Sust student on solo protest against unkept promises

Almost seven months have passed since the students of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (Sust) suspended their movement for the removal of the vice chancellor and other demands.

However, the promises made to them by the authorities remain unfulfilled.

When all hopes turned grim, one student stood against the unfulfilled promises.

Kundu, Sazal an anthropology major at Sust, was critically injured in the police brutality that took place on the campus on January 16, during the movement. He survived with 80 splinters of shotgun bullets in his body.

Since September 4, Sajal has been standing in front of the university's central library from noon to the afternoon daily, with placards mentioning his three-point demand, including the withdrawal of cases filed against current and former students, fulfilment of promises made to the students, and charge of the cafeteria that was "unfairly" taken from him.

"I was managing the cafeteria of the IICT building before the protest. After the campus reopened and I returned from the hospital, the cafeteria was taken back from me. This was the last resort to support my family as the only earning member," said

Students suffer for unfinished roadwork

Due to absolute negligence, construction of only a 400-metre drain pipe has not been completed in over three months in Mymensingh. The construction is going in an area where educational institutions are located, with over 3,000 enrolled students, many of whom are to sit for the upcoming SSC exams.

(Male), Government Laboratory High School and preprimary school "Shishu Kanon" are within this area.

Not only that, Higher Secondary Teachers Training Institute (HSTTI) is also located in this area where teachers from different institutions in Mymensingh get their training throughout the year. Besides, several other government offices are located there.

Faridpur Jannat Construction, the company assigned for the job, started the construction, which is a part of a development project, in May this year.

"Even though the examination was rescheduled to be on September Three educational institutions 15, only a fragment of the work Mymensingh Teachers Training has been completed so far," said Anjuman Ara Begum, headmaster of Govt Laboratory High School.

"Construction materials have been kept scattered, and holes have been dug up."

"We've tried contacting MCC Mayor Ekramul Haque Titu and MCC's assigned engineers, but no one bothered to respond. Meanwhile, the work's progressing at a snail's pace," alleged the headmaster.

Visiting the site recently, this Govt Laboratory High School has correspondent saw a few workers

been selected as an examination levelling sand and cutting the pipes to set them up there.

Locals alleged that due to price hike of construction materials, the firm is delaying its work.

"Our children are the greatest sufferers, as taking them to school on time and then bringing them back home has become a tumultuous task," said Arati Rani, a guardian.

Mohammad Azaharul Haque, MCC's assistant engineer, said they put regular pressure on the construction firm engineers so that the SSC examinees don't face any

Denying allegations of slow progress of work due to price hike of materials, Md Shafiqul Islam, the project's engineer, said they had to halt work due to the recent rains.

"We've already talked to MCC authorities to complete the road by filling sand by September 10 to ease movement. Hopefully, the rest of the work will be completed on an urgent basis," he added

Awami League, BNP face to face on the streets

Both BNP and Awami League are trying to take control over the thoroughfares in Chattogram city ahead of the next parliamentary elections.

"The government and ruling party are in fear as they have noticed that common people are participating in our programmes," he said.

BNP Chattogram south district unit convener Abu Sufian echoed him.

"Police and AL men are provoking us into clashes so that they can sue us. But we will not fall into the
