

A new Assassin's Creed game is set in Baghdad

Ubisoft has unveiled the Assassin's Creed Mirage, a new action-adventure game in the series, set in 9th-Century Baghdad, Iraq.

Assassin's Creed Mirage, which was unveiled as a component of Ubisoft Forward's Assassin's Creed Showcase, places you in the role of Basim Ibn Ishaq and takes place in Baghdad twenty years before the events of Assassin's Creed Valhalla.

A CGI cinematic trailer highlighted Basim's transformation from a common street thief to a skilled assassin. He does so under the instruction of Persian assassin Roshan. Players can anticipate that the two's story will feature a number of historical figures, including political leaders, according to Ubisoft.

Google will launch the new Pixel 7 phone on October 6



On October 6 at 10 am ET (about 8 pm Bangladesh time), Google will hold its fall hardware event. The company previewed both the Pixel Watch and the upcoming Pixel 7 phones at its I/O event earlier this year, announcing that they would be available in the fall. Both devices will be unveiled at the event. Google also claims it will make new additions to the Nest line of smart home products public during the event.

Since Google's most recent event, rumoured leaks have allegedly revealed even more information about the gadgets, with both the Watch and phones allegedly making their way into people's hands. With the Pixel 7's product page stating that it will be powered by a cuttingedge chip known as the Tensor G2, the company is now disclosing a little more information about the

Walton launches **Primo**

Local mobile manufacturer Walton has recently launched its newest smartphone called Primo HM7.

Walton Primo HM7 comes with a 6.528inch HD plus IPS in cell punch-hole display, 1.8 GHz 12 nm Unisoc Tiger T610 SoC octa-core processor, Mali-G52 graphics card, 3 GB LPDDR4x RAM and 32 GB storage, which can be expanded up to 128 GB with micro SD card.

As for the camera, the phone features a triple rear camera setup with a 13 MP main, 2 MP depth sensor and 2 MP macro sensor, alongside an 8 MP front camera. The phone runs on Android 11 OS and sports a 4,900 mAh li-polymer battery

Some other features of the Walton Primo HM7 include dual 4G VoLTE SIM support, Type-C port, 10-finger multi-touch, face unlock, multi-functional fingerprint sensor and many others.

Walton Primo HM7 is

available in two colours: crystal blue and azure

It is priced at Tk. 10,499/-, and can be bought from any Walton Plaza, mobile brand and retail outlets in Bangladesh, as well as from the e-commerce platform Walcart.com.

According to Walton, customers can avail 30-day instant replacement for the phone along with a 1-year regular warranty.
