediately respond to an emailed request for comment.

Meanwhile, Myanmar's junta leader was on a visit to Russia yesterday, his second trip there in less than two months, as ruling military tries to shore up one of its few diplomatic alliances as it comes under growing international pressure.

Senior General Min Aung Hlaing has been barred from representing Myanmar at most international gatherings since leading a coup early last year against an elected government led by Noble laureate Aung San Suu Kyi.

China accuses US of 'tens of thousands' of cyberattacks

Beijing yesterday accused the United States of launching "tens of thousands" of cyberattacks on China and pilfering troves of sensitive data, including from a public research university.

Washington has accused Beijing of cyberattacks against US businesses and government agencies, one of the issues over which ties between the two powers have nosedived in recent years.

China has consistently denied the claims and in turn lashed out against alleged US cyber espionage, but has rarely made public disclosures of specific attacks.

But a report released yesterday by its National Computer Virus Emergency Response Center (CVERC) accused the US National Security Agency (NSA) of carrying out "tens of thousands of malicious attacks on network targets

in China in recent years".

It specifically accused the NSA's Office of Tailored Access Operations (TAO) of infiltrating the Northwest Polytechnical University in the city of Xi'an.

The university is funded by China's Ministry of Industry and Information Technology, and specialises in aeronautical and space research.

CVERC alleged that TAO infiltrated the university's networks and took "control of tens of thousands of network devices" including servers, routers and network switches.

Using dozens of cyber weapons and exploiting previously unknown flaws in the SunOS operating system, the unit gained access to "core technical data" including passwords and

the operations of key network devices, the report said.

TAO has "stolen over 140 gigabytes of high-value data" in recent years and received assistance from groups in Europe and South Asia, CVERC said in the report, which was co-authored by the private Chinese cybersecurity firm Qihoo 360.

The foreign ministry in Beijing yesterday condemned the alleged hack.

"We ask the US to provide an explanation and urge them to stop immediately this illegal move," Mao Ning, a spokeswoman for the foreign ministry, said at a regular press conference.

The NSA did not immediately respond to an AFP request for comment.
